A LIBER DMP CATALOGUE?! What it is and what it is not!



What?

- Is a DMP catalogue existing for several years
- Is the fruit of a project started in **2017** with several members from

LIBER partner institutions, led by Jasmin K. Böhmer

- Is an **ongoing work**, continued by the already mentioned **taskforce**
- Is a catalogue from nine DMPs of finished projects from a variety of European states and universities



What?

- Is open to all research disciplines
- Is based on quality reviews of the DMPs with assessments of the quality of the different parts in the sense of good practices
- Makes the **DMP citable** via the Zenodo DOI
- Is a **hub** of good examples for further use
- Collects DMPs the **consent of researchers**



How does it work?



How?

- Get DMPs with researchers consent
- At least two working group members review a DMP independently using the performance level structure of the "DCC H2020 DMP Compliance Rubric" and the sections of the "DCC Checklist for a Data Management Plan v4"
- Once reviewed, the researcher gets feedback and can adapt
- Final and merged review is displayed in the 'Review Conclusion' on the website
- Final DMP is uploaded on the **Zenodo Community** as well as on the **DMP Catalogue** itself



How?

- Administrative Data Basic and contextual project information
- Data Collection Data, code, and methodology characteristics
- Documentation and Metadata Metadata creation, documentation, applied standards
- Ethics and Legal Compliance Consent, legal and ethical considerations, access restriction needs
- Storage and Backup Storing, Backup, Sharing regime and resources
- Selection and Preservation Long-term archiving, digital curation and preservation
- Data Sharing Access control, Licensing, Open Data



How the DMP catalogue could move forward...



Some suggestions from you

- Not machine-actionable, no versioning of DMPs
- No specific criteria for choice of DMPs
- Reviewers are currently not certified
- Review process based on FAIR Principles
- Some design issues, such as navigation and display

- Continue to review and add DMPs
- Continue to participate in ongoing discussions and reflexions about maDMPs and how this can develop the catalogue, i.e. become a platform to build knowledge and expertise with maDMPs?
- Who should advocate the need/necessity for a shared approach to create/build a centralised DMP catalogue with an associated 'platform of expertise'?
- Should DMPs of EU funded projects by default be eligible for review and audit, to build further knowledge on usefulness and emerging practices for DMPs?
