



Potential 'no show' mitigators










NO-SHOW POLICY


- ➤ 48 hours notice required for cancellation
- ➤ No show, no notice cost \$10 penalty
- Repeated no will be moved to the waiting list for future events



Tackling No-Shows

Email a few days before saying how other people will miss out if you don't show up



Register ~30% more people than you can actually cater to



Repeat offenders automatically moved to waiting lists for future training and only able to attend if space (realistically – never)

Tackling No-shows

Charge a small attendance fee that is affordable on a PhD scholarship





Charge a fee at sign-up that gets refunded if a person attends
