

Why, How, Who

Why?

- Understand current situation with European research libraries.
- Find ways in which we can better support our members in the context of the pandemic and moving forward.

How?

A survey composed of mainly:

- Multiply choice questions
- Open-ended questions

Who?

Participants were mainly LIBER libraries, but we also included nonmember libraries and institutions.



What did we ask participants?

32 Questions

Section 2: Availability of services and materials

Section 3: How can LIBER support you?

Key Findings

Main concerns with libraries reopening


My library is open

The lack of space availability

The lack of available staff to offer support

The reduced hours are not enough to support users


The possibility that institutions think "physical libraries are not needed anymore"

Increase/change of digital services






Acquisition of more digital materials, licenses, learning & teaching software due to COVID-19



Difficulty with publishers regarding licenses and prices






Are staff and users having difficulty using digital materials, for remote purposes, because of copyright law infringement?

Yes, they cannot scan or copy materials for online teaching


Yes, they cannot share copyright-protected content via streams or recordings of lectures




Have library projects been affected due to COVID-19?






What's the level of your service staff's skills for delivering v






Have you had to redirect expenses towards digital services or content?





Do you foresee any budget cuts for your library or university because of COVID-19 in the next academic year?









What would most benefit libraries?


More materials available digitally

Online services/events specifically designed to help libraries and librarians to cope with COVID-19


Online services/events specifically designed to support research libraries' move towards complete digitalisation

Support in voicing budgetary issues specifically to cope with COVID-19, at European level


Support in projects related to helping libraries and librarians to cope with COVID-19

Key conclusions

- Answers reflect **extreme diversity** in situations and countries. We should think about designing our action points accordingly.
- Health and safety (physical and mental) of staff is one of the top concerns of the physical aspect of libraries, as well as reorganising spaces.
- Dialogue is especially important now. Contact with users and peers is greatly missed by many participants. Not only emotionally but practically as well.

- **Digitisation** is a reoccurring theme in many of the written answers. There is no doubt that there is a high demand to support a transition.
- Definite focus towards making more online training and digital content available.
- There's an existential quality to the comments in the survey, which
 could be caused by the shock the academic world (and the rest of
 the world) has gone and is still going through. New kinds of
 realities, on several levels, are surfacing and libraries, users,
 publishers and other stakeholders need to be prepared to adapt.
