

The Panpoëticon Batavûm in HTML

As a collection the Panpoëticon is no longer intact, but it has been digitally reconstructed as a website, 'Het Schrijverskabinet'.



The Panpoëticon Batavum as RDF

We used a (custom made) Python script to convert the HTML of the Schrijverskabinet website into an RDF representation of the Panpoëticon.

Website (HTML):

- Find (Who?)
- Browse

RDF representation:

- Aggregate, combine, etc.
- Link to other data

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
Golden Agents

Golden Agents is creating a Semantic Web architecture for research on the creative industries of the Dutch Golden Age.

- RDF based

Some key data sets are:

- ONSTAGE: structured data on theater performances in Amsterdam, 1637-present
- ECARTICO: structured biographical data on artists, writers, printers, etc., ca. 1475-1725.



The Panpoëticon and Golden Agents

The RDF representation of the Panpoëticon can be easily integrated into the Golden Agents infrastructre.

The DBNL identifier does the trick!

Mapping places of birth

Using the DBNL identifiers as an intermediary we can use data from Ecartico and the Panpoëticon, to map the places of birth of the inductees of the Panpoëticon.



Playwrights in the Panpoëticon



Using the DBNL identifiers as an intermediary we can use data from Ecartico, Onstage and the Panpoëticon, to investigate whether the most popular playwrights in the Amsterdam Theater were inductees in the Panpoëticon.

The table ranks playwrights by the number of stagings of their plays in the Amsterdam Theater between 1637 and 1725 and indicates whether they were inducted in the Panpoëticon or not.

Conclusion



This little exercise shows that:

- The Panpoëticon can be easily integrated within the Golden Agents research infrastructure.
- Connecting the Panpoëticon to external resources will increase its research potential.

What we learned from this exercise is that:

- Linking data is partly a technical issue. Basically it is about connecting scholars and scholarship.
