

Challenges

- Reduction from 16 (Fall 2018) to 11 (Spring 2020) librarians
- Need for scalable and sustainable information literacy instruction
- Need for online and asynchronous options
- COVID-19 (remote work)



2. From the gray horizontal menu click "Research Tools" and then "Catalog." The default search will search only for items in the UWG Library. To search for items from all USG Libraries, click on "Advanced Search" (to the right of the search box). At the top of the new search box, change the "Search Scope" from "University of West Georgia" to "University System of Georgia" by using the drop-down menu.

Starting a catalog search

In the UWG catalog, it usually works best to begin with a simple search. You can then narrow your search from the results page. (Click the Sign-in for More Options tab to access an online book, or to request an item that is located at another USG Library.)




