Omicron is smaller than the other letters and above the line; omega is formed of a small slightly elongated circule, closed below by a long horizontal; epsilon has a shorter detached mid-bar; theta has a short detached central line; tau shows some light separation between vertical and horizontal; kappa has almost full length tails; alpha is very broad, with wide low horizontal bar; mu has vertical first and last strokes, and the middle strokes do not descend fully to the line; phi is rounded, with a tall vertical; pi has a slightly overlapping horizontal; sigma has horizontal top and bottom strokes.


