

Developing Sharing Guidelines

- Training development is slow and expensive
- Few of us are funded for open-source content development
- Training needs are similar between organisations
- Sharing of material can save time, money, and lead to better outcomes

The Opportunity

- Sharing allows organisations to expand their training portfolios for minimal cost
- Shared maintenance improves quality and reduces costs
- Collaborative development of material is faster and cheaper, and allows access to a larger knowledge pool
- Use of common training material leads to a more consistent syllabus to researchers



The Challenges

- Must show clear value to our host institutions; financial as well as reputational
- Must retain control over material and IP
- Shared development and maintenance carry an administrative overhead
