

Work so far...

Upskilling through Open Knowledge Activities

- 4 Open Knowledge Activities (OKAs) with 5 LIBER participant libraries, and with the support of the LIBER Working Groups
- Aimed at co-creating and debating on open science concepts, thus upskilling the participants in open and citizen science.

Co-creating a shared vision with key stakeholders

- 2 vision-building workshops leading to the report: <u>Co-creating a</u>

 <u>Shared Vision for Citizen Science in Higher Education: Pitfalls and Recommendations.</u>
- This laid the basis for a further workshop with research library staff to create a <u>Roadmap for Capacity Building on OS and CS for HEI</u> <u>Library Staff</u>


Report on Stakeholder Consultation
