# What is Understanding Society?

- The UK Household Longitudinal Study: Understanding Society is a household panel study.
- Largest longitudinal study of its kind
- Multi-topic (e.g. finance, health, employment, education, family, politics)
- Enumerates the whole household, interviews 10+ years old
- 9 waves of data (+ 18 waves from BHPS)
- Various types of data (main survey data, Innovation Panel (IP), health and biomarkers, linked data)

Treat as employed and code 'Attending training course' at JBOPFY. Record details of their job with the employer who has seconded them to the training scheme.
