AD POTENS SUPERFALLACY COMPLEX

The Ad Potens fallacy is the error of the false blame of one's own or others power use, misuse, or non-use.

It is found to be the complex fallacy which composes and persists the psychological complex of guilt, blame, shame, anxiety, ptsd, grief and several other conditions.

It is comprised of the three fallacies of:

Ad Omnidecidiens - the false blame of one's own or others use of decision-making that led to harm or trauma to oneself, another or both.

Ad Omniscientia - the false blame of one's own or others' use or non-use of knowledge, information, or communication that led to harm of another or oneself or both.

Ad Omniacta - the false blame of ones own or others physical action, inaction, type of action or misaction ability that led to haem.or loss to another, onself, or both.

Resolving these fallacies with, or by the Reasoner using standard Aristotleian-embedded propositional truth logic resolves the symptoms of the associated condition.

There are embedded complexities of 'thinker-type' that have construct validity with the concepts of Regulatory Fit, and Locus of Control, and Neurochemohomeostasis.

A satisfactory therapeutic Logic Self-Therapy set providing sufficient therapeutic cover for both Thinker Types has minimum complexity 3.152E+116.
