Synopsis of check sheets and logbooks for PV Microgrid in Kigeme, Rwanda: July 2019 to March 2020^{*}

This report provides a summary of the check sheets and logbooks completed by the field personnel in Kigeme, Rwanda, with regards to the usage of the PV microgrid installed at 2 nurseries and a playground. The report outlines the key issues identified as well as the energy usage pattern at the microgrid for each month. The key feedback from users is also included.

I. Summary of check sheets

	3. In the week of 10 th Sep, a blackout was reported due to plant
	shutdown. Hence, none of the lights or sockets were working.

Dec 2019	1. Check sheets were only available for the week of 10 th Dec.
	2. 3 lamps in nursery building 2, room 2, were reportedly not working as switches were not working.
	3. Check sheets not translated.
Jan 2020	 In week 1, one socket and 2 switches at nursery school were not working. All 3 lights at the pole near playground were not working. Also, a light was not working.
	2. In week 2, one socket in nursery 2 room 1 was not in its right place but was working. 1 socket in nursery 1 room 3 was not working. A need for sim card was reported because the one available was not giving information at the right time.
	3. In week 3, 1 socket in nursery 1 room 3 was not working.
Feb 2020	 For all weeks, a single report was shared, marked from 6th Feb to 9th Mar. It was reported that some documents were displaced.
	2. One socket was displaced in the nursery building 2, 1 CPE or switch each was not working in either of the nursery buildings.
	3. There are 7 lights which were not working – 3 in nursery building 1 third room, 3 in nursery building 2 and 1 in the playground.

	 4 sockets were not working in nursery building 2 – 2 in room 1, 1 in room 2 and 1 in room 3.
Mar 2020	 In the week of 3rd March, 7 lights were reportedly not working – 3 in nursery 1 (3rd room), 3 in nursery 2 (2nd room) and 1 in playground. 4 sockets were reportedly not working – all in nursery 2 (2 in room 1 and 1 each in rooms 2 and 3). Damage to the powerhouse was reported. In the week of 9th March, 1 socket was reportedly not working in nursery 2 room 1. Also, powerhouse was reportedly dirty. In the week of 15th March, 1 socket was still reportedly broken. The powerhouse was cleaned. In the week of 23rd March, 3 lights on 1st streetlight transmission line, 10 lights in playground and 3 lights in nursery 2 room 3 were not working. Out of 8 sockets, 3 sockets in nursery 2 were not working and another one elsewhere.
