Deepening collaborative relationships in providing Research Data Management support

Introduction

Providing a full-scale data management service which is effective and well-used requires collaboration from a variety of partners. In Canada, the policy landscape will be changing rapidly as a new federal research funding policy is rolled out this fall. At the University of Guelph, over the past four years we have been establishing relationships within the institution and with the broader community as we develop and expand services to our researchers.

Repository development

Initial Pilot Project

\$75,000 grant - Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food (OMAF)/University of Guelph Knowledge Translation and Transfer (KTT) Funding Program

Pilot an Agri-Environmental Research Data Repository

- conducted needs assessment, data audit and environmental scan
- identified standards and best practices to be employed
- developed policies and protocols
- adopted Dataverse for data repository
- adopted DataCite for data citation and data linking
- completed processing and submission of pilot research study



Current UG data repositories

Agri-Environmental Research Data Repository

- outgrowth of our initial pilot project
- studies from School of Environmental Sciences and Department of Plant Agriculture
- 24 studies comprising 1,600 files published to date
- 1,939 total downloads

University of Guelph Research Data Repository - New

- accommodates all other disciplines
- Current deposits - College of Business and Economics and Ontario Veterinary College



Current service provided centrally at no cost to researchers

Ontario Problem Gambling Research Centre (OPGRC)

2013-2014 Research, Knowledge Translation and Exchange Award

- Non-profit organization mandated to provide knowledge translation and exchange of provincially-funded problem gambling research outputs
- **Our contribution**
 - guide development of a data repository service for OPGRC-funded research outputs.
 - move the project from a conceptual framework through to the end of the pilot stage in compliance with their obligations to the provincial government

Data Repository Platform

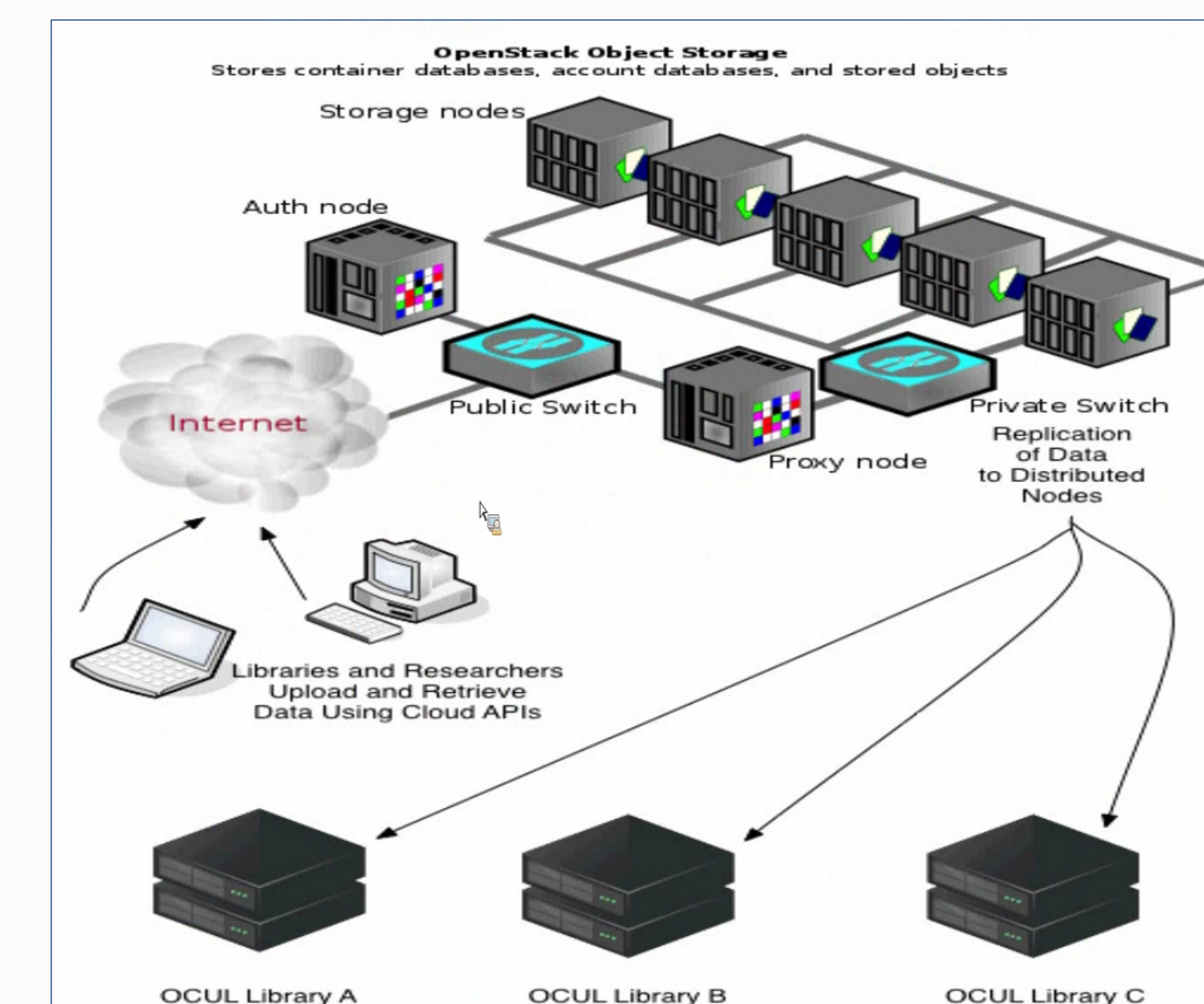
- Dataverse

- open-source application for sharing, citing, analyzing and preserving research data
- SP has a certified Trusted Digital Repository



Massive Storage for Research Data

Ontario Digital Library Research Cloud (ODLRC)

- collaboration - 10 Ontario university libraries
- high capacity distributed storage network
- initial raw storage - 4.6 PB
- data preservation and curation
- replication (minimum – 3 copies at any given time)
- plan - develop Dataverse integration



Automated Data Management Planning (DMP) Tool

Project ARC

- collaboration – Canadian Association of Research Libraries (CARL) and regional academic library associations with Research Data Canada (RCD)
- adapt existing DMP tools for Canadian context
- develop a data curation Centre of Expertise
- develop framework for library-based data services network in Canada
