




Does your library have an Open Content policy? All Responses

We seek transformation through a variety of models.






- Overwhelmed by number and variety of OA programs, comprehensive outreach about OA ecosystem needed
- Desire to match OA funding to institutional and library missions, e.g., "read" vs "publish" institutions
- Support for a variety of OA programs and initiatives, diversity is key
- Lower thresholds for funding opportunities



- Diverse group of 140 institutions for multi-year deal, large/comprehensive to small/specialized
- Sought a way through this group to develop new support for OA programs
- Negotiated to redirect funds to support OA publishing
 - Ebook publishing with Springer Nature, aligning with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDG)






- Left Springer Nature in 2021 to move into OA, now published by Duke University Press
- Leader in the field of population studies
- Seeking the support of stakeholders - demographic research centers and departments, foundations, consortia, and libraries




A framework to support strategic evaluation and funding of OA initiatives



- Facilitates an experimental incubation space for emerging models
- Centralizes administration and funding for each program with transparent lists of supporters
- Provides a funding hub for more custom programs, smaller publishers, and niche scholarship to maintain bibliodiversity
- Empowers investors to make principled, spending decisions and fund programs that align with their missions all in one place, increasing efficiency.





- Since LYRASIS began its OA program in 2012, there has been a 32% increase in the number of participating libraries
- The number of times libraries provided support for an OA program through LYRASIS has increased by 107% since 2012.
- The largest increase in the number of annual financial commitments came during fiscal year 2021, aka the pandemic a growth by 22% over the number of commitments made in the previous year.
