Lessons Learned



- A static software management plan is not as good as a living one: start small and revise
- A good software management plan is not a goal in itself, but rather the key mechanism to knowledge sharing and reuse: ensure that all are involved
- A great software management plan extends and evolves with your goals and project: tie this in to your other processes and practices
