








CESSDA behavioural data for research tackling the global COVID-19 challenge

# Looking at comparatively similar situations from the past

"The current COVID-19 pandemic seems to appear mainly as a medical question for politicians even though the effects are also economic with restaurants closing temporarily or shutting down for example. The social science research community could make more noise as they can offer relevant data even without yet having access to results from COVID-19 related studies. We can look at comparatively similar situations from the past."

# Public trust influences COVID-19 measures taken by authorities

"The Nordic countries are in the top tier in international studies when it comes to general trust in politicians, parties and the political process. Public trust has had an influence on the measures taken by the authorities. In the Nordic countries, we believe in science and have a generalized trust in the authorities, which I think has helped them when deciding what measures to take. The measures they did take were quite drastic during lockdown, and I think that would have been much more difficult if they didn't know that there was trust in the political system."

#### Good data can save lives

"The COVID-19 pandemic has also shown that near-real-time availability of high-quality data is crucial for monitoring not only case numbers and mortality rates, but also the social and economic consequences of the pandemic. We need better access to data from health records, registries, and administrative databases. Challenges include interoperable IT systems, semantics and harmonization. The COVID-19 pandemic shows that good data can save lives, and I hope this experience will provide an impetus for better solutions."








## COVID-19 in the CESSDA Data Catalogue


#### Social Sciences and Digital Humanities Archive (SODHA)

MOSAiCH-ISSP: a three-wave online panel survey with questions on the coronavirus pandemic and the measures to control the spread of the virus was added to the annual social survey MOSAiCH. The focus of this Covid-19 survey is on questions about well-being, work, work-life balance, and politics. The first wave was fielded between the end of April and mid-June 2020.



The Swiss Household Panel has conducted a special wave to assess the living conditions during COVID-19 semi-lockdown in spring 2020.





The Swiss Election Study Selects: in the fourth wave of the Selects Panel Survey (September-November 2020), there was a block of questions on COVID-19. The questions not only cover citizens' opinions on the role of the Federal Council, Parliament, and cantons in crisis management, fundamental civil rights, the relationship between the economy and public health but also investigate populist attitudes and work-related changes due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
