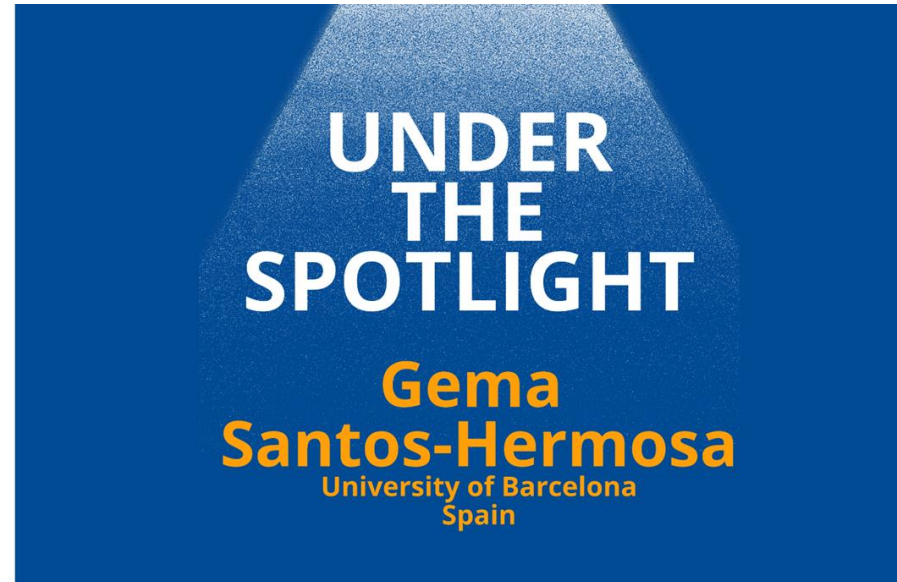


“ENOEL practitioners under the spotlight” webinar series

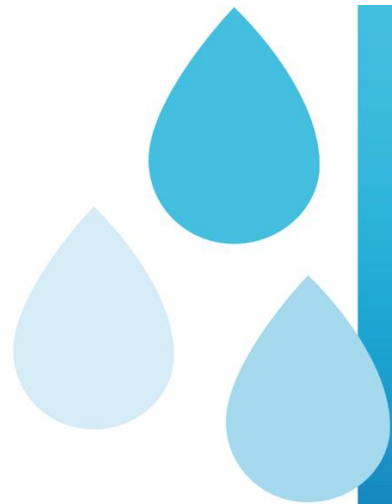

OE Benefits



Open Education Benefits

ENOEL members are creating tools (Twitter cards, slides, leaflets) and resources to be reused, adopted, adapted by the large audience (not only librarians) to advocate for open and to disseminate the UNESCO OER Recommendation.

Benefits of Open Education for students

- Ensure enduring access:** Students will be able to access resources even after they have completed their course.
- Support inclusion:** OER can be adapted to reflect students' profiles and scenarios, addressing inclusion needs at different levels.
- Promote diversification of learning:** OER are accessible from every place at any time, repeatedly (and don't underestimate the value of repetition!), and from a variety of devices and formats.
- Promote lifelong learning:** OER are available to everyone of all ages, anytime anyone wants to learn something or go back to something to refresh the memory of it.
- Save costs:** High price tags may lead students to use older versions of certain publications; with OER this is not an issue.

Licensing & copyright #2

An open license is essential for an educational resource to be "open". An open license on an educational resource tells other educators that the 5 Rs of open education are enabled: that the resource can be reused, retained, revised, remixed and redistributed (David Wiley's definition). These can be used in conjunction with principles of fair use or fair dealing according to international and national copyright standards and legal frameworks.
