

Licensing & copyright #2

An open license is essential for an educational resource to be 'open.' An open license on an educational resource table other education that the 5 Pis of open education are enabled: that the resource can be reused, retained, mented, rembed and redbirthuted (Devid Wilso's definition). These can be used in conjunction with principles of fair use or fair desling according to international and rediscust copyright standards and legal frameworks.
