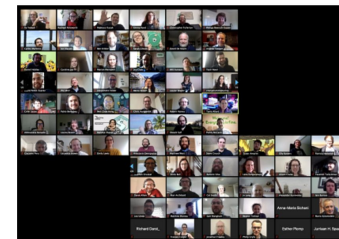


Highlights from Collaborations Workshop 2020
