

The Canadian Challenge



5,000 kilometers



- → Érudit disseminates 162 active HSS journals (73 in complete OA, others with 12 month moving wall)
- → Over 250 Canadian journals use PKP's OJS software
- → Growing number (40+) of Canadian HSS journals using both OJS & Érudit

Publicly Funded with Market Elements



Funding

- \rightarrow Aid to Scholarly Journals grants / SSHRC (3 year grant)
- → Funding for research infrastructure (6 year grant)



Journals and

academic publishers

- → 12 month moving wall
- → Revenues from 30K to 80K
- Dependency on subscription revenues ¹/₃ of total revenues
- Independent, and academy lead
- APC's a poor fit

Policies

- → Open access policy,
 12 months embargo (2015)
- → Open Science Roadmap (2020 ?)

An OA Environment in the Making

→ The Érudit and Canadian Research Knowledge Network (CRKN) partnership has created a framework for a new approach to journal and library collaboration from vendor to partner.



Transitioning to OA without APCs In Partnership with Academic Libraries

2008-2013

- Libraries subscribe to journals (*whole collection, bundles, per titles*)
- Journals choose between 24-month embargo period or open access
- 0\$ to OA journals

2014-2022

- Libraries collectively support open access publishing and journals in transition towards open access (*whole collection*)
- 12-month embargo period until 2022
- \$\$ to OA journals


