Citizen Science (CS)

- seems to have more visibility in natural science projects
- less frequently highlighted in Humanities projects

Why CS survey?

few surveys on CS involvement across different projects ->
 only recently increasing numbers





Recent CS Survey

Survey to map Citizen Science activities in Europe

• aims to identify content, scope and impact of different Citizen Science projects among European countries.

(European Citizen Science Association (ECSA) conference organising team and in collaboration with RAND Europe, working for the Open Science Monitor
