Discover the EMM Survey Registry!

The tool that helps you find and learn about quantitative surveys on the integration and inclusion of Ethnic and Migrant Minorities (EMM)



The **EMM Survey Registry** is a **free online tool** available to anyone interested in doing research or policy-related work using quantitative surveys on EMMs' integration and inclusion.

The tool **helps you to discover and learn about existing quantitative surveys undertaken with EMM (sub)populations** in Europe and beyond. This tool not only brings together previously scattered information about these surveys but also offers detailed and structured metadata for each of the surveys.

The EMM Survey Registry is currently live and available in version 1.0. This version is fully operational and displays **metadata for nearly 1700 surveys from 34 different countries**. The tool has already welcomed **300-400 unique users each month** from all over the globe and from different disciplines, sectors, industries, etc.

As a 'live' and constantly updated tool, we encourage all survey producers to contribute their own metadata (for free, but with quality supervision) to help expand the metadata collection of the EMM Survey Registry, as well as share their research with an international audience.

The tool has been co-created by <u>COST Action 16111 -</u> <u>ETHMIGSURVEYDATA</u>, the <u>H2020 SSHOC project</u>, and the ANR project <u>FAIRETHMIGQUANT</u>.

Creating a COVID-19 collection: contribute to the EMM Survey Registry

Since the start of the pandemic in 2020, **a growing number** of COVID-19 surveys have been conducted with EMM respondents all across the world, either targeting these minorities as the main focus of the survey or within general population surveys with boost samples.

As these surveys can provide meaningful insights about the COVID-19 experience for EMMs, **the EMM Survey Registry is curating a special COVID-19 collection**.

Call to action

Are you a data producer who is currently developing or has already completed a COVID-19 survey that includes EMM respondents? If you have a sample of at least 250 individuals, you can contribute the metadata about your survey directly to the EMM Survey Registry and make them more findable & accessible. This is how:

 - Body: please provide the name of your survey as well as some general information about your survey (country and locations where conducted, sample sizes, which minorities included, timing, etc.).

2 Fill out this <u>application form</u> to request an account that will grant you access to an online form for contributing metadata.

3Once both of these steps have been completed, the administrators of the EMM Survey Registry will be in touch via email to discuss the next steps.

Please note that you will not be asked to add any micro-data or survey findings to the EMM Survey Registry. You will only share information about the technical characteristics of the survey, and if you have already made the data available in a repository or archive you will be able to provide links to those or to any publications you wish to share with other researchers.
