THE CURRENT ROLE OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE ORGANIZATION IN THE EDUCATION SYSTEM OF UZBEKISTAN.

In the Republic of Uzbekistan, as in all spheres of society, many new reforms have been implemented in the field of education over the past 10 years. Among them is the growing demand for teaching foreign languages in the field of education, as well as the adoption of new decisions aimed at improving the science of foreign languages, the work carried out on the basis of decisions - all based on modern standards of the younger generation. , it was the most precious opportunity created for them to be educated. The role of language is invaluable in the prosperity of any nation as a nation, the need to organize foreign languages has risen to the level of politics. In 1981-1987, 72% of scientific works prepared at the Institute of History of the Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Uzbekistan were published in Russian, 20% in foreign languages and 8% in Uzbek. Today, it continues to improve and meet the requirements of the times. In addition, the unique works created by our great figures are still preserved in various countries around the world. In particular: Mirzo Ulugbek's "History of the Four Nations" in libraries of England, India, USA; Chalgani's Arithmetic of the Nine at Princeton University; The original of Al-Khwarizmi's Al-Jabr val mugabala is kept in the Oxford Library. In order to enjoy such masterpieces, it is necessary to organize a foreign language.

Taking into account the above issues, on the initiative of the first President of our country IA Karimov in 2012, teaching foreign languages on the basis of Resolution No. 1875PQ made a significant contribution to the introduction of new ideas and teaching methods in education. In particular, students have been taught

in schools since the 1st grade, 1 day a week of teacher exchange days has been organized as ICT-based training courses, computer technology and multimedia have been used to a high degree, various demonstration tools to give educational institutions a new enthusiasm for lessons on the state budget. as well as methodological assistance. Textbooks have been updated, various international competitions, science Olympiads, English proficiency tests (IELTS / CEFR / TESOL) have been organized. All this has strengthened the love for language in the minds and imaginations of young students, educators. Over time, the world has changed, people's worldviews have expanded, the educational potential of young people has increased, time has improved. As a result, the decision was amended.

On May 19, 2021, a new resolution of the 2nd President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Sh.M.MIRZIYOEV No. PP-5117 "On measures to bring the organization of foreign languages in the Republic of Uzbekistan to a qualitatively new level" was approved and entered into force. : "Introduction of an uninterrupted chain of education on the principle of" kindergarten-school-higher education institution-enterprise". Proof of this decision is the holding of online and offline Olympiads in foreign languages in our country, several competitions for foreign language teachers, the increaseto the extent that it can be published; the inclusion of foreign language exams in almost all areas of higher education, the granting of national and international benefits based on the criteria of foreign language proficiency, the publication of works expressing our national pride and pride not only in our native language but also in foreign languages a wide range of opportunities was created, such as demonstration.

In addition, knowledge testing programs such as PISA and PIRLS have become widespread at the school level. It is their extension that is also in English. Namely: PISA - Program for International Student Assessment is a worldwide study conducted by the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) in member and non-member countries. This is an international assessment program aimed at assessing the literacy of 15-year-old students in reading, mathematics and natural sciences. Therefore, on July 8, 2020, the OECD (Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development) held a rally to organize the PISA survey. Since then, trainings and tests on this program have been conducted in educational institutions of the country.

PIRLS - Progress in International Reading Literacy Study. The study, which aims to develop students' reading skills in scientific, historical, geographical, social and other forms of information texts, was also initially tested at Boston University in the United States and has conducted several studies to date. For example: Between 2001 and 2016, it was implemented among 4th graders from a total of 20 countries. Summarizing the results achieved, the PIRLS program website (pirls2016.org) was launched in 2016 to develop leak literacy at home or outside of school. For the first time in Uzbekistan, international participation in this research was launched in 2021.

Another world-class appraisal program is STEAM !!! This direction is at least a long-awaited and modern study, which, like the above, came from foreign education. S - science, T - technology, E - engineering, A - art, M - math (mathematics), based on the improvement of specific sciences and robotics new educational program. This year, seminars and trainings in this area have been organized in recent years, many branches of foreign universities have started operating in our country. Education at these universities is conducted in English and Russian. This is another striking example of both the emphasis on language and the development of education. Many of our young people have now been educated and are bringing knowledge to the universities I want to cite below. It is gratifying that over the next year, foreign students are coming to our country to study.
