






Introduction

At the end of 2020, there were almost 3.13 refugees and mIn asylum-seekers hosted in the EU Member States.

In 2020, 47.7% of firsttime applicants in the EU-27 were aged **18-34** (and further 31.0%) were minors ages less than 18 years).

79.5 MILLION forcibly displaced people worldwide at the end of 2019




Refugee Background Students in Higher Education

38.5% of young people access tertiary education (which includes higher education) opportunities globally, with a much higher rate of 71% enrolled in the EU countries (UNESCO, 2020).

Only 3% of refugees worldwide have access to higher education opportunities. (UNHCR, 2019)





Why higher education?

Individual and societal benefits including market and wider **benefits**

Benefits in the context of development should refugees be able to return to their country/ region of origin



Benefits of HE participation specific to refugees, their communities and host state societies


