




Introduction



- Survey of Health, Ageing, and Retirement in Europe
- Biennial face-to-face interview
- Target group: 50+ population and their partners
- Health & health care, social networks, work & retirement, income & welfare
- Physical and cognitive tests
- Interview duration: 75 minutes














International research






Wave 9 Dutch fieldwork




- From October 2021 July 2022
- Halted in winter 2021/2022 due to Corona
- Individual response rate ~49% (note: lag in cleaning gross sample)




hh contact rate

individual response rate














Wave 9 data release



- All countries: fieldwork ended in September 2022
- Data cleaning, quality checks, and codings will be conducted during winter 2022/2023 (cooperation between SHARE Central and Country Teams)
- Data release expected in 2023 (by SHARE Central)











Wave 10 and beyond



- Wave 10 still in CAPI, content resembles Wave 9
- Netherlands asked to participate in mode-experiment: web vs. paper&pencil survey
- Main fieldwork Wave 10 in 2024















Wave 10 and beyond



- SHARE Central coordination moves to SHARE Berlin Institute in 2022-2023
- Future vision is to follow multi-mode strategy, with more flexible frequency of surveys, administrative linkages
- Focus on objective data, retirement of babyboom, public health prevention, long-term care, inequality









Key take-aways



- Dutch sample is ageing
- New refreshment sample crucial
- Future in multi-mode approach
- Rich longitudinal data related to health
