






## Read & Publish/transformative agreements


- > 250 institutions from more than 20 countries.

#### **Positives**

- Transformative Journals: compliant with funder mandates

- R&P: intensive, time-consuming, lots of manual work, more staff = increased costs
- Hard to gain attention when you're a small not-for-profit organization
