What is ETER

• Data at the institutional level rather than at the country or regional level (EUROSTAT)

The reference database on European Higher Education Institutions

- A public resource available online at <u>www.eter-project.eu</u>
- Funded by the European Commission, DG EAC
- Developed in close cooperation with EUROSTAT and National Statistical Authorities



ETER in a nutshell



- About 3,000 Higher Education Institutions
- 'European countries': EU-27+EEA-EFTA+UK+(potential) candidate countries
- Currently data for 2011-2016
- Data on:
 - Institutional characteristics (name, foundation year etc.)
 - Geography (main and satellite campuses)
 - Academic and non-academic staff
 - Revenues and expenditures
 - Students and graduates (including various breakdowns)
 - PhD and research mobility
 - Erasmus students
 - Demographic changes (mergers, etc.)

ETER specificities



- EUROSTAT data: country or regional level
- ETER data: institutional level
 - Allows studying the internal differentiation of the HE system (for example universities vs. colleges)
 - And the detailed geographical structure
- Some additional data available
 - More data on academic staff (nationality)
 - Disaggregated structure of HEI revenues
 - Pre-defined indicators at the institutional level





- high coverage of HEIs delivering at least a bachelor
 - Universities
 - Colleges
 - Art schools, etc.
 - About 95% of students ISCED6-8 compared to EUROSTAT
 - Lower coverage in few countries.
- No coverage of institutions delivering *only* short diplomas (ISCED5)
 - Because of numbers and data availability

Methods and sources



- Most data come from National Statistical Authorities or Higher Education Ministries
 - Definitions compliant with EUROSTAT UOE data collection
 - Additional definitions for staff and finances
- Descriptive and geographical information from the web, Wikipedia, etc.
- Some information, such as Erasmus data, from EU databases
- Completeness good except for financial data
- Some countries with few data (French part of Belgium, Romania, most Balkan countries)

Access



- Online at <u>www.eter-project.eu</u>
 - Search interface with easy selection of variables, country, year
 - Some visualization and summary report tools
 - Reports
 - Methodological information
 - Newsletter with regular information and analyses
- Data can be downloaded in different formats for statistical analysis
 - Including APIs for interfacing with websites
- Most data fully public
 - Some confidential available only upon registration on the website
 - Consent to publish from the NSAs (based on a data disclosure agreement)

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Usage and cooperation



- Widely used in the research literature
- Widely used for policy reports: Eurydice on academic staff, JRC on student mobility, DG Regio on access to higher education
- Well-developed cooperation
 - OECD project on international higher education data
 - EQAR database on institutional evaluation
 - To be further developed in the current contract (WHED, EUA, MULTIRANK).

ETERIV contract



- Extend and strengthen the current system
 - Additional years of data collection
 - Improving the coverage of HE
 - Improve completeness and data quality
 - Extend cooperation with similar initiatives (OECD, EQAR, WHED, U-Multirank)
- Extend usage and dissemination
- Prepare the future
 - Inventory of data needs and data sources



Organisation

- DG EAC contract
- 3 years (05.2021-04.2024)
- Five partners (USI, JOANNEUM, AIT, NIFU, Sapienza)
 - National experts and NSAs
- Supported by
 - A Strategic Advisory Board
 - A Technical Support Group (incl. NSAs)

 - Dissemination to scholarly community and policy makers

Cooperation with the RISIS project



- H2020 infrastructure project on science and innovation data
 - Main research partner of ETER
- Forms of cooperation
 - Register of public research organizations OrgReg (<u>https://rcf.risis2.eu/</u>)
 - A register with a larger perimeter than ETER and systematic coverage of demography (from the year 2000 onwards) and linkages
 - Research output data (WoS publications, patents, EU-FP projects)
 - Scholarly dissemination activities (research seminars).



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Data collection process



- Process already started with analyses of current situation per country
 - Coverage by institutions and variables
 - > Are there institutions, which are not covered, but should be?
 - Can we close gaps in the data?
- Perimeter validation
 - RISIS-OrgReg (Register of Public-Sector Organizations) as basis
 - Perimeter files prepared together with a manual by ETER team
 - NSAs/NEs receive list of institutions => confirm inclusion
 - Descriptors and geographical data already included in perimeter file, since changes will also be transferred to OrgReg
 - Planned to be finalized in September

Data collection process



- Data collection to be started in September
 - for 3 academic years (2017/18 2019/20; optional: 2020/21)
- Proposed inclusion of new variables
 - Student characteristics foreseen in UOE data collection (full-time/part-time; age)
 - Academic staff (high interest, ETER team provides proposal for TSG meeting in June)
- Each country has a contact person in the ETER team
 - Data collection files and guidelines prepared by ETER team => send to NSAs/NEs
 - Returned files will run through data quality process, upcoming questions will be discussed between data deliverer and contact person
- 2 data collection training sessions will be organized in August/September
- Publish data in Spring 2022

Dissemination Overview



- Staged; building up on ETER I-III
- User centric approach along main user groups:
 - Scholars in higher education
 - Policy makers
 - Institutional managers in higher education
- Widening the user base
- Embedding in related communities
- Support of EC dissemination activities

Training

- From August 21 onwards

- Training for ETER users groups (scholars, policy makers, research managers)
- Training technical infrastructure and support team

- After first release of new data (March 22)
- Country snapshot reports
- Research seminars (embedded in RISIS)
- Policy seminars and seminars for research managers
- Analytical support group for the EC

Country snapshot reports



- Automated standardized reports
 - Pilot in October 2021
 - Basic characteristics of national HE system
 - Policy relevant topics of interests (e.g. students inclusion)
- Structure and topics based on
 - inputs from the lead users
 - inputs from national experts
 - agreed on with the EC based pilot report
- Release of annual updates





- Training for higher education data providers and internal training for the national experts within the project team
 - Two alternative dates are foreseen for the first training end of August and beginning of September (envisaged August 26, and September 16)
 - Ongoing, in particular for each round of data collection
- Customized on-demand training for institutional managers in higher education
 - Starting 2022
 - Programme to be defined

 - Priorities for extensions and addressing data issues
- Technical Support Group by late June
 - Revision of the handbook
 - New student and academic staff breakdown
- Perimeter revision (incl. descriptors and geographical information)
 - July August
- Start of data collection: September
 - Training for data collection: 26.08 and 16.09.
- Data publication: February 2022.

Long-term outlook



- Develop a strategy for the long-term extension of ETER
 - Potential for alternative methods of data collection
 - Fostering interoperability by sharing HEI identifiers
 - How do we deal with ISCED5 coverage?
- Consolidating the relationships with NSAs/countries
 - Defining their long-term role in ETER
 - Broadening the scope of cooperation
- Establish ETER as the reference database on European HEIs
 - For scholarly and policy analyses
