


Context: a sketch of the expanding grid of research data services at UTS









- Adapting Omeka 2 to support cross-disciplinary research data collections. Eg:
 - Dharmae Data hub of Australian Research on Marine and Acquatic Ecocultures (NOTE, this is still not in its released form)
 - From Farms to Freeways (NOTE: not using Ozmeka code but this is the kind of collection we want to support).
