

INSTITUTIONALIZING RESPONSIBILITY IN A STANDARDIZATION INSTITUTE



Royal Netherlands Standardization Institute (NEN)

The Royal Netherlands Standardization Institute (NEN) has started various research projects to explore how standardization can be made more socially responsible. The Delft University of Technology has explored what factors motivate, obstruct, and facilitate social responsibility in standardisation processes. As such, it supports NEN in understanding how it can better align its activities with the values, needs, and expectations of society.



The situation

96 moral factors identified that affect RRI

46% of consultants believe standardisation struggles to establish socially desirable standards

42% of consultants believe standardisation is not inclusive enough

36% of consultants believe standardisation is not anticipatory enough
