Psalm

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The Goal of this project:

This research project will examine the 150 psalms for the spiritual awareness each Psalm offers. Each Psalm will be examined by its language and the commentary of the Sages. The spiritual awareness analysis will be done in alignment with Ari's definition of the Tree of life, the Book of Creation, and the Zohar. Each verse of the Psalm will be rewritten using the intent of the language and spiritual commentary to convey its spiritual lesson.

Targum

Psa. 55:1 For praise, with the words of a hymn; good teaching composed by David. ² Hear, O God, my prayer, and do not hide yourself from my prayer. ³ Hear my utterance, and accept it from me; I will roar out in my words and be agitated. ⁴ From the voice of the enemy, from the trouble of the wicked, for they extend lies against me, and in anger they will hold a grudge towards me. ⁵ My heart will tremble within me, and the terrors of death have fallen upon me. ⁶ Fear and trembling come to me, and disaster has covered me. ⁷ And I said, "Who will give to me wings like a dove, [that] I may fly and come to rest?" 8 Behold, I would go to a far place to wander, I would lodge in the wilderness forever. 9 I would make hasten to me rescue from the tempest, shelter from the storm. 10 Destroy, O LORD, their counsel, divide their tongue, for I have seen violence and strife in the city. 11 Day and night they encircle it, around her walls, and misery and lies are in her midst. 12 Tumult is in her midst, and lies and deceit do not depart from her squares. ¹³ For an enemy will not belittle me, else I would bear it; my foe has not vaunted himself against me, else I would hide from his presence. ¹⁴ But you, O Achitophel, a man who is like me; a leader who taught me, and who tells me wisdom. ¹⁵ For together we will explain mysteries in the sanctuary of God, we will walk in haste. ¹⁶ He will condemn them to the judgement of death, and he will decree for them evil things, for Doeg and Achitophel; they will descend to Sheol while alive, for evil things are in their dwellings, in their bodies. ¹⁷ I will pray in the presence of God, and the word of the LORD will redeem me. 18 In the evening, and in the morning, and at noon I will pray, and I will tremble; and he heard my voice. 19 He redeemed my soul in peace, so that no evil came near to me, for his word was my help in many troubles. 20 God will hear and receive from them [their prayer], and the one who dwells in heaven from of old forever; but the wicked who are not from of old, who do not change their ways, are evil, and are not afraid in the presence of God. ²¹ He stretched out his hands against the men of his peace; he desecrated his covenant. ²² Smoother than oil of curds are the words of his mouth; and like weapons of war his heart. Softer are his words than tallow, but they are deadly lances. ²³ Cast your confidence on the LORD, and he will feed you; he will never allow privation to the righteous. ²⁴ But you, O God, by your word will bring them down to deep Gehenna; murderous and deceitful men will not see half of their days; but I will trust in your word.

Spiritual Awareness

The spiritual rewrite for the verses is in bold.

Introduction

The setting for this Psalm is Absalom's rebellion against his father, King David. David was puzzled that Achotifel became Absalom's primary supporter. Achotifel was a friend and advisor of David. David's most intimate companion, whom he revered as a teacher, had turned against him.

Superscript

To the Sefirah Netzach who grants victory through the power of music, an instruction by David.

Verse one

David turned to the LORD as he strived for clarity of thought. He was trying to understand why Achotifel turned against him.

Hear, O God, my prayer, and please do not leave me.

Verse two

David said that he was agitated about the circumstances he found himself in.

Attend me and answer me, for I am sad in my meditation, and my anger grows.

Verses three, four, five

"a suspended device for carrying." A stretcher would be such a device.

Because of the raging of the foe, because of the oppression of the lawless; for they charge me with the misuse of my power, and with outward show anger they hate me bitterly in their innards.

Therefore my heart writhes within me, and the terrors of death have fallen upon me.

Fear and trembling overpower me as horror overcomes me.

Verses six, seven, eight

In these verses, David exclaims that he wished he could have fled from Absalom.

And I said, I that I had wings like the dove! Then I would fly away and find a place of rest.

Behold then, I would wander far off and dwell in the wilderness. Meditate on this verse.

I would quickly devise deliverance for myself from the stormy wind that draws nigh and from the tempest.

Verses nine, ten, eleven

These verses explain why David had to endure so many troubles in his life. The verses develop an indictment against a specific enemy.

Subdue, O God, and divide their tongue, for I have seen only violence and strife in the city.

Day and night, they go about it upon its walls, and iniquity and disaster are in the midst of it.

Plots are hatched within it, and malice and deceit depart not from its open spaces.

Verse twelve

David's despair is shown in this verse. The widespread corruption in his administration was unbearable. His main despair was how Achitofel, a man of high esteem, could turn on David and spread lies. Achitofel became disloyal to David. He agonized over this for the rest of his life.

For it is not an enemy that reviles me, else I could have borne it; neither was it, the usual adversary that magnified himself against me, else I would have hidden from him.

Verse thirteen

David entrusted Achitofel with his inner secrets and feelings. Achitofel was never guilty of arrogance. However, he had turned on David.

But it was you, a mortal, my equal, my guide, and my familiar friend.

Verse fourteen

David describes the relationship between Achitofel and himself.

Together we kept the sweet secret; we walk into the House of God when there is turmoil outside.

Verse fifteen

God appoints death to collect the debt from the rebels. It was pretty sudden.

He appoints death to collect the debt they owe; they go down alive to the grave, for they bear the evil within themselves in their temporal dwelling place.

Verse sixteen

Achitofel taught David to always trust the LORD.

As for me, I will call upon God, and because He is the LORD, he will save me.

Verse seventeen

Despite the inner turmoil that David was feeling, he needed to muster the strength for prayer.

When I pray in the evening and morning and noonday, and I am restless, He has already heard my voice.

Verse eighteen

David acknowledged that every peaceful and happy day he ever felt was a gift from the LORD.

Even in times of peace, it was He alone Who redeemed my soul from impending struggle, even when there were many that stood at my side.

Verse nineteen

David believed that the LORD intervened in human events against the godless and those who refuted their exaggerated claims. Since the LORD does not seem to reveal His might by direct intervention in the course of human destinies, they believe there can be no change in their fortunes. These persons forget to revere the LORD. If the LORD intervened, then David must have wondered why the struggle against the rebellion was not halted by the LORD.

God will hear them and will give them their answer, though, as in days long past, He may sit upon His throne so that they neither believe in change nor fear God.

Verse twenty

The words and utterances by Achitofel are being used by him. He did a violence that he protested against.

And how he has put forth his hands against his own protestations of peace; he has profaned his own covenant. Verse Twenty-one

תֹבְּלְבְּׁלֵבְ (mach'maot) – means "butter." The phrase smooth as butter refers to anything that is smooth and soft.

Smooth as butter were the words of his mouth, but he bore war within his heart. Softer than oil were his words, and yet they were drawn swords.

Verse Twenty-two, twenty-three

David knew that the followers of Achitofel would bring their own destruction.

Cast upon God what has been placed upon you; He will provide for you. He will never allow the righteous to waver.

But you, O God, will throw them into the well of destruction; men of bloodguilt and deceit shall not live out half their days; but as for me, I shall trust in You.

Complete Psalm Rewrite Emphasizing Spiritual Awareness
