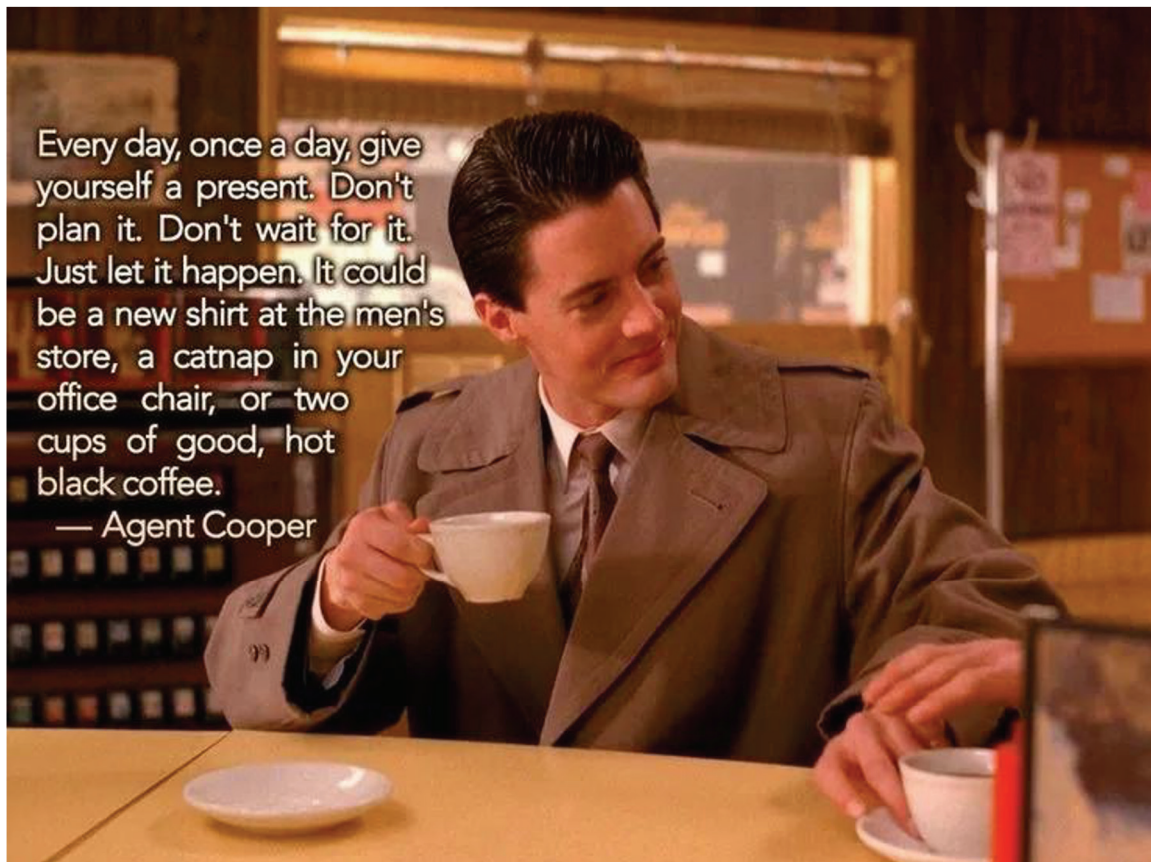

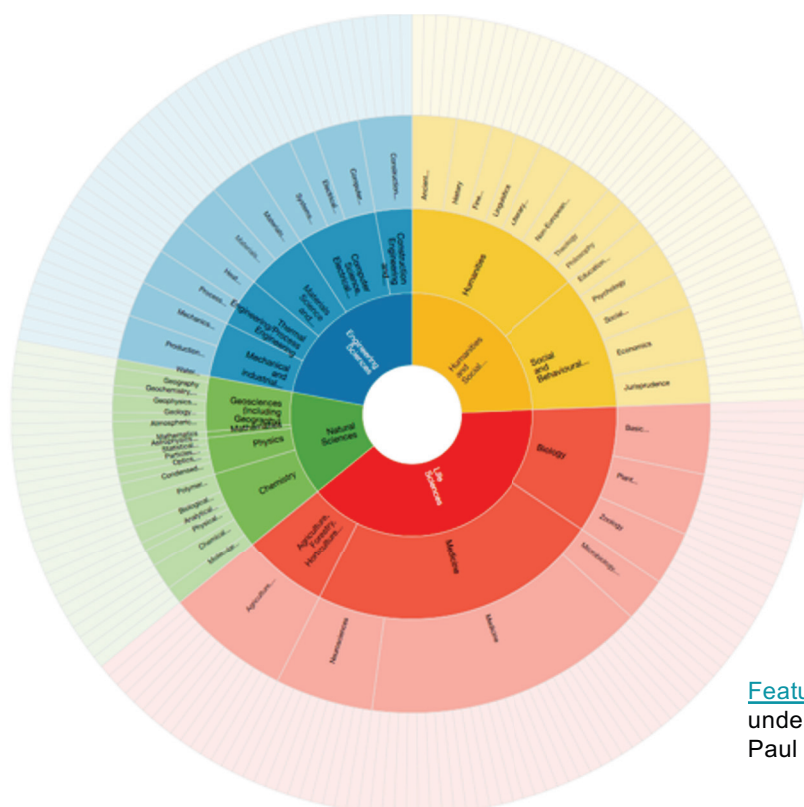

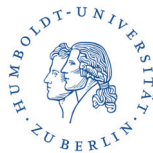

- Connect with other infrastructures
 - Provide extendable core repository descriptions
 - Facilitate the reuse of information on research data repositories
- New Service Model for re3data

PIDs for research (data) repositories: What are the use cases?

“Donna Hayward: There's things you can't get in books.

Harold Smith: There are things you can't get anywhere... but we dream they can be found in other people.”

- **Community** Driven Open Reference for Research Data Repositories (COREF)
- **Goal** → comprehensive understanding of the community's needs, wishes, and insights

- What repository PID solutions are your dreams made of?

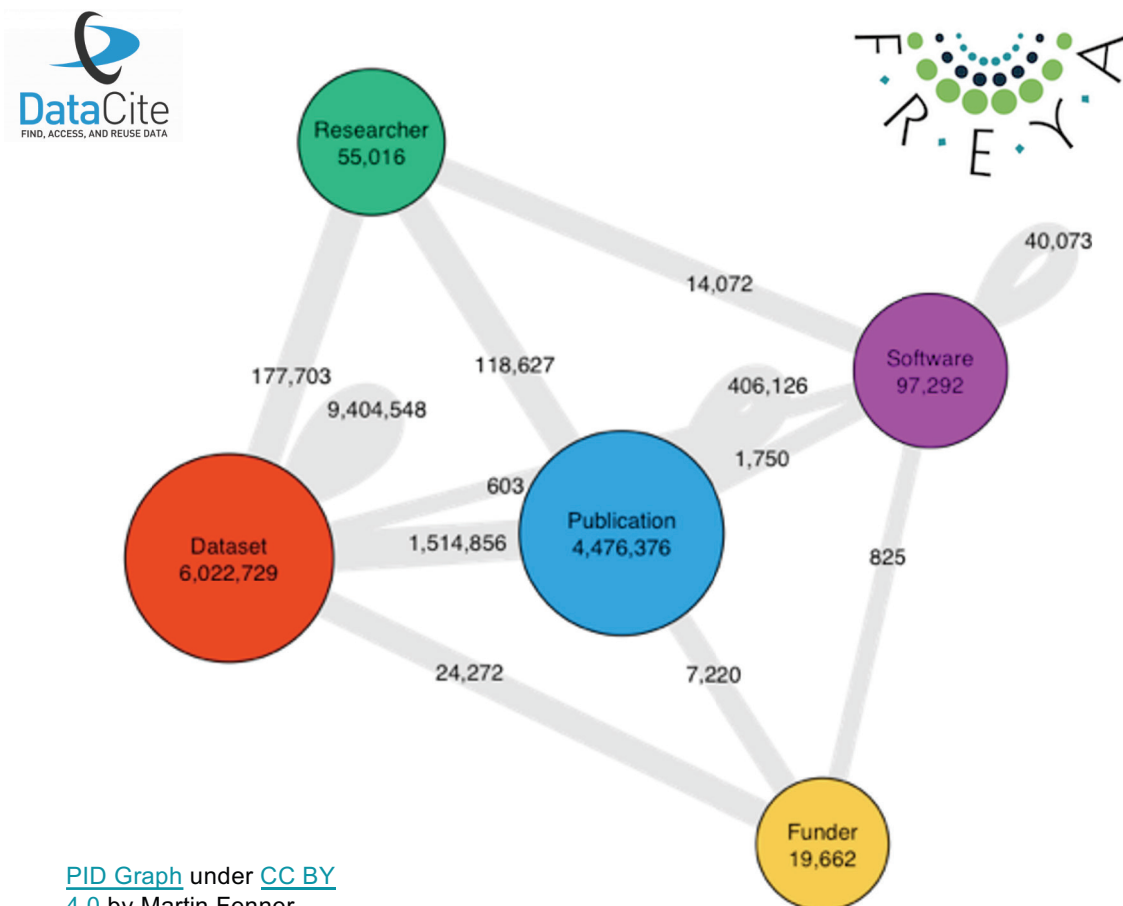


Should a PID system for repositories be introduced or could an existing system be used for this purpose?
