# Is your practice interested in improving patient attendance at diabetic retinopathy screening?

#### The IDEAS Study

Aim: to examine the feasibility

of an approach to improve

eye care for people with

diabetes.

## Why?

Screening is an essential part of diabetes management, yet uptake in Ireland is only 61%.

## Is your practice eligible?

- Computerised record system
- Practice nurse

### What would taking part involve?

- **Training session (1.5 hour)** for practice staff on intervention procedures and practice audit conducted by the research team.
- Audit by practice nurse or administrator at baseline and re-audit at 6 months to identify patients with diabetes who have not attended RetinaScreen and any changes in attendance.
  - Nurse or administrator sets up **electronic alerts** on patient files to prompt GPs and nurses to remind patients.
  - GPs and nurses **remind** patients who have not attended screening face-to-face and by phone.
- Practices send a letter reminder with a key information leaflet. These materials will be provided by the study team. The intervention will run for 6 months.

#### Benefits of taking part

- 1. Opportunity to improve care for patients with diabetes
- 2. Training: improve practice expertise in running searches and conducting audit
- 3. Audit can fulfil Medical Council obligations or be counted as internal CPD
- 4. Practice reimbursement: up to €1000 depending on the number of patients audited (standard fee €500 + €5 per patient)
