Setting the scene

- COVID-19 has placed open scholarship high on the agenda of governments
- Growing number of "repository friendly" policies (e.g. Rights Retention Strategy of Plan S)
- UNESCO recommendations emphasis on not just open, but also the need for equity and bibliodiversity

But

- Negative messaging about "green OA" by some publishers only gold OA is real OA
- Attempts to "capture" the repository market by defining specific requirements for repositories
- Highly distributed, diverse and siloed landscape
