Executive Summary

The European Language Social Science Thesaurus (ELSST) is a broad-based, multilingual thesaurus for the social sciences, managed by a cross-national team within the CESSDA Metadata Office (MDO) project. The current version of ELSST was released on 16 June 2020. The previous version dates from 10 September 2019. This report records the changes that were made to the English source version of ELSST since the previous release.

1 Introduction

The European Language Social Science Thesaurus (ELSST) is a broad-based, multilingual thesaurus for the social sciences. ELSST keywords are used describe the subjects and concepts covered by data. ELSST is currently available in 14 languages: Danish, Dutch, Czech, English, Finnish, French, German, Greek, Lithuanian, Norwegian, Romanian, Slovenian, Spanish, and Swedish. Content development work on ELSST is led by four CESSDA partners within the Metadata Office (MDO) project: UK Data Service (UK), FSD (Finland), GESIS (Germany) and NSD (Norway). This core group meets every 2-3 weeks to drive development work forward. The meetings are also open to ELSST translators (all languages) and decisions taken at the meetings are circulated to them for comment. Regular general meetings are also held for all translators, where strategic matters are discussed.

The current version of ELSST was released on 16 June 2020. The previous version dates from 10 September 2019.

The focus of the work in this period was on the creation of a new hierarchy, TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE, and the inclusion of new topical concepts such as COVID-19 and DISINFORMATION.

This report records the changes that were made to the English source version of ELSST since the previous release. Updates were also made to all other language versions of ELSST except Spanish, since no organisation that can provide Spanish translations is currently participating in ELSST, and Danish, where no resources were available. Translation of Preferred Terms for all languages is between 98-100% complete.

2 Summary of changes

In ELSST, concepts are represented by a Preferred Term (PT) in each language. Preferred Terms are used to describe/index data. Preferred Terms may be associated with Use For terms (UFs), typically synonyms or near-synonyms, which are not used for indexing, but which guide the user to their Preferred Term.

The following changes were made to the English version of ELSST:

- 14 new concepts
- 6 deleted concepts
- 6 relabelled Preferred Terms (PTs)
- 21 new Use For terms (UFs)
- 2 deleted Use For Terms (UFs)



Preferred Terms may also be associated with Scope Notes, which describe their meaning within the thesaurus, and Use Notes, which provide guidance on how they may be used for indexing. History Notes and Scope Note Sources provide further information, mainly for administrative purposes, on the history of a Preferred Term and the source of its Scope Note respectively. The following changes were made to the English version of ELSST:

- 18 new or changed Scope Notes
- 1 new Use Note
- 16 new or changed History Notes
- 16 new or changed Scope Note Sources

Concepts may be related hierarchically (via Broader Terms or Narrower Terms) or nonhierarchically via Related Terms. The relational structure of ELSST is common to all languages. The following changes were made:

- 46 changes to the Broader Terms/Narrower Terms relationships
- 14 changes to Related Terms relationships

- TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE: REFERS TO TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC
- TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE SECURITY: PROTECTION OF TECHNICAL INFRASTRUCTURE SYSTEMS, NETWORKS AND ASSETS, ESPECIALLY CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE
- DISRUPTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE SERVICES: DISRUPTION OF TECHNICAL SYSTEMS AND NETWORKS DUE TO, FOR EXAMPLE, WEATHER PHENOMENA OR TECHNICAL FAILURES
- CANALS: ARTIFICIAL WATERCOURSES
- PORTS, HARBOURS AND DOCKS: BUILT OR NATURAL FACILITIES FOR TRADE OR RECREATIONAL SHIPPING AND BOATING
- ROADS: ROADS AND STREETS, MAINLY MEANT FOR VEHICLES TO TRAVEL BETWEEN PLACES

- CONSUMER BEHAVIOUR: THE WAY IN WHICH PEOPLE ACQUIRE, USE AND DISCARD PRODUCTS AND SERVICES, AND ADOPT LIFESTYLE PRACTICES



• CROWDFUNDING: THE PRACTICE OF FUNDING A PROJECT OR VENTURE BY RAISING SMALL AMOUNTS OF MONEY FROM A LARGE AMOUNT OF PEOPLE

- ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE: SYSTEMS AND FACILITIES FOR ENERGY GENERATION, TRANSMISSION, DISTRIBUTION AND STORAGE (*previously THE SERVICES AND FACILITIES NECESSARY TO PROVIDE AN ENERGY SUPPLY TO A NATIONAL GRID*)
- CYCLING INFRASTRUCTURE: ALL INFRASTRUCTURE DESIGNED FOR CYCLISTS (previously *THE PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE ASSOCIATED WITH BICYCLE USAGE, SUCH AS CYCLE LANES AND BICYCLE PARKS*)
- PEDESTRIAN INFRASTRUCTURE: ALL INFRASTRUCTURE DESIGNED FOR PEDESTRIANS (previously *THE PHYSICAL STRUCTURES PROVIDED FOR THOSE ON FOOT, SUCH AS FOOTPATHS, PAVEMENTS, CROSSINGS AND FOOTBRIDGES*)
- WATER SUPPLY: THE PROVISION OF WATER WITHIN A PARTICULAR AREA (previously *THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF WATER THAT IS AVAILABLE WITHIN A PARTICULAR AREA FOR HUMAN AND OTHER USES*)

• WATER INFRASTRUCTURE: FOR TRANSPORT USE EITHER "SEA TRANSPORT" OR "INLAND WATER TRANSPORT".
