1 Introduction

One of the pivotal aspirations of the Search and Rescue (S&R) project Dissemination, Communication and Exploitation strategy is to establish a visible and widespread online presence through the operationalisation of various social media platforms, forums and websites. Along those lines, this deliverable aims to demonstrate a first version of the S&R website and its architecture. The domain of the S&R project will be the following: https://search-and-rescue.eu/

The project's webpage will be used as the cornerstone of the S&R online activities and therefore it shall be continuously updated and developed as the S&R project unfolds. More in detail, the S&R website will serve as a connecting point between the various social media platforms, as well as the main dissemination platform of the project's activities, findings and milestones.

All scientific contributions, workshops and even videos of the S&R pilots will be uploaded to the project's online site, in order to maximise the impact of the project. The ambition of the S&R website and the project's overall online presence is to reach out to key actors, stakeholders and organisations in the broader Emergency Management and Response community as effectively as possible. To this end, establishing a comprehensive, engaging and user-friendly website that distils S&R's vision and contributions will be of utmost importance.

Since the project's webpage is meant to act as the centre-stage of all other clustering communication and dissemination activities, it will be heavily influenced by the S&R brand strategy which defines S&R's overall positioning, values and benefits (T.9.1 & T9.3).

D9.4 will provide all necessary details of the website's structure, tools, contents and features. Last, this deliverable aims to depict the blueprints-screenshots of all its segments.

2 Project Website

2.1 Aim

The main aim of the S&R website is to establish a heavy online presence. Through this online presence, S&R aims to become a central reference point at European level, thus bridging as many relevant key actors, stakeholders and organisations as possible at a European and Global level. The online presence of S&R is developed by considering this objective as well. To achieve this, the S&R website is aimed to be as attractive and useful to its users as possible. The website's architecture and objectives are designed with the aim of providing both an information and service-based platform to its guests and users. To that end, besides all relevant information about the S&R project, the S&R website will also support online training videos and material that will be targeted towards citizens, first responders and experts.

2.2 Objectives

In accordance to the project's aims and ambitions, the latest web technologies will be utilized in order to construct a comprehensive S&R website, which will be later connected with the S&R YouTube channel, LinkedIn group, as well as all other social media platforms that the S&R consortium will operationalize (such as Facebook, Twitter). The possibility to also provide an online discussion forum for practitioners on the scientific and technical fields addressed by S&R will also be investigated in relation with the clustering activities (T9.3)ⁱ. In addition, one of the website's secondary objectives will be to measure its online presence using an external analytics software (e.g. Google Analyticsⁱⁱ) in order and track the traffic on the S&R website. A confidential report will be created and distributed internally to the consortium partner responsible for the project's communication and dissemination strategy which will indicate the number of visitors that each Website-page registers on a monthly basis, as well as other relevant data regarding the S&R online traffic and presence. This report will be indicative and help design and plan future modifications to the website.

2.3 Structure

As a Research Infrastructure (RI) project, S&R, requires a website which reflects its propensity and responsibility of dissemination. With this ambition in mind, the S&R website was launched in July 2020 and is hosted by Konnektable (KT - Partner 5).


The S&R domain has been developed using WordPress toolⁱⁱⁱ, which is an open source content management software ^{iv}. There is a top bar in which several sub-categories are enlisted. The category pages that can be found are the following:

- **Home page** Here the S&R logo will be portrayed, along with different sections showcasing the: project summary, latest News & events of the S&R, the project Partners, as well as a footer with several Social Media links and the S&R contact details.
- **About: Overview page** This page will provide a more in-depth overview of the S&R, its expected impact and the advisory Board
- About: Project Content Page This segment will depict The S&R Work Packages and Deliverables
- **About: Publications and Presentations page** This page will illustrate brochures, press releases and similar useful information

- Partners Page This page will depict the several partners and also feature a direct link to their website
- **News & Events** This part of the website will contain the latest news about the project as well as sub-categories that will provide information and active links regarding the past or upcoming S&R events, Workshops, and conferences.
- Video Library This page will have in-built active video links which shall demonstrate pilot cases, project presentations and information about the S&R project and its development and findings
- Social Media Here the website will showcase several highlights harnessed from the S&R social media groups and conferences, workshops, pilot cases etc., as well as active links towards every Social Media platform used by the S&R project for communication and dissemination purposes.
- **Contact** This link will provide the contact details (email addresses, phone numbers) of the respective S&R administrative teams.

2.3.1 Homepage

The homepage of the S&R project https://search-and-rescue.eu at first glance only indicates the Logo, contents, Title & Subtitle in order to allow the online viewer to orientate and navigate effectively (figure 1). The website's architecture was designed around the idea of providing a comprehensive interface, with direct and concise information which would allow for the efficient navigation of its users. As visitors scroll down the homepage, additional information is displayed (figure 2). The S&R news segment is meant to function as an info-snapshot portraying the most recent project updates, upcoming workshops, conferences or social media events. Further down the homepage illustrates the S&R partners with active links to their respective websites as well as a footer with the S&R Social Media links, subscribe buttons and the S&R contact details.



S&R Objectives

The S&R project will design, implement and test through a series of large scale pilot scenarios a highly interoperable, modular open architecture platform for first responders' capitalising on expertise and technological infrastructure from both COncORDE and IMPRESS FP7 projects. The governance model of S&R will be designed to operate more effectively and its architectural structure will allow to easily incorporate next generation R&D and COTS solutions which will be possibly adopted in the future disaster management systems. The Model will also support a unified vision of the EU role and will provide a common framework to assess needs and integrate responses. The framework will enable supportive approach using a wider range of decisional support features and monitoring systems and will also give to first responders an effective and unified vision of (a) the dynamic changes going on during event's lifetime and (b) the capabilities and resources currently deployed in the field




Figure 2-2 Structure of Home-page




Figure 2-3 About-page

2.3.3 About: Overview

The first part of the "Overview" page graphically depicts the project's full title, its duration, the Grant Agreement ID, the H2020 funding programme title along with the Funding scheme and EU contribution. In the same column the project coordinator will be illustrated with an active link to its official website and project contact-person. Besides this information, the main segment of the Overview-page is meant to provide a summary of the S&R project-rationale, expected impact and ambition (Figure 4).




Figure 2-4 About - Overview Subpage

2.3.4 About: Project Content-Subpage




Figure 2-5 About – Project Content Subpage




Figure 2-6 About – Publications and Presentations Subpage




Figure 2-7 Partners-page




Figure 2-8 News and events-page

2.3.8 Video Library

Clips produced during S&R pilots, conferences and workshops will regularly be posted in this part of the website (figure 9).




Figure 2-9 Video Library-page

2.3.9 Social Media

This part of the website will aim to showcase all the social media that the S&R project is using in order to promote its activities. The content will be disseminated across many groups and platforms in order to maximise the efficiency of the S&R online presence, as well to manage to connect and expand the network of engaged key actors, stakeholders and organisations from the Emergency management and response community. 


Figure 2-10 Social Media-page




Figure 2-11 YouTube Channel




Figure 2-12 Twitter Channel




Figure 2-13 Contact-page
