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ANALYSIS OF VERBS OF THINKING IN ENGLISH

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Annotation

This article classifies the verbs of thinking in English according to their structuralsemantic, lexical, morphological features and the nature of the interrelationships of the parts. Based on the previously created classifications, the work classifies the verbs of thinking in terms of their structure, which shows only one aspect.

Introduction: The study of thinking verbs in English has its own history. In the second half of the XVII century, the first information appears in the works of K. Cooper. The leading scientist of this century, R. Lout, continues this theory. In the middle of the 19th century, the theory of thinking verbs began to take shape in English, and in the second half of the 19th century, thinking verbs were formed in English normative grammar and have remained unchanged to this day.

When we look at the problem of interpretation and classification of thinking verbs in English, we are convinced that the typical types of equal and subordinate clauses are widespread. English thinking verbs do not differ in content from thinking verbs used in other languages.

The simple rule that English thought verbs must have two bases (possessive and definite) is not always reflected in simple sentences. was shown to be possible.

Main part: This article describes English thinking verbs based on different points of view. The problem of its interpretation and classification has been approached from the point of view of English linguists as well as Western scholars. All of the above classifications (given in the grammars of different languages) are also based on simple sentences. So, although there are many classifications, they are similar. However, each language, especially those belonging to different families, has its own characteristics and cannot be assimilated.

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An analysis of the scientific work of English scholars on the subject of thinking verbs is given. The classifications are based on a mixture of different features of the compound sentence.
