











Card game - 20 quartets (i.e. 20 sets of 4 cards)











DANS Data Game - How to play


- Goal of the game is to collect sets of four
- Paper version: 2-6 people
- Shuffle & distribute cards amongst players
- Ask another player for a specific card of a set of which you own at least one card and would like to collect the rest.
 - ightarrow If the other player has the card, they have to give it to you and you can ask again.
 - \rightarrow If they do not have the card, your turn is over and the next player may ask someone for a card.
- The <u>winner</u> is the one who acquired the <u>most sets</u>.



 - subset version takes 30 minutes




DANS Data Game - Variations
