WP7: NATURAL RESOURCES, ECONOMY AND COASTAL COMMUNITY PLANNING



Fieldwork in Yakutsk (Capital of Sakha Republic), June 2018:

- -Identify key stakeholders involved in coastal permafrost thaw
- -Better understanding the Russian administrative system
- -Delineate regulatory and policy framework regarding the Arctic region in the Sakha Republic
- Data collection: Interviews were conducted to people working in/representing several Institutions + 14 persons

Preliminary results

- Permafrost has major impact on resource-based economies and societies through ecosystem services
 - Local cultures are closely associated to permafrost
 - Careful assessment of local ecosystem-services is needed
- Governance of permafrost thaw risk entails multiscale nested institutions
 - Mapping stakes and stakeholder is critical before planning an intervention
 - This mapping needs to be validated locally, regionally and maybe nationally.

Next steps

- Preparing and submitting a paper: Stakeholder-issue mapping in West Siberia
- It will be useful to define: who will be addressed to and which theoretical framework will be used.
- Second fieldwork planned for next year (May 2019) in Tiksi and Bykovsky
 - Connecting local markets and ecosystem services
 - Connecting local markets with other regions of Sakha Republic
- Beyond economics: how does permafrost contribute to the various dimensions of Arctic local sustainability
