Open Access indicators

National Open Access Strategy and Action Plan

- By 2024, all scientific publications from Swiss universities should be openly accessible.
- National indicators necessary to monitor progress towards OA.

NOAM provides indicators:

- Publication figures of Swiss HEI for selected publication types
- Basic OA shares per publication year according to Unpaywall classification (Green, Gold, Hybrid, Closed)

Two separate methods of data collection

Journal Monitor (OAM-CH)



- Cooperation with Forschungszentrum Jülich
- Resource type: Journal article
- Data sources: Unpaywall, Crossref, DOAJ, ROR, Dimensions
- Motivation: fast results at high maturity level (international standards), far-reaching expert evaluations possible


Repository Monitor



swissuniversities


- Cooperation with swissuniversities members (and associated institutions)
- Resource types: Journal articles, books, book chapters, conference papers
- Source: Institutional repositories or university bibliographies, via national survey; focus on absolute data
- Motivation: to counteract disciplinary (STM) and linguistic (English) bias, in the long term





ROR ID checks (Dec 2021)

- first communication on project
- Call to action: ROR ID checks
- Added communication: Univ. of Appl.
 Sciences (UAS) + Univ. of Teacher Education (UTE)


Repository survey (Mar-Jun 2022)

- Conference calls with UAS / UTE
- participation in general meeting of UTE (MIPHD)
- Call to action: national survey including exposition and manual

Go-live (Sept 2022)

- message to all swissuniversities members on golive of oamonitor.ch website
- Invitation to webinar

swissuniversities members: participation in national survey



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Added value for swissuniversities members

National repository survey as point of reference

- Specifications allow for concrete questions
- Potential adaption of institutional repository/CRIS
- Institutional collaboration on scope/design of the project

Swiss Open Access Monitor as basis for discussion

- Positioning within one's own institution on OA
- If applicable, impetus for long-term OA transformation
- Can staff resources be (permanently) freed up for open access issues (such as the repository survey)?


