PRODIGEES Fellowship: Visiting Researcher or Training/Learning Expert for the Managing Global Governance (MGG) Academy for 2-6 months between June and December 2022 in Bonn, Germany

In coordination with the EU Horizon 2020 MSCA-RISE project, *Promoting Research on Digitalisation in Emerging Powers and Europe towards Sustainable Development* (PRODIGEES), the German Development Institute / Deutsches Institut für Entwicklungspolitik (DIE) is making a call for applications to fill the role of a visiting researcher or training and learning expert to investigate digitalisation and training in the framework of the Managing Global Governance (MGG) Academy in Bonn, Germany.

Position details

The candidate is invited to investigate and/or conceptualise digitalisation and training in the framework of the MGG Academy in Bonn, Germany from an organiser's perspective. The MGG Academy is an annual training and dialogue format of the MGG programme. It brings together more than 20 professionals from government institutions, think tanks and research institutions, civil society and the private sector from China, Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, South Africa, as well as Germany/Europe. The main objective of the course is to support and prepare future change-makers for a professional and personal life dedicated to sustainable development at home and in the world. The four-month course (in person) blends academic modules, modules on leadership development and applied project work. The candidate is invited to join the team of the MGG Academy and to co-creatively (re-)conceptualise and implement the 2022 edition of the MGG Academy. She or he will gain first-hand insights from an organiser's perspective by engaging in research and training activities in line with her/his own interest and expertise, e.g. as a visiting researcher, facilitator, trainer, or similar. The candidate will benefit from the integration into the international working environment, including the use of online tools and DIE's occupational and cultural norms. The fellowship is attractive for those with interest and expertise in cutting-edge education-training and methodologies, intercultural communication and transnational cooperation towards sustainable development.

The candidate does not need to already be listed as a seconding staff member of the PRODIGEES project. By achieving the fellowship, the candidate will automatically be incepted into the PRODIGEES project and will inherit the benefits and responsibilities therein.

PRODIGEES is funded by the European Commission's Horizon 2020 Marie Skłodowska-Curie Research and Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE) and is co-coordinated between the German Development Institute / Deutsches Institut für Entwicklungspolitik (DIE) in Bonn, Germany and Instituto Mora in Mexico City, Mexico. Eligibility criteria

Eligible candidates are affiliated to one of the following PRODIGEES partner institutions:

- Fundação Getúlio Vargas (FGV), Brazil
- Instituto Mora (MORA), Mexico
- Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), India

A qualified candidate must...

- be a research staff member with a legal link to the sending organisation (e.g. employee with a contract, consultant with a contract, enrolled in a PhD, etc.),
- be actively engaged in or linked to R&I activities at the sending institute for at least
 - 1 month prior to the beginning of the fellowship if working full-time with the sending institute, or
 - o 2 months prior to the beginning of the fellowship if working part-time with the sending institute,
- be able and willing to work full-time (100%) on the fellowship for its duration,
- have research interests in topics of education, training and *digitalisation*.

- Project reporting responsibilities
- Sharing results with both DIE and also the candidate's home institute and networks.
