# Background

## Digital Humanities in South Africa

- Initial focus on digitization
  - South African History Online (SAHO) (2000)
  - University of KwaZulu-Natal: Digital Innovation South Africa
  - Rhodes University: International Library of African Music
  - ...
- Emerging field of computational linguistics (tools and resources)
  - Centre for Text Technology (CTexT), NWU (2004)
  - University of South Africa
  - University of Pretoria
  - Stellenbosch University
  - Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR, Meraka Institute)
  - ...
  - National Centre for Human Language Technology ->Resource Management Agency 2012

# DH and CSS in South Africa

- Around 2014 specific (isolated) DH activities started
  - North-West University: DH awareness symposium and first national workshops on DH
  - University of Pretoria: Symposium (DH and representations of self)
  - Durban University: Best Digital Humanities Tool Award
  - ...
- Digital Humanities Association of Southern Africa (DHASA)
  - founded in 2016, formally joined ADHO in 2018

# South African Centre for Digital Language Resources

- SADIaR <https://www.sadilar.org>
- Research infrastructure founded 2016
- Funded by Department of Science and Innovation (South Africa)
  - South African Research Infrastructure Roadmap (SARIR)
- Hub located at North West University
- Several nodes
  - NWU CText: Text technology
  - ICELDA: Language testing
  - University of Pretoria: Digitization
  - University of South Africa: Terminology and Wordnets
  - CSIR: Speech
  - Stellenbosch: Child language

# Programs

SADiLaR runs two programs:

- Digitization
  - Creation of text, speech, multimodal resources, digitization of analog resources
  - Development of (computational linguistic) tools
  - Website
    - Repository of data collections and tools
    - Online tools: corpus portal, Voyant, machine translation, ...
- **Digital Humanities**
  - Build (DH) research capacity
  - Organize training events
  - ...

# Training events

Within DH program SADiLaR organized several training events

- At different universities in South Africa
- Open to interested researchers and students in Digital Humanities
- Various topics
  - Data analysis and annotation tools
  - Digital Humanities
  - Corpus creation
  - Linguistic text processing tools
  - Carpentries (various computational topics)
- Successful, well attended events

# Limitations of training events

## Well perceived training events have limitations

- No follow ups (training events are ad hoc, no building on experience)
- Limited focus on South African context
  - Languages, culture, ...
- Unclear impact
  - On education (do participants teach learned material?)
  - On research (do participants use learned material?)
- Participants have no additional help after the training
  - E.g., when they run into problems or have questions afterwards

# New training programme

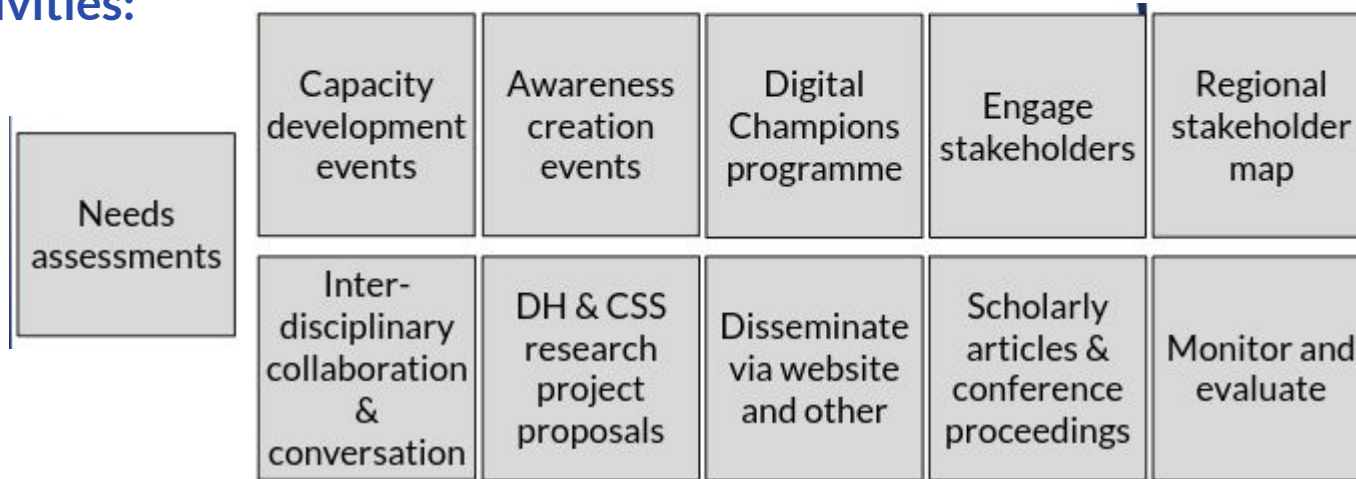
To resolve these issues SADiLaR develops a new training programme

- Training events
  - Related to each other/building on each other
  - Material using South African languages and cultures
- Focus on interdisciplinarity
  - Collaboration between participants
- ...
- Comprehensive programme (versus ad hoc events)

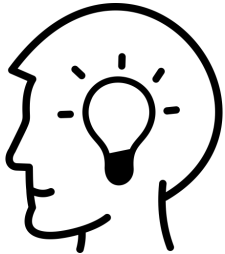

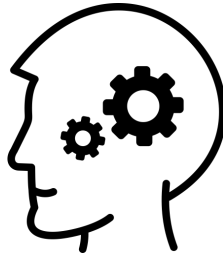
# Digital Champions Initiative

community

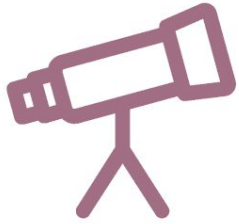

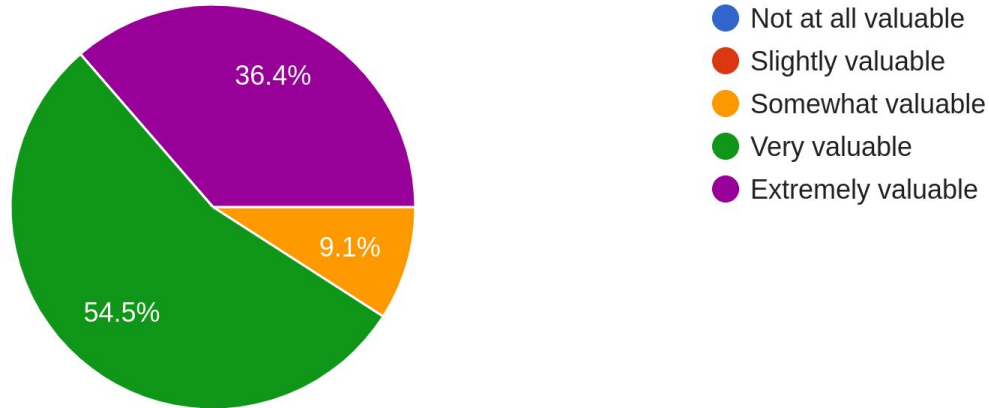
