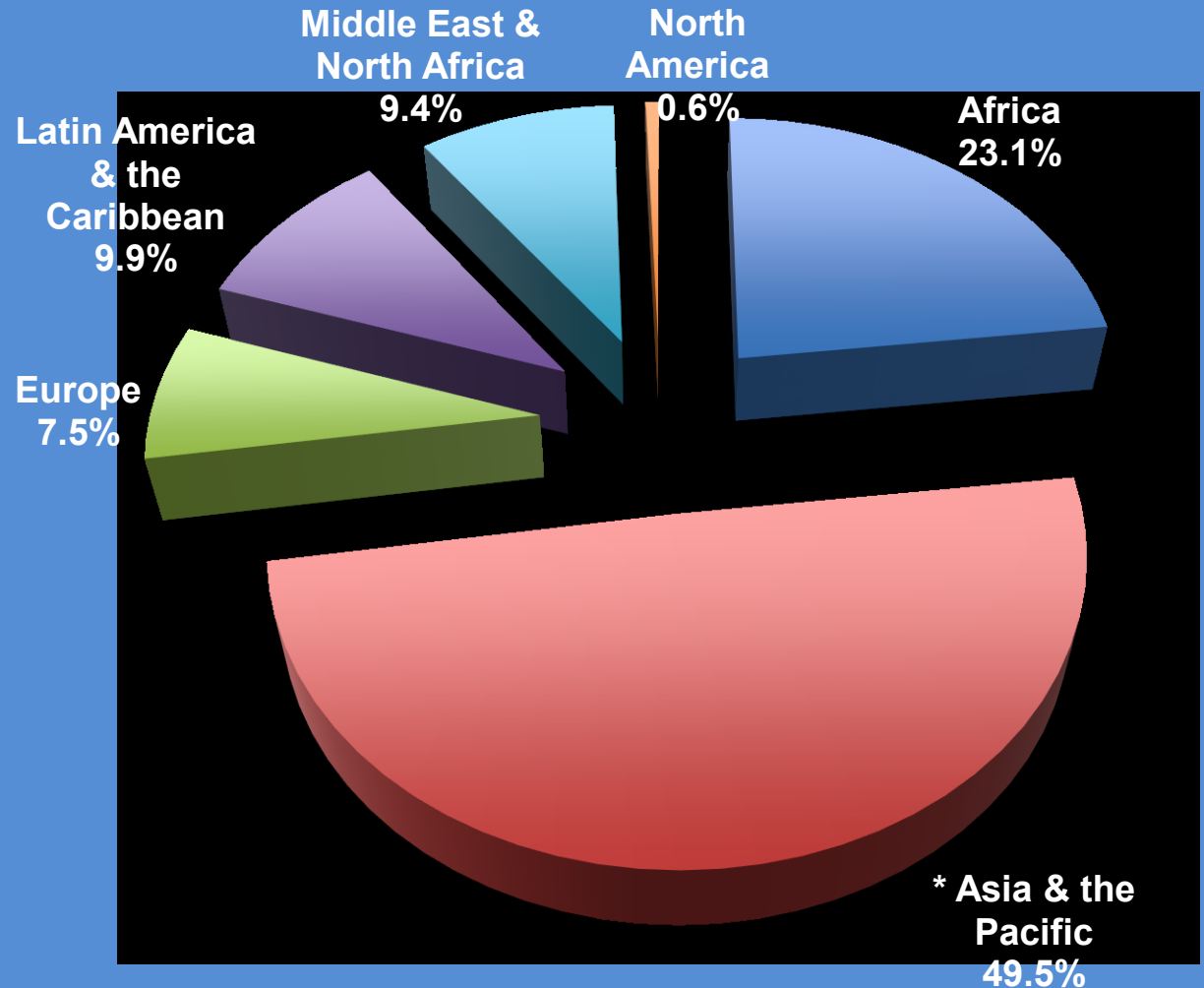

all programmes 1983-2015



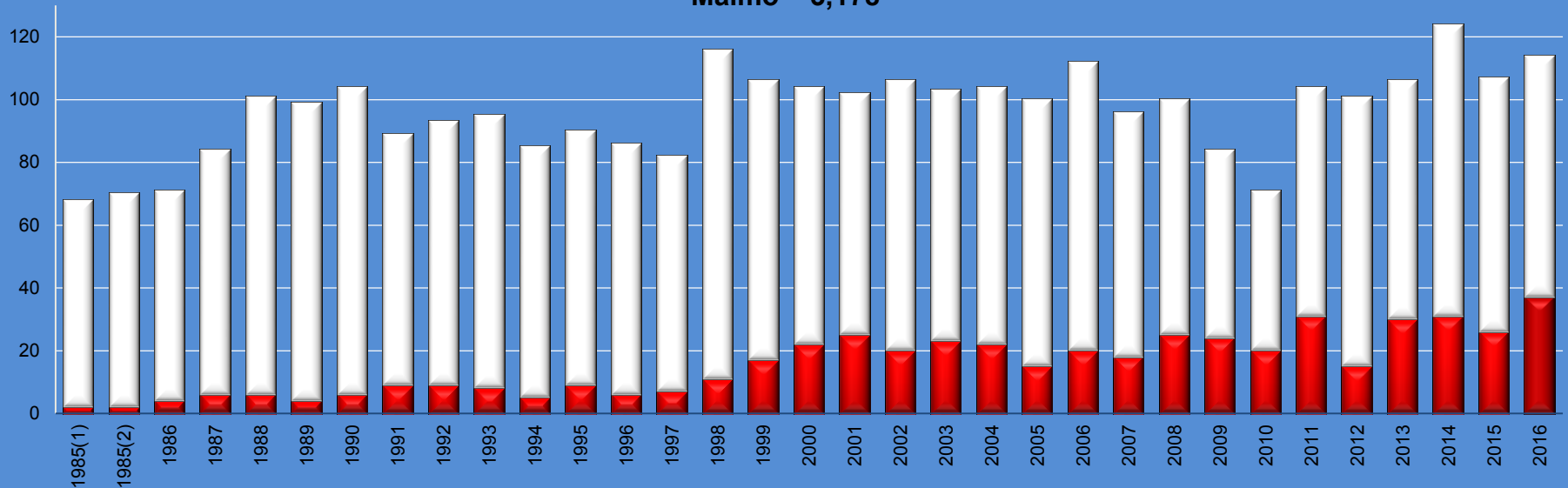

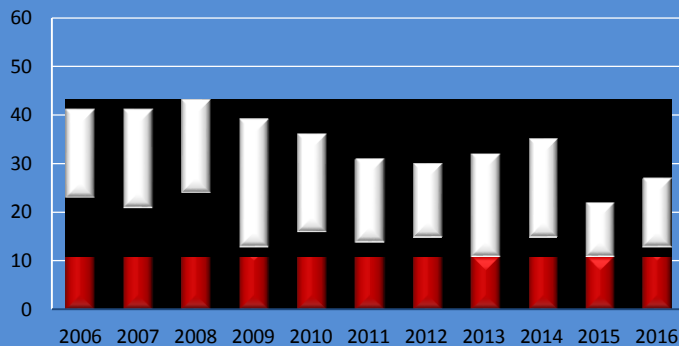
Graduates by Gender and Year

Malmö – 3,178*



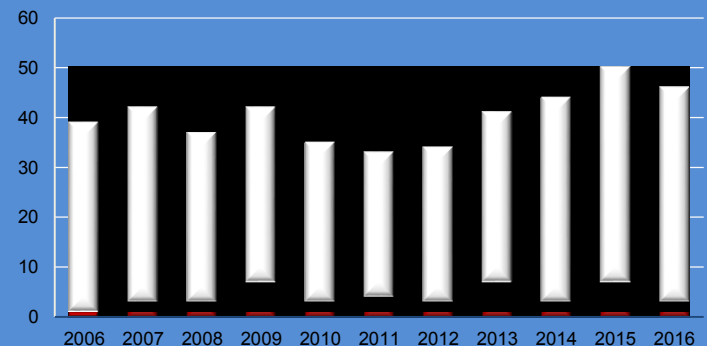
