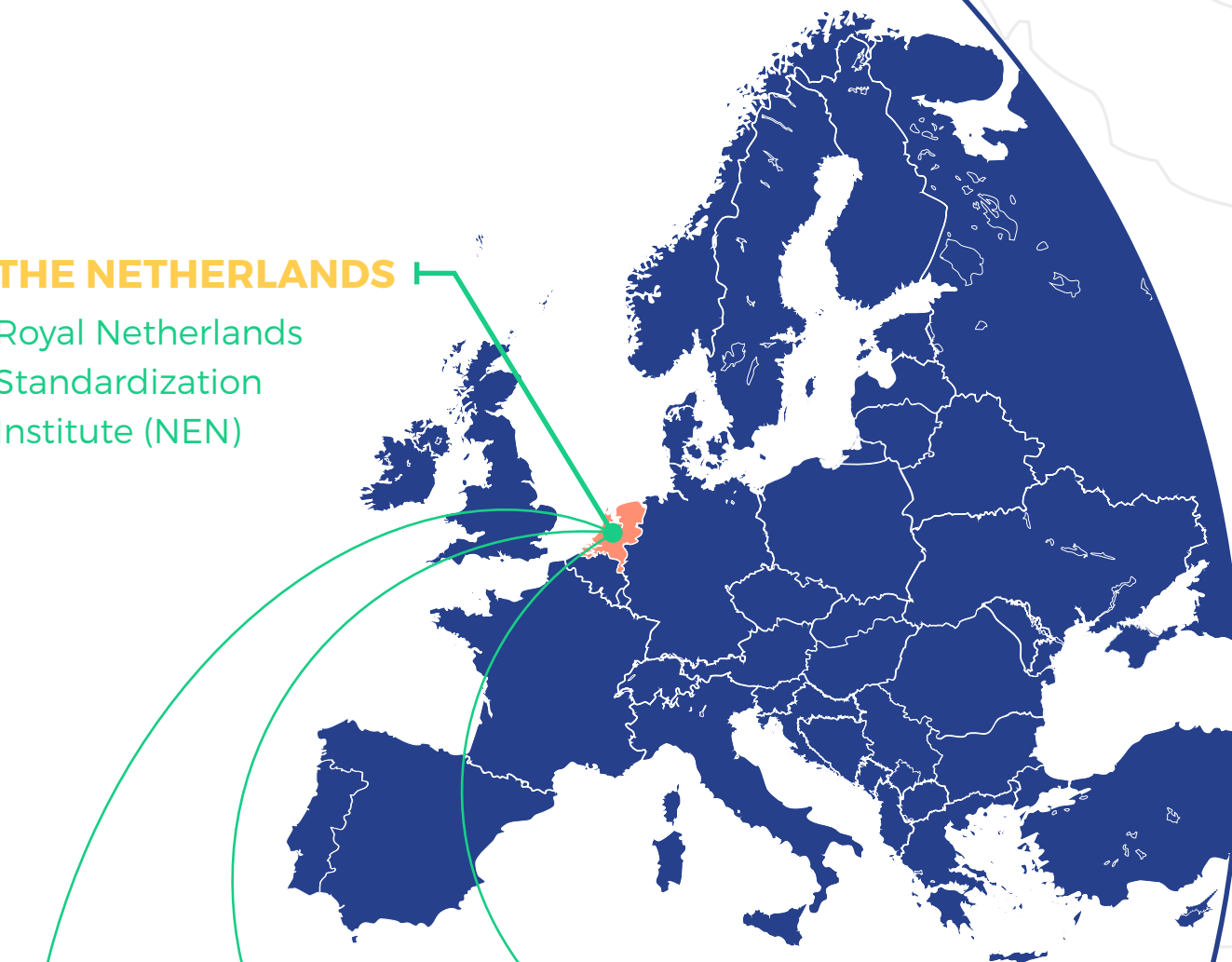

- 34,000+ standards
- 5,500+ committee members
- 550+ standardisation committees



First steps

- Create commitment
- Interview with staff members
- Survey with one-third of consultants
- Identifying moral motives, barriers, and facilitators



The situation

- 96 moral factors identified that affect RRI
- 46% of consultants believe standardisation struggles to establish socially desirable standards
- 42% of consultants believe standardisation is not inclusive enough
- 36% of consultants believe standardisation is not anticipatory enough



Steps towards institutional change

- More research on the impact of standards
- The 'user platform' initiative for better involving users



OUTCOMES

- Increased awareness of public values and social responsibility
- Introduction of a quicker, provisional type of standard
- Use of AI tool for stakeholder identification
- More academic research on the impact of standards
- The first RRI Standard
