PREFACE

The National Archives of India has a rich collection of cartographic records in its custody. In order to facilitate consultation of such records this Department brought out in 1975 Catalogue of the Historical Maps of the Survey of India, 1700-1200. The present volume is second in the series and has been appropriately designated as Catalogue of MRIO - Miscellaneous Maps of the Survey of India, 1742-1872. This catalogue would supplement the earlier publication.

The pattern of the present catalogue has been changed from that of the earlier volume with a view to obviate time-consuming process in locating the requisite maps. All the entries, including cross-references, in the present catalogue contain detailed information and have been arranged alphabetically. Efforts have also been made to include short biographical sketches of as many of the surveyors whose maps have been included in this volume as possible. This part of the catalogue would therefore be useful to those who are interested in the general progress of the cartographic activities in India during the period.

The catalogue unfolds, perhaps for the first time in India, details of the cartographic innovations on the maps. This information would be of interest to the serious students of historical cartography.

Before I conclude I should like to express my gratitude to the Survey of India for going through the mamuscript of the Biographical Sketches and suggesting additions which have been incorporated in this volume. I am particularly thankful to them for allowing us to make use of information in the first four volumes of the late Col. R.H. Phillimore, Eistorical Records of the Survey of India, for compiling the short biographical sketches in Part II of the Catalogue. I should like to take this opportunity to record my appreciation of the labour put in by Shri P.L. Madan, Archivist and an eminent Cartographer, under whose able supervision this volume has been compiled during a short period of one and a half years. He has been assisted by Shri Zile Singh, Assistant Archivist in the collection of data and by Shri S. Balasundaram, Transcriber, in getting the typescript ready.

INTRODUCTION

Indian Cartography owes much to the early efforts of navigators, travellers and missionaries who paved the way for the route surveyors. These surveyors were mostly attached to the British armies which had to march from one corner of India to another, from the extreme south to the foot of the Himalayas, from the unpenetrable forests of Assam and Burma in the East to the rugged mountains on the West almost inside Afghanistan. They had to ford innumerable rivers that criss-cross the country, before they could establish their firm hold over India.

The route surveyors were the real pioneers of Indian cartography. Detailed geographical information about India started unfolding itself and was brought to light during the early years of the eighteenth century by the untiring efforts of these route surveyors. Their maps, though not accurate from the modern standards of cartography, served the purpose and served it well.

in India was taken in 1761 with Plaisted's surveys of the coasts of Chittagong, followed by Cameron's survey of the Twenty-four Parganas. James Rennell surveyed the Ganges during 1764. He was appointed as the first Surveyor General of Bengal in 1767 and William Lambton, who laid the foundation of the Great Trigonometrical Survey of India, was not only a geographer of repute but was a great geodesist as well and can aptly be called the Father of Indian Cartography.

The history of Indian cartography which is almost three hundred years old now, has passed through a very interesting and romantic period in its early years and upto the middle of the nineteenth century. Till then, it had been noticed that untrammelled skill and artistic perception and qualities of the surveyor at that time were far more effectively reflected in the maps prepared by him through the symbols and writings of his own design and creation than is ever possible from a standardized table of conventional signs on the modern monotonous maps. The meaning of his symbols almost leaps to the eye and the beholder is charmed by the picturesque beauty and design of these symbols. This was the age when maps had to be copied by hand and each copy guarded jealously.

The Map Records and Issue Office - Miscellaneous Maps 1742-1872 of the Survey of India, together with the Historical Maps, 1700-1900, also of the Survey of India the catalogue of which was published earlier by the National Archives of India in 1975, reflect faithfully the cartographic history in its various aspects. The MRIO - Miscellaneous maps though designated differently from the Historical Maps, are practically the same in origin and contents. These maps once belonged to some other record groups of the Survey of India and seemingly were part of one homogenous archival group or other of which enough proof is available on most of the maps themselves. Unfortunately, they now form part of a collection brought together from different sources in the Survey of India and made into an artificial heterogenous collection under the nomenclature of MRIO - Miscellaneous Maps and transferred to the National Archives of India during March 1055.

Apart from the 'record-character' of these maps in which archivists are particularly interested, these maps enable the students of Indian history to understand one aspect or another of Indian history as such. These cartographic records, however, would be more useful to the scholars of historical cartography not only in India but also outside the country. They illustrate, quite in detail, the various trends and the diffusion of cartographic innovations that developed through the ages. They are unique in extent as well as in contents and are no less inferior to the collections of the more advanced countries of the world which claim very rich cartographic traditions and history. We must preserve this priceless cultural heritage. It is the purpose of this publication to unfold the precious collection of cartographic records before the enlightened public in the shape of this catalogue.

This map-record group contains maps of such pioneers as James Rennell, William Lambton, Colebrooke, Mackenzie and others, for whose contributions the students of historical cartography in India in particular are grateful. The debt the Indian geography owes to these geographers and along with them, others included in the Historical Maps like Topping, Pringle, Everest, Waugh, Thuillier etc. can hardly be adequately expressed.

A word now about the arrangement of the contents and the general layout of the catalogue is necessary. The catalogue of this MRIO - Miscellaneous maps is divided into three parts: (1) Catalogue of maps, (2) Short biographical sketches of the surveyors whose maps are included in the catalogue, and (3) Cartographic Notes on the MRIO - Miscellaneous Maps.

The arrangement given to these map-records by the Survey of India has been retained. These are arranged chronologically under group-heads of 20 years, e.g., season 1721-40, season 1741-60 etc; under each group-head, the sheets are arranged and numbered serially viz. Season 1721-40/Serial No.1, Season 1721-40/Serial No.2, or Season 1741-60/Serial No.1, Season 1741-60/Serial No.2, etc., etc.

The entries of the place-names and the surveyors in Part I of the catalogue of Maps, are arranged alphabetically. Cross-references are given to all the place-names that occur in the title in detail, just as in the main entries. The heading or the catch-word of each entry, as far as possible, is in the spelling, as in vogue these days.

The entry constitutes the exact title of the map as it appears on the map, the scale, the name of the surveyor (or surveyors), the year of survey, compilation, reduction, copying, printing or publication (though in a very few cases), as the case may be and followed by number of copies or sheets. At the end of the entry, 'Old reference' is given, e.g., 'Register No.4-0-30 or 'Register No.4-PT-30'. This reference is given on the old labels at the back of the map by the Survey of India and indicate '4' as the Serial Number of the entry in the Register maintained for the receipt of the maps in the Map Publication Office of the Survey of India in early days; '0' or 'PT' stands for 'Original' or 'Plane-table' sheets respectively followed by the year of the receipt of that map in the Map Publication Office i.e., 1730 or 1839.

The 'Old Reference' has been used while referring to the map by the late Col. R.H. Phillimore of the Survey of India in his monumental works 'Historical Records of the Survey of India' in 5 volumes. He is the only man who has ever consulted and exhaustively made use of the valuable cartographic records of the Survey of India available in this country and abroad by quoting extensively from them. These references have been included in the entries at the end for easy identification of the maps referred to by him. This part of the catalogue would be useful mostly to the students of Indian History.

Part II, includes thort biographical sketches of the surveyors whose maps are included in the catalogue. In spite of our best efforts, biographical sketches of all the surveyors could not be included. Almost all the surveyors used to be military officers, but only the major survey activities of them have been highlighted. These have also been arranged alphabetically. This information may be useful to those who are more interested in the survey activities in India in general.

Since these maps are of eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, the period when the science and art of cartography was in its creative stage in India, and the cartographic innovations were in the evolutionary phases, this collection of map is, therefore, of immense value also to students of the historical cartography, a discipline which has not been given its due place so far in India. Though this collection is very small as compared to other Survey of India collections, only about 700 sheets of maps, it contains specimen of almost every type of symbols used

and survey techniques in vogue at the time. Efforts have, therefore, been made in Part III of the Catalogue to include map-by-map evaluation of cartographic innovations used during this period. This is perhaps the first time in India that such an attempt has been made. The picturesque beauty of these maps unfolded in this part of the Catalogue would enchant the students in pursuit of the evolution of the historical cartography in India.

Part III of the Catalogue also contains the details of the Watermarks of the drawing papers used for preparing the maps. This would help in determining the period of drawing of these maps whose dates are doubtful or which bear no dates on them. The information would be useful to those interested in the history of the manufacture of paper and its use in the eightenth, nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

SKETCHES OF SURVEYORS

ANDERSON, F.C.

Born - July 26, 1827

Died - February 3, 1902.

Ensign - Bengal Infantry - December 13, 1845; Lieut. Colonel - December 13, 1871; Major General -July 1, 1886.

Anderson entered the Survey Department as Deputy Superintendent Revenue Survey on September 10, 1852, and was asked to survey Banda district from 1856 to 1876. Anderson surveyed the districts of Leiah, Musaffargah and Shahpur in Punjab and the districts of Partabgarh, Rai Bareilly, Sultanpur, Sitapur, Kheri and Gonda in Oudh. In between, he was made Boundary Commissioner for the boundary settlement between Oudh and Nepal. His two maps of this settlement are available in the Catalogue. During 1876-77, Anderson surveyed about 732 square miles of cadestral surveys of Mathura and Banda districts. From 1878-83, he had completed the survey of Mirsapur and the Tarai region before he retired in 1888.

BECHER, John Reid.

Born - July 3, 1819

Died - July 9, 1884.

2/Lieut. Bengal Engineers - December 11, 1837; Colonel - October 13, 1863; Retired - 1866.

He was with the Army of the Indus in 1840. During 1848-47, he was incharge of Trans-Sutlej Revenue Surveys.

Between 1849-50 when as Boundary Commissioner, he prepared interesting maps demarcating the boundary between Sind and Jodhpur and Sind and Marwar. These maps are included in this Catalogue. He was Deputy Commissioner of Hazara during 1853-59 and Commissioner of Feshawar in 1864.

BEDINGFIELD, Richard Gurdon.

Baptized - September 5, 1802. Died-April 4, 1829.

2/Lieut. Bengal Artillery - April 8, 1819; Ldeut. - June 13, 1820.

He joined the force when Burlton was advancing on Rangpur, capital of Assam in January 1825. He compiled a map of Chindmin river in 1826 and surveyed the route from Goalpara to Gauhati and also prepared the maps of Assam rivers. His map of the southern boundary of Darrang of 1828 is in the collection now catalogued.

BEDFORD, James.

Baptized - March 1, 1788. Died - March 31, 1871.

Ensign, Bengal Infamey - March 29, 1810.

In 1821, he conducted surveys at Moradabad. He became Assistant Revenue surveyor of Moradabad and Rohilkhand on November 27, 1821. On December 19, 1822, he was made Revenue Surveyor Incharge of Sahaswan. During Burmese was, in October 1824, he

was sent to survey Assam. He surveyed Brahmaputra and Lohit to Brahmakund and Dihang to Paisal. During 1833-43, he was Deputy Surveyor General in Charge of Revenue Surveys. His maps of Assam-Burma border of 1026 and Aligarh-Bulandshahr border of 1835 are amongst this collection.

BLAKE, Benjamia.

Born - August 6, 1788.

Died - March 12, 1838.

Ensign, Bengal Infantiy - September 17, 1806; Battalion Major - January 10, 1837.

Blake was attached during 1808-09 with Ochterlony's force as surveyor and compiled map of Metcalfe's route to Lahore. During 1809-10, he prepared maps of his route from Rewari to Saharanpur and also of the upper parts of the Doab. During 1809-11 he was busy with various routes in the Doab. From December, 1811 to March, 1812, he stayed at Calcutta and finished his maps. Before joining the Nepal war in 1814 he had taken observations to mark the position and measure the height of Dhaulagiri. On November 15, 1816, he went on leave. From February 8, 1822, he was posted as Iliver-Surveyor to survey Salt Agencies in Bhulua (Noakhali) and Chittagong. His map of Bhulua district of 1824 is amongst the collection now catalogued. On October 5, 1824 he was called again to military duty.

BLUNT, James Tillyer.

Born - 1765.

Wied - October 20, 1834.

Ensign, Bengal Ensineers - February 15, 1785; Captain - January 1, 1806; Retired - February 9, 1810.

From June 1787 he took up astronomical observations up the Ganges to Patna as an Assistant to Burrow. In 1792, he surveyed the route of the Nizam's Army from Seringapatam to Hyderabad. During 1792-93 as an Assistant to Thomas Anburey he surveyed the route from Hyderabad to Kalpi. In the following years he worked with Charles Reynolds as his assistant on surveys from Allahabad to Panipat and back to Lucknow. He measured the height of Outub Minar trigonometrically in 1794. In 1795, he surveyed the route from Chunar to Rajamundri. The map of his survey of Cuttack Town and Fort during 1803 is included in this Catalogue.

BOILEA, Alexander Henry Edmonstone.

Born - February 3, 1307.

Died - June 30, 1862.

2/Lieut, Bengal Engineers - June 17, 1824; Major General - October 11, 1869.

From October 1317 to April 1328, he surveyed the route from Allahadad to Kampur; and from October 1828, the route from Agra to Charatpur was surveyed. In 1828, he made the measurements of the Taj at the request of Hodgson and in 1833, he conducted a traverse survey across Jumna plain through Meerut and Mutaffarnagar. During 1835, he made wonderful landscape sketches of Jodhpur, Bikaner and Jasalmer some of which are incorporated in the Catalogue.

BOILEAU, John Peter.

Baptized - January 10, 1790. Died - December 1, 1818

Ensign, Bengal Infantrý - October 2, 1805; Lieut. - October 26, 1805.

On March 16, 1816, he was appointed to command escort of Resident at Kathmandu, Nepal and was also posted as Postmaster to the Residency. During 1817-18 he surveyed frontier with Nepal. His maps of the period showing the Nepal frontier with the British India and also with north Bihar are listed in the Catalogue.

BROOME, Arthur.

Born - February 7, 1810. Died - March 27, 1871.

2/Lieut Bengal Artillery December 13, 1827; Major General - March 6, 1868.

On August 21, 1838 he became Aid-de-Camp to Governor General and in 1838-39, he was with the Army of the Indus. In June 1839, he surveyed the hills north of Simla with A. Cunningham and prepared a map showing the sources of the Punjab rivers. This map is included in the collection now catalogued. He drew in 1840 a plan of Roree, Sukkur and Bukkur.

CHEAPE, John.

Born - October 5, 1792.

Died - March 30, 1875.

Ensign. Bengal Engineers - November 3, 1809; General - December 6, 1866.

On August 13, 1814 Cheape was appointed to survey Chittagong. His panoramic view of Chittagong hills drawn in 1819 finds a place in the Catalogue. On February 27, 1823 he was made Assistant Surveyor General. In October 1823, he was asked to continue the survey of Chittagong-Arakan border and his map of the period is available in the Catalogue. After sometime, being posted with the army to Rangoon, he resumed his survey work and was again appointed Assistant Surveyor General on September 22, 1825. On September 30, 1825 he was asked to survey the new Jagannath road. During 1829, he surveyed routes from Hooghly to Burdwan and Midnapore to Bishenpur.

COLEBROOKE, James.

Born - 1772/73.

Died - January 18, 1816.

Lieut. Madras Infantry - April 1, 1793; Captain - May 7, 1800; Lieut. Colonel - 1814/15.

On October 8, 1799 he was appointed Captain of Guides. During 1800, he surveyed Lord Wellesley's marches in pursuit of Dhondhia on and behond north west frontiers of Mysore. This very neat and artistic map is included in this Catalogue. From January to March 1801, he surveyed route of Stevenson's column through Wynad and Kottayam. During later part of 1801, he was engaged

in minor triangulations and survey of roads with William Lambton in Mysore. In 1802, he survyed West Mysore and in 1803, he did valuable work surveying the marches of Nizam's Subsidiary Force under Lord Wellesley.

COLEBROOKE, Robert Hyde.

Born - 1762/3.

Died - September 21, 1808.

Lieut. Bengal Infantry - November 9, 1773; Lieut. Colonel - November 2, 1803.

On November 15, 1783, R.H. Colebrooke was appointed as surveyor. He surveyed the route of Pearse's detachment to Madras in 1785; worked as assistant to Surveyor General for office duties; and he was again the assistant with Kyd on his survey of Andaman and Nicobar islands during 1789-90. During 1791-92, he surveyed the marches of the army under Cornwallis in 2nd Mysore war. In 1793, during the absence of Kyd, he officiated as Surveyor General but finally succeeded him on February 7, 1794. He surveyed various channels between Ganges and Hooghly during 1794-95 and in the following year he surveyed the Ganges from Jalangi to Colgong. On August 15. 1801 he left office again to extend the survey from Colgong to Patna where he arrived on October 6, 1801 then went up to Allahabad. His map of 1802 of the country ceded by Wazir of Oudh to the Company by the treaty of Lucknow of 1801 is included in the Catalogue.

On April 14, 1807 he left Calcutta to undertake the survey of "the ceded and conquered Provinces" by way of the Sundarbans and Dacca. He took his survey up the Gogra and then up the Rapti beyond Gorakhpur, making his first observations of the Himalayan peaks. He went 60 miles above Bahramghat taking his survey. He turned up the Sarju river also for a few days surveying before returning to Oudh reaching there on September 28, 1807 and once again reached the Ganges on October 10, the same year. He went up the Ganges reaching Benares on October 23, stopping on way at Buxar and Ghazipur. He reached Kampur on November 30, and then by land route he went to Rohilkhand, moving down to Eareilly reaching there on April 17, 1808. On the 1st of August, Colebrooke set out from Bareilly by boat down the Ramganga and on the 10th he turned up the Dewch river up to Pali. His map of routes in Oudh and Rohilkhand of 1808 is available in this Catalogue.

Colebrooke had spent over 30 years in India. His last 19 years were devoted entirely to survey work. He was Surveyor General of Bengal from 1794 to 1808.

COLLINS, Charles James.

Born - March 18, 1785. Died - December 6, 1804.

Lieut., Madras Infantry - July 20, 1801.

During 1803, Charles James Collins was occupied on route surveys in Orissa including one along Mahanadi' river for about 80 miles west from Cuttack which he surveyed during October-November 1803 and is included in this Catalogue.

COWPER, William.

Born - April 12, 1774.

Died - May 27, 1825.

Ensign, Bombay Engineers - April 1, 1793; Brevet Lieut Colonel - June 4, 1814; Retired - December 16, 1818.

Worked as assistant to John Johnson and surveyed the coast and interior of Malabar in 1.92. During 1804-05, he surveyed the route of the Division of the Bombay Army under the command of General Johns. This map is included in the Catalogue. He was with Pocha Subsidiary Force in 1812 and surveyed its routes.

CUNNINGHAM, Alexander.

Born - January 23, 1814.

Died - November 28, 1893

2/Lieut Bengal Engineers - June 9, 1831; Colonel - June 16, 1860:

In 1835, he compiled a map of the country between Mughalsarai and Mirzapur. During his travels with Lieut. A. Broome to the sources of the Punjab rivers, a beautiful map of the region was prepared by him in 1835; in 1846, a plan of the Fortrand of Gwalior was also made by him; again, during the same year, he prepared a map showing the boundaries of Kashmir and British India. All these maps are mentioned in the Catalogue. He was appointed as Joint Roundary Commissioner of Tibet frontier during 1846-47 when he made several sketches from Ladakh to Spiti.

He was a prolific writer. His journal of a trip through Kulu and Lahoul to Ladakh was published at Simla in 1847; Ladak, Physical, Statistical, and Historical was published at London in 1854 and his Ehilsa Topes or Bhuddist Monuments of Central-India, at London also in 1854.

He was a keen archaeologist and numismatist. His well known "Ancient Geography of India" was published in London in 1871. He was Archaeological Surveyor to the Government of India from 1861-65 and Director of Archaeological Survey during 1870-85.

DAVEY, N.T.

Born - December 18, 1823. Died - March 4, 1873.

Davey was appointed as Assistant Revenue Surveyor on February 7, 1841 in the Surveyor General's Office at Calcutta. During 1841-1857, he was attached with the Revenue surveys of Midnapore and Lower Provinces. During this period, in February-March 1850, he surveyed the territory claimed by the Raja of Hill Tipperah. This map is available in this Catalogue. From 1857, he became Revenue surveyor incharge of several revenue survey parties. One of his surveys of Dacca of July 1859 finds a mention in the Catalogue.

DE PREE, G.C.

Born - August 2, 1832,

Died - February 18, 1887.

2/Lieut. Bengal Artillery - 1850.

He surveyed Tonghu pars between Arakan and Burma in 1351 before he joined the Survey Department on October 20. 1854. In this year he was ordered to survey Canjam and Cuttack Tributary Mahals. In 1856, De Pree took charge of rewly organised North-East Division Central Provinces Survey which was concluded in 1873-77. One of the plan of a fort in the region prepared along with Saxton in 1860-67 is included in the Catalogue. It included the region extending from Bay of Bengal at Balasore to near Jabalpur, nearly 25,000 square miles area, comprising Chota Nagour Division and the Rewah State and Bilaspur district including the high plateau from which rises the Narbada river near Amarkantak, the Mahanadi and the Son rivers (1872), the Amarkantak plateau (1873); Rewah State (1874); the western portion of Mandla and the northern part of the Bilaspur district in the Central Provinces. From 1883 to 1834 he officiated as Surveyor General and was confirmed in 1884. He died on February 18, 1887.

DURAND, Henry Marion.

Born - November 6, 1812. Died - January 1, 1871.

2nd Lieut. Bengal Engineers - June 12, 1828; Major General - March 1, 1867.

H.M.Durand conducted surveys and submitted reports on the drainage of swamps near Delhi in 1833. By the end

of this year he also surveyed the routes through Sind, Bolan Pass, Quetta, Kandahar and Ghazní His plans of Ali Masjid and Ghazní of 1839 are included in this Catalogue.

FISHER, Thomas

Born - March 25, 1798.

Died - July 24, 1847.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - March 13, 1818; Major - February 19, 1847.

Thomas Fisher was first appointed to revenue survey of Sylhet on August 1, 1822. He was appointed Deputy Assistant Quarter Master General for surveys and general duties on February 22, 1823. In September 1828, he surveyed routes along the rivers to Mymensingh and back over the hills to Bansicoorah settling the boundaries with the Kosiahs.

FRANCKLIN, William,

Born - 1763.

Died - April 12, 1839.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - January 31, 1783; Lieut. Colonel - December 16, 1814; Retired - December 1825.

In June 1802, he compiled a sketch of Hariana from material supplied by George Thomas. During November 1814 to March 1815, he surveyed Chandan river from its source near Deoghar to its junction with Ganges at Bhagalpur. To illustrate his marches during 1813-20 he compiled a map of Junglet erry district. This map is listed in the Catalogue.

GARDEN, William.

Baptized - March 8, 1790. Died - July 29, 1852.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - November 29, 1813; Brevet Colonel - August 2, 1850.

On October 14, 1814 he surveyed Chittagong as an Assistant Surveyor. On January 28, 1815 he was withdrawn from active military duty. On August 31, 1817, he was deputed to survey the frontier between Nepal and Champaran and during 1818-19, he surveyed the routes in Rohilkhand. During 1823, as Assistant Quarter Master General of Malwa Force, he surveyed routes to Saugor and Hoshangabad. During 1839-40, he did useful survey work in Afghanistan. His maps of Nepal boundary and routes in Afghanistan are in the collection now catalogued.

GARLING, James.

Born - May 16, 1784. Died - August 4, 1820.

Lieut. Madras Infantry - September 21, 1804; Brevet Captain - January 1, 1818.

Garling joined Madras Military Institution in April 1805. In April 1806, he became Assistant Instructor. From November 1808 to April 1809, he did mapping work in Bombay. In December 1809, he started extending Lambton's triangles to Kalahasti and Tirupati, north of Madras. From November 1810 till January 1813, he was engaged in the survey of Goa, and then took up the survey of Sonda or North Canara completing it by September 1815. From 1816 till his death on August 4, 1820 he was surveying the Nizam's dominions. These maps are included amongst the collection now catalogued.

GERARD, Alexander.

Born - February 17, 1792. Died - December 15, 1839

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - September 9, 1808; Captain - May 13, 1825; Retired - February 15, 1836.

During January-February 1812, he surveyed the route of Ochterlony to Lahore and back; during October-November route from Ludhiana to Bareilly was also surveyed. On October 21, 1814, he was appointed to the Revenue Survey in Saharanpur under Board of Commanders which had already commenced on January 12, 1814. He was withdrawn for military duty but in February 1819, he was again deputed to survey Saharanpur, Moradabad and Dehra Dun. By the end of 1819, he had to leave his surveys. The account of his Himalayan journeys, with a map, was published in 1841 by George Lloyd under the title - An Account of Koonawur in the Himalaya. In 1822, he again resumed his survey work but now surveyed Malwa and Rajputana. From November 21, 1822 to January 27, 1823, he took astronomical observations near the Taj and continued his survey through Gwalior and Sironj to Bhopal. He surveyed a route from Herat to Peshawar in 1833.

HERBERT, James Dowling.

Born - August 1791.

Died - September 25, 1833

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - March 18, 1808; Captain - June 3, 1824.

He surveyed the route of his detachment in the north of Gorakhpur in May 1814. During 1818-19, he along with Captain J.A. Hodgson, prepared a map of the territory between the Sutlej and the Ganges when they surveyed

Garhwal and Simla hills. This map also finds a place in this Catalogue. During this period, he explored the upper feeders of the Ganges above Gangotri and north of Himalayan range. In 1819 he also surreyed hills north of Landour. He took charge of the Surveyor General's Office on December 19, 1821. On Hodgson's departure, he became Acting Surveyor General but on Walpole's appointment on September 14, 1829, he became Deputy Surveyor General of Bengal and Superintendent of Revenue surveys.

HILL, Thomas,

Born - March 1786.

Died - March 20, 1846.

Hill became apprentice in the Surveyor General's Office, Madras in 1803. In 1813, he compiled a map of Tinnevelly district. This map is available in this Catalogue. He was posted to Hyderabad survey, as an assistant surveyor, in 1816 where he worked till 1819. After the death of Carling, he took temporary charge of the survey till 1821. From then on, he continuously worked on Hyderabad surveys and mapping of the area till November 1825 when the work was stopped and the party moved to Calcutta. There the remaining mapping work was carried out. The survey work of Hyderabad was resumed in May 1827 and the party surveyed and mapped till 1830. On February 9, 1830, Hill retired.

HODGES, Alexander.

Baptized - August 24, 1800. Died - September 6, 1841.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - March 4, 1820; Captain - October 12, 1834.

From 1827 to 1828, he was engaged in the Saharanpur Revenue Survey. During 1828-35, he was Revenue Surveyor of Sundarbans. In 1829, he made a new and Improved Map of Sundarbans. During 1831-34, he surveyed Noakhali district and islands of Meghna river including Sandwip. In 1836, a sketch plan of Baumney with the road and coast to Noakhali was prepared by him and this map is included in the Catalogue.

HODGSON, John Antony.

Born - July 2, 1777.

Died + March. 28, 1848.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - January 19, 1800; Major General - November 3, 1841; Surveyor General of India - 1821-23; 1826-29.

Arrived in India in March 1800. From 1803-05, he did survey work in Ceylon. From 1805-06 he took part in Maratha War. During 1809-10, with Ochterlony's force, he surveyed routes from Ludhiana to Hansi and Hissar. In 1813, he was asked to survey Upper Doab as an assistant to F.S. White. In October 1813, he took charge of the survey and carried it upto the region beyond Saharanpur. In April 1814, he climbed, Ehadraj, 9 miles west of Mussoorie and took observation of the snowy Himalayan peaks. In September 1814, he was back in Calcutta. In October 1815, he was appointed to

survey the north-west mountain provinces and the sources of the rivers which lasted till August 19, 1818 when he resigned the survey job because of ill-health. A map of this region by him is available in this Catalogue. Hodgson succeeded Mackenzie on his death on May 8. 1821 as Surveyor General of India for a short period till October 1823 when Blacker took over. During this brief period he started the revenue surveys of the Upper Provinces. He then became Revenue Surveyor General and moved to Fatchgarh. Once again Hodgson became Surveyor General of India on the death of Blacker on March 4, 1826. A map of this period of Jumna between Allahabad and Agra is also listed in the Catalogue. His health now failed again and he went to England on leave on January 24, 1829. On December 15. 1833, he returned back to India but was posted on military duty till his death at Ambala on March 28, 1848.

JACKSON, Jamès Nesbitt.

Born - August 16, 1788.

Died - June 8, 1832.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - April 27, 1805; Major - March 2, 1830.

During 1814-15, while attached with Ramgarh Battalion, J.N. Jackson was ordered to survey boundary between Burdwan, Hooghly and Midnapore. He took part in
Nepal War joining the army on January 6, 1815. From
January 1, 1817 he was with Quarter Master General's
Department occasionally engaged with survey work.
From January to May 1819, he surveyed route from
Midnapore to Nagpur. On March 27, 1824, he was ordered
to proceed to Burma with the expedition as Deputy Quarter
Master General. He observed the latitude of Rangoon. His
map of the kingdom of Ava including adjacent territories
is included in the Catalogue.

JACKSON, Philip.

Born - September 24, 1802. Died - 1879.

2/Lieut., Bengal Artillery - April 11, 1819; Captain - December 1, 1834; Retired - January 4, 1836.

He was appointed Executive Officer, Singapore on December 18, 1824. He was then made Surveyor of public lands on May 27, 1826. His map of Singapore of 1824 is amongst the maps now listed in the Catalogue. He also prepared a map of Ava, Cochin China and Siam in 1824.

JACOB, John.

Born - January 11, 1812. Died - December 5, 1858.

A COMPANIES

Lieut., Bombay Artillery - January 1, 1828; Colonel - March 20, 1857.

Sketch of Bukkur Fort, dated August 10, 1839 prepared by John Jacob during his expedition in Sind is amongst the collection now catalogued. He surveyed a route from Gujarat to Hyderabad and Sukkur via Nagar Parkar. From December 1841 he commanded Sind Irregular Horse and had distinguished himself in military and political services in west Sind and throughout he encouraged local surveys and maps.

JOSEPH, Charles.

Born - August 1, 1802.

Died - June 4, 1859.

He was, in 1823, appointed as draughtsman in the Surveyor General's Office, Madras. He was brought to Bengal Office and there carried out large scale surveys and prepared maps of the environs of Calcutta. In 1841, he carried out the topographical survey of the Hooghly river from Bandel to Garden Reach. In 1842, he prepared a map of the Dannish Settlement of Serampore in Bengal. This map is included in the Catalogue. He had, in 1845, compiled a map of Goalpara based on various surveys conducted by others. In the same year a road to Benaras was also surveyed by him.

LAMBTON, William.

Born - 1753.

Died - January 20, 1823.

Ensign, His Majesty's 33rd Foot - May 6, 1782; Lieut. - March 1, 1794; Captain - June 25, 1803; Major - May 19, 1808; Battalion Lieut. Colonel - June 4, 1814.

Before coming over to Indian scene, Lambton had done useful survey work in America. In August 1796, his regiment moved to the East Indies but since the expedition was called off, Lambton, along with his regiment landed at Hooghly in October 1797. In India, he first took part in the Mysore war, the siege and capture of Seringapatam fort under Col. Wellesley. It was during this period that Lambton conceived the idea put forth by him in November 1799 before the Government for 'Mathematical and Geographical Survey' that would first extend from sea to sea across the peninsula and ultimately could be extended

to the whole of the country. Government's approval came in February 1800. First Base-line was measured near Bangalore and preliminary triangulation across Mysore started. In 1802, a Base-line at St. Thomas' Mount near Madras was measured which formed the starting point of his triangulation, north and south. east and west. This was the beginning of the Great Trigonometrical Survey of India. Triangulation of the whole of the peninsula was completed by 1810 and during 1811, it was extended northwards. During 1812, Lambton himself suspended Triangulation work and was busy in computing the mass of observations already done. In the meanwhile, his able assistants carried on and extended the triangulation. By 1815, Lambton had covered the whole of the peninsula south of the river Kistna. The Maratha war forced the work to halt from 1816-18 when it was again taken up and in July 1821, he started the northward extension of his great Arc. At the end of 1822, therefore, Lambton'decided to move his headquarters from Hyderabad to Nagpur along with the whole of equipment but, on way, near Nagpur, on January 20, 1823, at Hingan Chat, he expired. Many of his maps covering the period from 1800 to 1818 are included in this Catalogue.

LEECH, Robert.

Born - December 7, 1813. Died - September 2, 1845.

2/Lieut., Bombay Engineers - December 8, 1831; Lieut. - June 28, 1833; Major (local) - August 7, 1838.

In 1836, along with Alexander Burnes, he marched up the Indus. During 1838, he surveyed Khyber Pass with Assistant James Nock. His surveys of the regions on the

north-west of India of the period 1836-38, were incorporated by John Walker in his map published in 1841. This map is in the Catalogue. In 1844 he became 1st Assistant to Assistant Governor General at Ambala and compiled a map of the region in 1845.

MACKENZIE, Colin.

Born - 1754.

Died - May 8, 1821.

Ensign, Madras Engineers - May 16, 1783; Colonel - August 12, 1819; S.G. Madras - 1810-15; S.G. of India - 1815-21.

During 1784-90, he was busy with the surveys of Dindigul, Nellore and Guntur districts. From 1790-92, he was on military duty as Chief Engineer. He surveyed Nizam's territories during 1792 to 1798. During the final assault on Seringapatam, he laid the plan of the siege batteries on May 4, 1799. He prepared maps for the settlement of the Mysore boundaries with its neighbours. He was asked to make detailed survey of the Mysore territory which he completed in 1808. From 1808 till 1810 he was appointed Barrack Master and allowed to remain at Madras to complete the geological and archaeological work along with the charge of the Ceded Districts Surveys many maps of which are available in the Catalogue. From 1810 till 1815, he was Surveyor General, Madras and forthwith, he took up the reorganisation of the Survey Department at Madras. But before it could be completed, he was ordered to proceed to Java on March 12, 1811, where he made a geographical and statistical report of Java. On July 16, 1813 he sailed back for India reaching Hooghly on August 17, 1813. He remained in

Bengal to finish his reports about Java which he submitted on February 18, 1815 and reached Madras on March 30, 1815. Here, on May 1, 1815, he was appointed as the Surveyor General of India but was allowed to stay at Madras to complete the reorganisation of the Department which he had started and where he stayed till July 17, 1817. Mackenzie reached Hooghly on July 24, 1817. Since his arrival at Calcutta, Mackenzie was not keeping good health and on May 8, 1821, he died.

MARTIN, Claud.

Born - January 4, 1735. Died - September 13, 1800.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - September 17, 1763; Major General - February 26, 1795.

During 1764-72, Martin surveyed the country south of the Ganges and east of the Hooghly towards Bakerganj including the province of Krishnagar which was surveyed in 1771. This map finds a place in the Catalogue. In 1791, he took part in the Mysore War.

MAXWELL, William.

Born - July 19, 1814. Died - January 30, 1882.

2/Lieut., Bengal Artillery - December 8, 1831; Colonel - September 30, 1865; Retired as Hony. Major General - August 1, 1872.

Maxwell was appointed as Assistant Revenue Surveyor on October 22, 1838 joining Fordyce, the Revenue Surveyor, in the survey of Agra district. Maxwell took charge of the survey party on September 25, 1839 when Fordyce

went on leave. During this period, he surveyed city and cantonment of Agra. On March 18, 1841, he was promoted as Revenue Surveyor. He surveyed Ghazipur and Benares during 1841. From December 1841 till 1843 he surveyed Patna and moved his party to Saran district at the end of 1843. During 1846, he surveyed the Hill Tippera region. This map finds a place in the Catalogue.

MONTGOMERIE, Thomas George.

Born - April 23, 1830.

Died - January 31, 1878.

Montgomerie joined the Great Trigonometrical Survey in October 1852. In 1853, he assisted A.S. Waugh, the Surveyor General in the measurement of a new Baseline at Chuck near Attock. From December 1854 to January 20, 1855 he again assisted Waugh in the measurement of another Base-line at Karachi. With the completion of these Base-lines, the trigonometrical survey of the Kashmir began in 1855. In the very first season, he carried the triangles across the Pir Panjal range into Kashmir. After continuous triangulation for ten years, Montgomerie went home on leave in 1865. On May 1, 1867, he returned back to India and resumed his work, not in Kashmir, but in Kumaun and Garhwal. For the trans-frontier explorations in the north-west into the Hindu-Kush, Valley of the Oxus and Eastern Turkistan, he used the Pathans and for the northern sector into Tibet, he sent mostly the Bhutias after training them in the art of route surveys. He taus gained very useful topographical and geographical information of the regions from 1864 till 1875, when he retired as Senior Deputy Superintendent of Great Trigonometrical Survey, due to ill-health.

MORLAND, Henry.

Born - October 4, 1803.

Died - December 23, 1868.

Ensign, Madras Infantry - February 13, 1821; Major - November 9, 1846; Hon. Lieut. Colonel - November 28, 1854.

Morland joined the Hyderabad Survey on March 7, 1828 as an assistant surveyor. He took charge of the survey the next year. He surveyed Hyderabad territory till 1848 with intermittent breaks in surveyes when he was either on leave or on military duty. His map of 1839-41 showing the northern boundary of Nadiar Circar is available in this Catalogue.

MORRIESON, William Elliot.

Born - April 5, 1791.

Died - January 6, 1815.

Ensign, Bengal Engineers - June 13, 1807; Lieut. - February 9, 1810.

From December 1809 to May 1810, he was surveyor to Martindell's detachment in Bundelkhand. On February 8, 1811, he was appointed to survey Sundarbans which he could start only on April 20, 1811. The three years he carried on with his surveys and completed a large tract of the tedious country east of the Hooghly. His work lay mostly through dense Sundar forest, teeming with world famous Bengal tigers and alligators. Many beautifully drawn maps by him are included in this Catalogue.

MULHERAN, James.

Born - April, 1817.

Died - March 25, 1869.

He was first appointed as Writer on November 27, 1832 and then as Sub-Assistant with the Great Trigonometrical Surveys on April 19, 1834. He triangulated the Great Arc during 1834-36. During 1836-42, he worked with Ranghir Meredional Series; triangulated Himalayan points during 1842-44; and was attached with Karara Meredional series during 1844-47; fixed the triangles in the north-west Himalayas during 1847-54. During his last lap of triangulation till his death in 1869, he was triangulating Hyderabad since 1855. His maps of districts Amraoti and Yeotmal of the periods 1856-57 and 1857-58 respectively, are included in the Catalogue.

PATON, John.

Born - 1803.

Died - January 8, 1842.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - June 10, 1819; Captain - July 16, 1828; Battalion Major - November 23, 1841.

On November 27, 1323, Paton was appointed as Deputy Assistant Quarter Master General, Class III. In 1825, he was transferred to Arakan. During 1827-28, he conducted a number of road surveys in the north of Delhi. He prepared plans of Cantonments of Karnal, Ludhiana and Saharampur. During this period, he prepared a map of Sirhind district. This map is available in the Catalogue. In 1828, he was promoted to D.A. Q.M.G., Class II. He took active part in Afghan Warduring 1839-42 and died in action. In 1839, he made a sketch of route from Kandahar to Girishk.

PEMBERTON, Robert Boileau.

Born - June 21. 1798.

Died - June 26, 1840.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - April 7, 1832; Lieut. - August 1, 1818; Captain - July 21, 1835.

In 1822. R.B. Pemberton was appointed Assistant Surveyor, Rohilkhand Revenue Survey under Bedford. In September 1824, he surveyed Barak river while on military service in Cachar. He also surveyed Manipur road during this period. During 1825, he completed a route survey to Manipur by perambulator, 96 miles from Banskandee. In 1828-30, he, as a member of Commission, laid down Burma-Manipur boundary. This map is in the collection now catalogued. In 1830 he visited Ava in Burma and completed a map of the 'Province of Arracan with Chittagong and Ava', which also finds place in this Catalogue. Then he took the route followed by Traut to Arakan over the Yomas to An and enroute surveyed the cantonments of Kyankpyu and Akyab. With Jenkins, he surveyed the route from Arakan through Chittagong, Cachar, Manipur, Naga Hills to Assam during 1831-32. He was also deputed to select suitable site for the capital of Arakan during this period.

PICKERSGILL, Joshua.

Born - May 11, 1781.

Died - September 8, 1818.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - July 21, 1806; Lieut. - February 1, 1807.

In January 1808, he surveyed the route from Delhi to Agra. In February 1813, because of the experience of the route survey, he was appointed to command escort to Major Bradshaw who was investigating the Nepalese encroachments on Gorakhpur frontier. He surveyed lands

under dispute towards Butwal. On January 15, 1814 he was appointed to survey the whole length of the Nepal frontier with Gorakhpur. After the absence on leave, from June 9, 1815, he resumed the survey of Nepal frontier; but the survey work was again interrupted when on January 1, 1817 he was appointed Deputy Assistant Quarter Master General to the Grand Army and took part in Maratha War. He made a sketch of Dhamoni at its siege and capture. Again he was busy with Nepal frontier and prepared very good boundary maps in 1817 and 1819 which are amongst the collection now catalogued.

RENNELL. James.

Born - December 3, 1742. Died - March 29, 1830.

Ensign, Bengal Engineers - April 9, 1764; Major - January 20, 1775; Surveyor General, Bengal - 1767-77; Resigned - April 9, 1777.

In January 1756, he joined Navy as midshipman. At the end of 1759, he volunteered for service in East Indies and joined Frigate America. Rennell surveyed the coast from Calimere Point to Tondi. This information was used by him in his Map of Hindoostan. In 1764, he surveyed the Ganges river from Jalangi to Dacca. He further carried his surveys from the Meghna to Lakhimpur. During 1765, Brahmaputra was surveyed as far as Goalpara on the borders of Assam. In 1766 he surveyed across Rangpur and back to Cooch Behar border. Because of his mastery of the subject and his excellent services in the field of surveys, Clive acknowledged his good work by appointing him as the first Surveyor General of Bengal on January 1, 1767. A complete set of his surveys of Bengal was submitted by him to the Government early in 1774. Rennell had

made a start on the compilation of his Map of Hindoostan much before the printing on Indian Atlas had started. His famous Bengal Atlas was published in 1781 and his Map of Hindoostan was published in 1783. More important than the maps were his memoires which give detailed account of their construction. Many of the maps prepared by Rennell, the father of Indian Geography, are included in this Catalogue.

RICHARDS. William.

Born - 1745.

Ensign, Bengal Engineers - December 12, 1764; Captain - April 1, 1769.

Richards joined Remell as Assistant Surveyor on December 11, 1765. From 1776 he surveyed East Bengal and Chittagong. Some of his maps of East Bengal region are included in this Catalogue. During 1768 to 1771, he surveyed the routes from Puriou along the north bank of the Ganges to Saran. In 1772 Shahabad was surveyed. He was appointed as Surveyor General but resigned in January 1761.

RITCHIE, John.

In 1767, John Marine was appointed as a Marine surveyor. His map of part of Daces and low lands of Tipperah and islands in the rough of the Ganges which he surveyed along with Renable. Martin and Richards is amongst the maps now catalogued. Until 1773, he was busy surveying the coasts and the islands including the Andaman and Nicobar islands. His work was of the highest order and in

1774, James Rennell completed a number of charts of the Bay of Bengal based on Ritchie's survyes. After being marine surveyor continuously for 19 years, he retical in 1722.

ROBINSON, D.G.

Born - March 8, 1826

Died - July 27, 1877.

2/Lieut., Bengal Engineers - June 9, 1843; Battalion Colonel - December 21, 1867.

Robinson surveyed Hazara district during 1848-49;
Jammu border in 1850-51 and Rawalpindi, Jhelum,
Shahpur, the Salt Range and Liah i.e., the whole of
Sind Sager Doab region during 1851-59. These maps
find place in the Catalogue. From 1859 to 1863, he was
busy with the topographical surveys of Central India.
In 1863 he took charge of the Great Trigonometrical
Survey from Walker for a short period during latter's
absence to Europe. Again, in April 1865, the Revenue
Survey came under his charge before he finally accepted
the Director-Generalship of the Telegraph Department in
1865.

SAXTON, C.H.

Born - January 29, 1820.

Died - January 20, 1901.

Ensign, Madras Infantry - January 11, 1838; Major - December 31, 1861; Battalion Colonel - January 11, 1869; Retired as Major General - July 1874/75.

Saxton was asked to survey along with De Pree Ganjam and Cuttack Tributary Mahals during 1852-57 and again in 1860-61. During this period Saxton prepared many beautiful plans and sketches of numerous forts in the region. Three of these have found place in this Catalogue. In 1872 he took up the survey of Bastar and Vizagapatam Agency which was completed in 1876-77. The region included the great plateau of Central India, basin of river Godaveri and Pertabpur Taluk on the right bank of the Kotri river.

SHERWILL, Walter Stanhope.

Born - August 31, 1815. Died - March 20, 1890.

Ensign - June 11, 1833; Major - April 2, 1859; Retired - December 31, 1861.

On July 27, 1838 he was appointed Assistant Revenue Surveyor in the Cawnpore survey. He resumed survey work at Jalaun on November 14, 1841 after being on leave from March 10, 1840. From June 13, 1842 to June 1843 he held charge of the Gaya Survey. From 1844 he surveyed region between Shahabad and Birbhum constructing valuable geological maps. His map of the Darjeeling is available in this collection. From 1851, he became Commissioner for readjustment of thana and local boundaries and from 1856 he was Professor of Survey at Sibpur as well. He was a very accomplished artist and had left many pen and ink sketches of the survey life.

SIMMS. Frederick Walter.

Born - December 24, 1803. Died - February 27, 1865.

He was appointed as Civil Engineer and was on Rail-way Commission with A.H.E. Boileau from 1845 to 1846. During 1847-49, he compiled the plan of Calcutta which,

along with the map by Thuillier, was reduced, engraved and published by Walker in 1858. Published copies of the revised map of 1875 are included in this Catalogue.

SYDENHAM, Thomas.

Baptized - March 3, 1780. Died - August 28, 1816.

Lieut., Madras Infantry - December 5, 1794; Captain - March 26, 1802; Resigned - May 4, 1810.

In July 1799, in command of the Guides, he collected information regarding new boundary of Mysore. He commenced the survey of that boundary between Gazalhatti and Punganuru but left it incomplete because of ill-health. On May 31, 1800, he was appointed Secretary to the Resident at Hyderabad. His map of the countries ceded by the Nizam in 1800 is amongst the collection now catalogued. Owing to continuous ill-health, he resigned and returned to England in 1802; but returned back in 1804 and became Resident first at Poona and then at Hyderabad. He once again resigned in 1810 and returned home.

TURNBULL, Thomas.

Born - February 1781.

Died - June 2, 1831.

In 1798 Turnbull was transferred from Devicottai where he was working under the Superintendent of Tank Repairs since 1797, to Dindigul which he surveyed during 1798 to 1804. He was then asked to survey Tanjore, completing it during 1805 to 1810. He was moved to Madura in 1811 completing it in 1814. During the next year 1815, he was again asked to survey Dindigul. His beautifully coloured and finished map of the region is included in this Catalogue.

WALKER, James Thomas.

Born - December 1, 1826. Died - February 16, 1896.

J.T. Walker joined the Bombay Engineer Corps on December 9. 1844. From 1849 to 1853 he was busy with military reconnaissance of the Trans-Indus region from Peshawar to Dera Islamil Khan. After the completion of the topographical survey. Walker joined the Great Trigonometrical Survey in 1854. Earlier. during 1851-52. Walker helped Waugh in the measurement of Chuch Base line near Attock. He took charge of the northern section of the Indus Series of the G.T. Survey in October 1356. During the Mutiny of 1857, he participated under General Chamberlain in the siege of Delhi. In 1858, the survey work was again resumed and the Indus Series was completed by 1860 Simultaneously counter-checking of the height of the base lines was also taken up in 1858 in Indus Valley and base lines of Karachi. Chuch and Sironi were connected. Jogi Tila section of the Meridional Series was also executed by him, and in 1862. Vizagapatam base line was also completed. This base line, by 1864, was connected with the Bombay Longitudinal Series and the coast Series of Calcutta with that of Madras. Walker then ordered the last base line in India to be measured near the old station of Lambton at Punnae in the deep south in 1869, and the work of its connection with other stations began.

From 1864 onwards, Walker was also simultaneously busy in the Pendulum measurements at various places with Russian convertible pendulums and with that used by Kartar earlier in 1818; with the experiments measuring the density of the strata of the earth's crust near and under the Himalayas and the plains; with the measurement of standards of length at each base; with working out

the practical details of the tidal registrations mostly on the western coast of India i.e., every branch of Geodesy felt the weight of his work and improvements. The whole work was completed by 1874. The multitudes of observations of various types had to be computed, put in proper form and the results reduced. The Great Trigonometrical Survey of India operations were concluded during the time of Walker. The annual reports starting from 1862-63 covered the period upto 1875-78 and the first volume of the GTS operations being the history of GTS, was published in 1870.

WAUGH, Andrew Scott.

Born - February 3, 1816. Died - February 21, 1878.

Lieut., Bengal Engineers - December 13, 1827; Colonel - February 18, 1861; Retired - March 12, 1861.

He was appointed as 2nd Assistant in the Great Trigonometrical Survey of India on July 2, 1832. He was ordered to join Rossenrode's party and on his way, he surveyed the headwaters of Son and Narmada and fixed the Coordinates of Amarkantak. Before the rainy season of 1833, he came back to Agra and raised a party for Ranghir Meridional Series of the G.T. Survey of India and started taking observations towards Hamirpur. In November 1834, he was called by Everest to assist him in fixing and measurement of a new base line near Dehra Dun. He was promoted to Astronomical Assistant on April 27, 1835. In May 1835, he rejoined Ranghir Series. His series went on through Chambal, Gwalior and closed with Everest's in the north of Strong. He took astronomical observations for Zenith distances at Kalianour during 1839-40 and Damargida

in 1840-41. In 1840, a new base line at Bidar was laid down and by early 1841, was connected with surrounding Trigonometrical stations. He had been been been been acted with the Great Arc. During 1842-48, he connected the Ranghir Series with Amua Series through Pilibhit district. From December 16, 1843 till 1861 he was made Surveyor General and the Superintendent Trigonometrical Surveys. During this period, at Calcutta, he revised many of the early maps. One of these of Hazara, revised in 1859, is found in this Catalogue.

WEBB, William Spencer.

Born - December 2, 1784. Died - February 4, 1865.

South 1887 19

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - November 20, 1801; Captain November 9, 1818.

During 1805-06 he was attached with and surveyed several routes under the Surveyor General of Bengal On Nevember 9, 1807, he was appointed to escort the Surveyor General from Kampur through Lucknow to Bareilly to survey the Northern districts of Robilkhand. On April 13, 1808, he left 'Lardwar to explore the upper region of the Ganges and reached Rotthat on the Bharte A raini, near Gangotri. From there, he went to Alakananda and Badrinath and back to Bareil'" to rejoin the Surveyor General on June 30, 1808. On July 4, 1808, he was asked to survey the Upper Provinces. From 1808 till 1811 he conducted extensive surveys on the north east of Oudh and Gorakhpur. On April 25, 1815 he was appointed to survey Kumaon which he continued till he left India in 1821. His map of Kumaon is included in this Catalogue.

WILCOX, Joshus.

Born - July 15, 1807.

Died - January 20, 1855.

Ensign, Bengal Infantry - February 21, 1824; Captain - January 24, 1845; Brevet Major - January 11, 1851; Retired - February 14, 1852; Hen. Lient. Colonel - November 29, 1854.

Boundary survey of Sirhind and Punjab was carried out by Joshua Wilcox in 1825. This map is available in the Catalogue. In the following year, he surveyed the town and country round Ludhiana.

WILLIAMS, Monier.

Bern - 1777.

Died - November 30, 1823

Lieut., Bengal Infantry - December 9, 1798; Lieut. Colonel - January 9, 1822.

During 1798-1801 Monier Williams acted as an Assistant to Moncrieff and surveyed North Malabar. From 1802-07 he was Assistant to Reynolds, Surveyor General of Bombay and his map of Kurtungotte district of 1802 is amongst the collection now catalogued. On March 2, 1807 he succeeded Reynolds as Surveyor General of Bombay. In 1807, he surveyed route from Sirur to Poena and Borghat. During 1809-10, he surveyed Gujarat and during 1816, he was engaged with the survey of Chats and the Atavisi to the east of Daman. He revised Reynold's great map of India and completed it in 1821,

WILSON, Edward.

Edward Wilson joined the Surveyor General's Office at Calcutta as draughtsman in 1832. A map compiled from Colebrook's surveys of 1808 'Routes in Oudh and Part of Rohilkhand' by Edward Wilson in 1834 finds a place in this Catalogue. He resigned in 1835.

WOOD, John,

Born - 1811.

Died - November 13, 1871.

Joined Bombay Marine; Retired - February 8, 1840.

He took up the survey of the Indus in 1835. In 1836, he accompanied Alexander Burnes in his mission to Kabul. Wood surveyed the Indus from its mouth to Attock. He was the first to reach, after Marco-Polo, the "Bami-i-Dusya" or the roof of the world and thus discovered the source of the Oxus. His map of the period upto 1838 cover the region - upper valley of the Oxus from Kunduz to its source, routes from Peshawar to Bamian, the route of the Burne's mission to Kabul then to Bokhara and Bushire. The map of the north-west frontier of India which was later compiled by John Walker and published in 1841 containing the surveys of Wood also, is listed in this Catalogue.

WOOD, Thomas

Born - June 1765

Died - January 22, 1834.

Ensign, Bengal Engineers - May 18, 1785; Colonel - June 25, 1830.

On October 9, 1792 Thomas Wood accompanied Welsh to Assam as surveyor. He took up the work of Rennell where he left it in 1765 near Goalpara. He completed the survey of the Brahmaputra upto the mouth of Dikho by April 1794. He also made circuit survey upto the Bhutan border passing through Darrang. In 1795-96, he surveyed Irrawaddy river during Symes embassy to Ava in Burma. His most important survey was from Kanpur to Hardwar through Lucknow and Pilibhit in 1799-1800, down the Ganges back to Kanpur. Three of his maps of this period are included in the Catalogue. During 1801-02, he surveyed Ganges between Kanpur and Allahabad. He became Chief Engineer at Fort William in 1830 holding the post till his death on January 22, 1834.

WROUGHTON, Robert.

Born - August 2, 1797. Died - February 14, 1850.

Lieut., Bengal Infantry - August 1, 1818; Major - July 29, 1848.

In April 1818, Robert Wroughton started the survey of Matabhanga River. In October 1821, he surveyed Gorakhpur as an Assistant Revenue Surveyor. During September 1824, he surveyed the route of the British army to Arakan in Burma. In April 1825, he took up the survey of the city of Paletwa, Capital of Arakan.

During 1826-1840, he surveyed the districts of Mathura, Agra, Aligarh, part of Farrukhabad, Mainpuri and Itawah. In 1840 he took up the revenue survey of Mirzapur. In 1842, after completing survey to the south of Singrauli, he took up survey of Sohagpur, Ramgarh and Narbada territories. During 1844-47, he was Deputy Surveyor General and Superintendent Revnue Surveys Bengal. In 1845, he compiled a map showing coal regions in Bengal.
