**Abstract:**

This deliverable explores occupational ontologies in the 20<sup>th</sup> century by building and testing an ontology of occupational titles in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century for the Netherlands, by building four multilingual databases reflecting four classifications in the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, and by developing a use case, namely the coding of occupational titles in the life histories of respondents in the SHARE survey.

## Executive Summary

Task 3.2 *Selected SSH Ontologies and Vocabularies* in SSHOC Work package 3 *Lifting Technologies and Services into the SSH Cloud* aimed to foster the use of selected global ontologies in the social sciences and humanities, regarding occupational titles, educational categories, sectors of industry, geographical regions, food items, and religions. These ontologies service the usage of vocabularies for classifying text corpora and predefined response categories to facilitate self-identification in survey questions. Deliverable D3.10 *A 20th century version of the occupation multilingual ontology* focuses on occupational ontologies in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. As a database for self-selection of occupational titles in any labour market can easily include thousands of titles, it should allow for filtering in case the survey question addresses parental or previous occupational titles which might be in existence for the relevant decades but are no longer so in current times.

In Section 2 two approaches were applied to build an ontology for the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century occupations. First, the occupational titles found in the documents of the 1909, 1920, and 1930 Censuses in the Netherlands were merged, leading to the conclusion that these lists most likely did not provide a full overview of all titles present in those years. This resulted in a list of 1,071 occupational titles which mostly did not overlap in the three years. Second, the newspaper archive Delpher in the Netherlands was explored whether it could be used to indicate in which decades the occupational titles were reflected in the Newspapers. A list of 26 titles existing only in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century were matched with the texts. For almost half of these occupations 80% of the matches indeed were found in the years between 1900-1940, indicating that the archive is a useable tool to indicate in which decades the occupations were present in the Dutch labour market, but for more than half the titles the matches were below 80%.

In Section 3 the international ISCO classifications for 1958, 1986, 1988, and 2008 were used for the ontology reflecting a multilingual occupational ontology for the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The available translations of the ISCO 1958, 1968, 1988, 2008 coding indexes were merged. ISCO 1958 and 1968 were available at 5-digit level and in the languages English, French, and Spanish. ISCO 1988 is available at 4-digit level and in the languages English, French, Spanish, and German. ISCO 2008 is available at 4-digit level and in 51 languages plus for another 2 languages not all entries have translations. The file *ISCO58\_68\_88\_08\_4\_5dgt\_en\_fr\_es\_many\_20190916.xlsx* is downloadable<sup>1</sup>.

In Section 4 the occupational titles throughout respondents' entire working careers were coded in the Survey of Health, Ageing and Retirement in Europe (SHARE) waves. A so-called job-coder was used to classify the respondents' current or past jobs as well as their parents' jobs in the ISCO-08 classification directly at the time of the interview. The job-coder was developed by SSHOC partner SHARE/CENTERDATA

based on the occupation database in [surveycodings](#). SSHOC partner SHARE/UNIVE recovered the job codification for the retrospective careers and parents' occupations. The effort allowed to observe that the distribution over occupations changed gradually, moving from those with low and medium-low level of qualification towards the more qualified ones over the years 1970, 1980, 1990 and 2000.

# 1. Introduction

Task 3.2 in SSHOC Work package 3 aimed to foster the use of selected global ontologies in the social sciences and humanities, regarding occupational titles, educational categories, sectors of industry, geographical regions, food items, and religions. These ontologies allow to classify elements into standard global classifications, for example the ISCO classification of occupations and its derived social status or the NACE/ISIC classification of industries. These ontologies service the usage of vocabularies for classifying text corpora and predefined response categories for survey questions.

As part of Task 3.2, this Deliverable D3.10 focuses on occupational titles, specifically on occupational ontologies in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. In most surveys the question 'What is/was your first occupation' addresses the occupation of the respondent. In case respondents are retired, the occupational titles can refer to the mid-1900s. In some surveys, the question is asked 'What is/was the occupation of your father' or 'What is/was the occupation of your mother'. The parental occupational title can even refer to the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century in case this data was collected in a survey which was held in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. This underpins the need for the development of 20<sup>th</sup> century occupational ontologies.

Surveys apply two methods to collect an answer to the question about occupational titles, namely an open text box with expensive and time-consuming office coding or respondent's selection from a list of occupational titles provided by the survey holder. The latter method is predominantly used in web surveys, but increasingly also in face-to-face interviews when interviewers use a laptop, tablet, or smartphone. The technology in these surveys allows for text string matching when respondents or interviewers start typing an occupational title and then select the applicable title. As any labour market can easily include thousands of occupational titles the database for self-selection should be large. When aiming to collect information about parental occupations, the list of occupational titles will include other titles than a list of current titles. For example, the occupation *lamplighter* makes sense for occupations relevant in the first half in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, but not for those in the second half of that century or in the 21st century. In contrast, the occupation *fact checker* did not exist before the 2000s and therefore should not be included in a list of occupations relevant for the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Hence, one unqualified list of occupations for these different survey questions is therefore not efficient. The list should allow for filtering titles that existed in the decades relevant for the survey question.

Substantial efforts have been undertaken to prepare a multilingual ontology of current occupations for the survey question 'What is your occupation', see the ontology at the website <https://www.surveycodings.org/articles/codings/occupation>. In comparison, the efforts related to parental occupations have been minor. For this reason, this task in SSHOC focused on the improvement, optimization and merging of partially existing multilingual ontologies for 20<sup>th</sup> century occupations and aims to develop use cases. Therefore, D3.10 is called "A 20th century version of the occupation multilingual ontology".

The aim of D3.10 was threefold. First, to collect a list of occupations relevant for one or more decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Second, to indicate during which specific 20<sup>th</sup> century decades the occupations were present in the labour force. A third aim was to develop a multilingual database of occupational titles for the 20<sup>th</sup> century. For the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century the aim of a multilingual database of occupational titles was feasible, but for the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century the listing of occupational titles could solely address Dutch occupational titles in the Netherlands. Hence, this Deliverable falls apart into three sections. Section 2 explores Dutch occupational titles in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century in the Netherlands. These titles are not coded, because before World War II most National Statistical Offices had not yet developed a consistent classification. Section 3 explores the occupational classification for the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and does so using a multilingual approach. After World War II the International Labour Organization (ILO) developed the International Standard Classification of Occupations. Section 4 presents a use case for which the occupational titles throughout respondents' entire working careers, collected in the life histories in the SHARE survey waves, were coded. The results support the importance of the availability of detailed information on occupation when analysing the changes in the labour market over time.

## 2. Occupational classifications - first half 20<sup>th</sup> century

In the second half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century a few countries started to include a question about occupation in their Census surveys. The 1851 Census in the United Kingdom allowed William Farr, a governmental statistician, to use the Census data to classify people by occupation and age.<sup>2</sup> In 1871 British officials required their standard list of jobs be used in India's Census, highlighting cultural differences as Census takers struggled to classify occupations as "jokers and story-tellers, hail averters, prayer mutterers."<sup>3</sup>

The 1889 Census in the Netherlands asked for occupation, but the occupational titles were not included in the Census report, most likely because it was difficult to cope with the large variety of answers provided. Since the 1899 Census, the occupations were reported by Statistics Netherlands<sup>4</sup>, but it was not until after World War II that Statistics Netherlands developed a consistent national coding system for occupational titles (CBS 1984, 1993, 2001). For the ontology of the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Deliverable D3.10 solely focuses on the Netherlands, as Dutch is the native language of the first author and translations of the Dutch occupational titles are not available. Please note that literal translations of occupational titles may result in titles that are not understood in the targeted language, requiring labour market experts to provide translations rather than translators. Therefore, translating titles from the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century was an endeavour beyond task T3.2 in the SSHOC project.

Two approaches were applied to build an ontology for the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century occupations. First, documents from the Censuses in the Netherlands were used. Second, the newspaper archive Delpher was used to explore to what extent this archive could be used to indicate in which decades the occupational titles from the Censuses were present in the labour market in the Netherlands.

### Census data

To develop the ontology of occupations in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, documents related to the Censuses in 1909, 1920 and 1930 in the Netherlands were collected. The lists of occupational titles were extracted from the Census documents for the inventory of the labour force in these years.<sup>5</sup> For these

years Statistics Netherlands had converted the Census booklets into PDF documents. These PDF files were converted into excel files and cleaned for errors arising from this conversion. For example, the character 'n' can mistakenly be converted to the character 'r'. Next, the three lists were merged into one ontology, thereby indicating which occupational title was present in which Census years.

The merged table resulted in 1,071 occupational titles (see the Appendix). The Appendix shows that in the 1909 Census 328 occupational titles were used, whereas in 1920 this was 713 and in 1930 it was 548. More than half of the 1,071 titles were only found in one of the three Census decades (621 titles), more than one third was present twice (388) and only one twentieth was used three times (62). Although the Census covers the full population and hence a listing of all occupational titles in the population could be expected, Table 1 reveals that the 1,071 occupational titles do not cover the full population. The Census reveals that part of the labour force was not assigned an occupational title, but it was only indicated in which industry they worked. A title only present in 1920 therefore does not indicate that the occupation did not exist in 1909 and in 1930, but rather that it was not registered properly in those years. That is also suggested by the fact that 7 titles were included in the 1909 and in the 1930 Census, but not in the Census in between, in 1920. It is hard to imagine that the occupational title disappeared from the labour force in that year, but rather it is likely that it was not measured properly. In conclusion, the Census data allows to generate a list of occupational titles that only partially cover the full labour force.


## Newspaper archive

Our initial plan, as outlined back in 2018 in the SSHOC proposal, was to indicate which occupational titles were present in which decade of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The initial plan was to do so by collecting information from newspapers and other documents indicating how frequent occupational titles were used in which decade. However, this is only possible when a full list of the occupational titles would have been available, but such a list does not exist. So, the plan was changed into collecting titles from the Census.

To test whether these occupational titles existed in any decade in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the website Delpher was used<sup>6</sup>. Delpher archives millions of digitized texts from Dutch newspapers, books, and magazines, and are hosted by many scientific institutions, libraries, and heritage institutions. The texts can be searched in detail. Matches in Delpher should indicate in which decades this title was most commonly present in the Netherlands labour market. The search was limited to the Newspaper collection, published in the Netherlands between 1/1/1900 to 31/12/1999.

For the search in Delpher, the list of occupational titles collected from the Census data was used, as outlined in the previous section, and shown in the Appendix. 26 titles were selected for which, based on our knowledge of the Dutch labour market, it could be assumed that these titles were existing occupations in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, but no longer existed in the second half. Therefore, matches in Delpher were expected in decades in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, but not in decades in the second half. Graph 1 shows in detail in which decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century the occupational titles were matched. The blue and red bars reveal the percentage of matches in 1900-1920 respectively 1920-1940, indicating that these occupational titles were mentioned in news items as well as in other texts. The pink, orange and grey bars reflect the matches in the years after 1940, indicating that the 'outdated' occupational titles were still present in these texts, for example in books, obituaries, or stories covering previous decades.



To provide a clearer picture to what extent texts in the Delpher newspaper archive match the 26 occupational titles that existed before 1940, Graph 2 reflects the overall percentage of matches in the years between 1900-1940. The Graph shows that for 10 of the 26 titles more than 80% of the matches were found between 1900-1940, for another 8 titles between 60-80% of the matches were, and the remaining 8 in less than 60% of the matches. Additional filtering to refine the matches was not possible.

The overall conclusions that the Delpher newspaper archive is a great resource, but not particularly suited to exactly identify in which decades an occupational title existed in the Dutch labour market.

### 3. Occupational classifications second half 20<sup>th</sup> century

#### International occupational classifications

Given the almost unlimited number of job titles, the responses to the survey question *What is your job title?* need to be coded into a limited set of aggregated occupational titles, i.e., an occupational classification system. For this purpose, the statistical agencies of 150 countries associated with the International Labour Organization (ILO) in Geneva, a United Nations affiliate, have adopted the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) to harmonize the measurement of occupations across countries. ISCO is maintained by the ILO (ILO, 2012). The ILO has a long-term record in contributing to the discussions about multi-country occupational measurement (see Hoffmann et al, 1995, with references to ILO publications in the 1970s and 1980s).

ISCO dates to 1958 with revisions in 1968, 1988, and 2008.<sup>7</sup> In 1958, the ILO developed first ISCO classification to harmonize the measurement of occupations across countries (ILO, 1958). Revisions were published in 1968, 1988, and 2008 (Budlender 2002, ILO 1969, for details ISCO website<sup>8</sup>). In the 1990s, the ILO undertook efforts to implement ISCO-88 in many countries (Hoffmann et al 1995). Today, ISCO has become the standard classification in many countries for their Labour Force Surveys or Censuses (Greenwood 2004). However, countries such as the United States, Austria, United Kingdom, Germany, France, and the Netherlands, continued to use their own National Occupational Classifications (NOC). These classifications tend to differ cross-nationally with respect to the level of detail, the specific occupational titles included in the classifications, and their logic (Ganzeboom and Treiman, 1996). Attempts to harmonize NOCs were, among others, hampered by the fact that ISCO does not allow skill levels of occupations to vary across different national contexts (Elias 1997). In the 2010s most National Statistical Offices (NSOs) worldwide have adopted the ISCO-08 classification and have prepared classification schemes, sometimes next to an existing national system, sometimes as the only classification system. Today, ISCO has become the standard classification in many countries for their Labour Force Surveys or Censuses.

ISCO-08, as was the case for its predecessors, defines a job as a set of work tasks and duties performed by one person. Jobs with the same set of main tasks and duties are aggregated into so-called 4-digit occupation units. ISCO is a hierarchical classification. At the classification's lowest 4-digit level ISCO-08 distinguishes 433 occupations, aggregating these into 3-digit, 2-digit and finally 1-digit level consisting of nine major groups plus a group of armed forces at the highest level (ILO, 2012). As was the case for its

predecessors, in ISCO-08 a job is defined as a set of work tasks and duties performed by one person. Coding indexes classify jobs with the same set of main tasks and duties into one 4-digit occupation unit. Based on the same concept of similarity in the tasks and duties performed, the units are grouped into 3- and 2-digit groups, which in turn are grouped into 1-digit groups based on the skill level. ISCO distinguishes four skill levels, notably unskilled, semi-skilled, skilled, and highly skilled, which are related to ISCED, the International Standard Classification of Education.

Long lists of occupational titles, the so-called 5-digit titles, have been classified into the 4-digit units. For example, the detailed 5-digit occupational title "Database architect" is classified into the 4-digit occupational unit 2521 "Database Designers and Administrators", that in turn is classified into the 3-digit group 252 "Database and Network Professionals", that in turn is classified into the 2-digit group 25 "Information and communications technology professionals", that finally is classified into the 1-digit major group 2 "Professionals".

Unfortunately, when answering the question 'What is your job title?', survey respondents are rarely familiar with the ISCO-08 classification and are therefore unable to provide the interviewer with a job title that directly matches a 4-digit occupation unit. Most survey respondents will provide a job title that is far more fine-grained, usually referred to as the 5-digit classification; these are occupational titles which are aggregated beyond the job titles in the organisational context. Table 2 presents logic, details, and stylized numbers in this hierarchy. Even when the occupational measurement is at 5-digit level, due to the risk of identification of single respondents most survey data is released with 1-, 2- or at best 3-digit codes and rarely at 4-digit codes.

## 4. Multilingual Occupation databases for ISCO-58, ISCO-68, ISCO-88 and ISCO-08 classifications

The [SurveyCodings.org](#) website and repository hosts a broad collection of classified and translated items that often are asked in surveys (see for details Martens and Tijdens, 2021). These sets are developed, collected, and archived by experts. If different studies would use the same sets, it would be easier to compare them. The sets currently exist for Occupational titles, Industry, Educational attainment, Education, Religion, Food items, Regions, and Cities. All items are translated and classified according to international standards and stored in an online database. The database called *ISCO58\_68\_88\_08\_4\_5dgt\_en\_fr\_es\_many\_20190916.xlsx* is downloadable<sup>9</sup>. In addition, tools to integrate these items in one's own survey, as well as best practice examples, are available on the website. The extended and improved ontologies will be made available via SSH Open Marketplace and the SSHOC vocabulary platform. Partner SHARE/Centerdata will be offering the ontologies in XSKOS format. For more information see the Surveycodings website. The funders of the occupation database are acknowledged.<sup>10</sup>

For this Deliverable the available translations of the ISCO 1958 coding indexes were merged, and so were the ISCO 1968, 1988, 2008 coding indexes. ISCO 1958 and 1968 are available at 5-digit level and in the languages English, French, and Spanish. ISCO 1988 is available at 4-digit level and in the languages English, French, Spanish, and German. ISCO 2008 is available at 4-digit level and in 51 languages plus for another 2 languages not all entries have translations. The files can be downloaded<sup>11</sup>.

## 5. Use case: coding occupational titles

The Survey of Health, Ageing and Retirement in Europe (SHARE), a partner in SSHOC, is a research infrastructure for studying the effects of health, social, economic, and environmental policies over the life-course of European citizens and beyond. From 2004 until today, 530,000 in-depth interviews with 140,000 people aged 50 or older from 28 European countries and Israel have been conducted. In wave 3 (2008-2009, with almost 30,000 men and women across 13 European countries) and wave 7 (2017, with more than 62,000 respondents who had not participated in Wave 3) of SHARE, so-called SHARELIFE, the survey collected detailed retrospective information on all the relevant aspects of participants' lives including respondents' occupations throughout their entire working careers. Respondents reported the occupation title, industry, and start and end date for each job spell over their life-course. In wave 7, due to the implementation of a new instrument in the CAPI questionnaire, the so-called job-coder, this information was coded using the ISCO-08 classification directly at the time of the interview, making it usable already at the first data public release. The job-coder was developed by SSHOC partner SHARE/CENTERDATA based on the occupation database in surveycodings and was first implemented in the SHARE survey starting with wave 6 (2015), when it was used to code the job titles of the respondents' parents as well as the current or past jobs of the survey participants in the refreshment sample.

In wave 3 such a software had not been yet available with the consequence that the detailed information collected by means of the job title/description strings had not been classified/coded, and hence not usable by researchers. The same happened with the information on occupation for the respondents' parents, which was continuously collected as string occupation title from wave 2 (2006) to wave 5 (2013) for all the new participants to the survey (the refreshment sample). The partner SHARE/UNIVE in Venice took on and performed the major effort of recovering the job codification for the information on occupation of the SHARE respondents for the retrospective careers and for the parents' occupations for most of the participant countries.

The work was performed in two steps. In the first step part of the codifications were recovered based on the matching of the job strings to be coded with the corresponding codification attached to the open string answers from wave 6, wave 7 (coded by means of the Job-coder) and from wave 1 (coded ex-post). To be as accurate as possible first all the possible matching were performed separately by gender, for the parents' occupations, and separately by sector, for the respondents' retrospective jobs. This allows us to consider the variation in the occupation (ISCO-08 unit group) for men and women and capture to some extent the gender specific occupations, as well as to code differently (and consequently more accurately) the situations when the strings are rather generic, based on the industry to which the occupations are associated.

Recovering occupation codification in this way poses two issues. On the one hand, more than one possible codification may exist for the same string, especially when these are rather generic, such as for example "clerk". On the other hand, for those occupations for which no match was found by using wave

6 or 7 had to be matched by using the information from wave 1, the codification coming from wave 1 was done by using the ISCO-88 classification. The approach to solve the first issue was to choose from the list of the possible fitted codifications the one that was the most frequent among the SHARE respondents. For fixing the second problem, that is, having recovered an ISCO-88 codification, the researchers at UNIVE are converting these situations into their corresponding ISCO-08 unit groups.

In the second step, the large number of remaining occupation strings had to be coded one by one. This thorough operation was done separately by country and language.

In order to do this, the researchers made use of two main instruments: (i) the job-coder instruments from the SHARE wave 8 CAPI, and (ii) the free online version of the Cascot coding tool<sup>12</sup>. The second one was used to complement the first software in the situations in which the job-coder could not provide a solution. Both these instruments allowed the researchers to code the occupation titles at four digits level according to the ISCO-08 classification of occupations. These coding efforts aim to obtain a complete picture of the occupational careers for the entire SHARE sample.


The researchers at UNIVE managed to complete the occupation coding for the respondents' retrospective careers and for the respondents' parents<sup>13</sup>. The information on respondents' occupations over the life-course will open the SHARE data to new research possibilities in many areas, among which the economic and methodological one. The researchers will be able understand and follow the evolution of occupations over time within the same cohorts and to compare them among different cohorts. Such information will allow for better insights into the differences in the labour market composition over time across countries and between genders, permitting the analysis of new cause-effect relationships.

The following descriptives give an idea on how occupations evolved over time and on the heterogeneity that researchers can capture by using the detailed codification that will be made available in the future for the SHARE dataset. For example, Graph 3 describes the distribution of occupation by submajor in the SHARE sample for four years. It can be observed that the distribution of the occupation changed gradually through years, moving from those with low and medium-low level of qualification towards the more qualified ones.



Graph 4 describes the differences in occupations between two SHARE countries, namely Sweden versus Italy. The picture shows large differences in the distribution of occupations by submajor, with Sweden displaying significantly larger percentages of individuals employed in more qualified occupations (from 11 to 54).




If disaggregated and making the same comparison between countries separately by gender (see Graphs 5 and 6), it can be noted that the difference is much larger for women than for men.





The availability of such a detailed occupation coding will also allow for interesting analysis among cohorts. Graphs 7 and 8 describe the variation in occupations between two 10-years cohorts of respondents in Sweden and Italy.


**GRAPH 8 DISTRIBUTION OF OCCUPATION BY SUBMAJOR BY COHORT, ITALY**

It is important to note that, besides the large variations observed with respect to the occupation distribution at ISCO-08 2-digit level, important variations can also appear within the same submajor, that is, at finer levels of details, and this gives the codification work done by UNIVE even more importance.

Graph 9 describes the distribution of the most frequent ISCO-08 3-digit occupations for two of the years covered by the retrospective data collected in SHARELIFE: namely, 1970 and 2000. It was noted that, over time, while at 2-digit level variations between years could be seen but the representativity was still significant almost for every submajor (see Graph 3), at 3-digit level, some of the groups rather representative in 1970 were empty in 2000. This supports the importance of the availability of detailed information on occupation when analysing the changes in the labour market over time.

The coded occupations for both the retrospective working careers and the respondents' parents' occupations will be available in a future release of the SHARE data.

## 6. Conclusion

Task 3.2 in SSHOC Work package 3 aimed to foster the use of selected global ontologies in the social sciences and humanities, regarding occupational titles, educational categories, sectors of industry, geographical regions, food items, and religions. These ontologies service the usage of vocabularies for classifying text corpora and predefined response categories to facilitate self-identification in survey questions. Deliverable D3.10 focuses on occupational ontologies in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. As any labour market can easily include thousands of titles, the occupational database for self-selection should facilitate filtering. Specifically for survey questions addressing parental or previous occupations, the database should allow for filtering titles that existed in the decades relevant for the survey question.

In Section 2 two approaches were applied to build an ontology for the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century occupations. First, the occupational titles found in the documents from the 1909, 1920, and 1930 Censuses in the Netherlands were merged, leading to the conclusion that these lists most likely did not provide a full overview of all titles present in those years. This resulted in a list of 1,071 occupational titles which mostly did not overlap in the three years. Second, the newspaper archive Delpher in the Netherlands was used to explore whether it could be used to indicate in which decades the occupational titles were reflected in the Newspapers. A list of 26 titles existing only in the first half of the century were matched with the texts. For almost half of these occupations 80% of the matches indeed were found in the years between 1900-1940, indicating that the archive is a useable tool to indicate in which decades the occupations were present in the Dutch labour market. However for more than half the titles the matches were below 80. In conclusion, further research is needed to build an occupational ontology covering a large number of occupational titles for the Netherlands. When aiming for a multilingual ontology, definitely more research has to be undertaken.

In Section 3 the international ISCO classifications for 1958, 1986, 1988, and 2008 were used for constructing a multilingual occupational ontology for the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The available translations of the ISCO 1958, 1968, 1988, and 2008 coding indexes were merged. ISCO 1958 and 1968 were available at 5-digit level and in the languages English, French, and Spanish. ISCO 1988 is available at 4-digit level and in the languages English, French, Spanish, and German. ISCO 2008 is available at 4-digit level and in 51 languages. For another two languages translations were available for only part of the titles. The files can be downloaded from <https://www.surveycodings.org/articles/codings/occupation>. In conclusion, this multilingual ontology is available for self-identification in surveys.

In Section 4 the occupational titles throughout respondents' entire working careers were coded. These titles were collected in 530,000 in-depth interviews with 140,000 people aged 50 or older from 28 European countries and Israel in the seven Survey of Health, Ageing and Retirement in Europe (SHARE) waves. SHARE is a Partner in SSHOC. In waves 6 and 7, a so-called job-coder was implemented and used to classify the respondents' parents as well as respondents' current or past jobs in the ISCO-08 classification directly at the time of the interview. The job-coder was developed by SSHOC partner

SHARE/CENTERDATA based on the occupation database in [surveycodings](#). SSHOC partner SHARE/UNIVE in Venice performed the major effort of recovering the job codification for the retrospective careers and for the parents' occupations for most of the participant countries in previous waves. The effort allowed to observe that the distribution across occupations changed gradually through years, moving from those with low and medium-low level of qualification towards the more qualified ones over the years 1970, 1980, 1990 and 2000. A comparison between Sweden and Italy shows large differences in the distribution of occupations by submajor, with Sweden displaying significantly larger percentages of individuals involved in more qualified occupations. When disaggregated by gender, the difference is much larger for women than for men. The distribution of the most frequent ISCO-08 3-digit occupations for 1970 and 2000 reveals that some of the groups rather representative in 1970 were empty in 2000. This supports the importance of the availability of detailed information on occupation when analysing the changes in the labour market over time.
