Core activities

Working closely with the EOSC Association, EOSC Focus and across the Advisory Groups and the Task Forces within, the 'Upskilling' Task Force will conduct activities such as:

- **Supporting mandated organisations and national structures** to identify readiness to engage in EOSC and highlight areas which need to be developed in order to enable better participation with EOSC
- **Leveraging information** from EOSC Task Forces, projects and initiatives to help nations to identify and implement paths to improvement or "upskilling".
- **Support the dialogue and sharing of experience and insight** of stakeholders involved in Open Science developments, policy making, models and strategies on a national level across Europe and within nations.

Working methodology

In close liaison with the EOSC Association, EOSC Steering board (member state representatives), EOSC Focus, and the other EOSC Task Forces we **aim to connect and collect outputs** in order to **implement and disseminate the information to individual countries**. The mechanism for dissemination being via the links established from the Task Force to the individual countries (mandated organisations) and stakeholders within.

The Task Force will need to work **flexibly in order to respond to the changing environments**, across the EOSC Association, EOSC Steering board initiatives, EOSC Focus and the other Advisory Groups. Communication channels and co-production working models need to be established in order to successfully Upskill respective countries, based on their individual needs, to engage in EOSC. **The Task Force 'Upskilling countries to engage in EOSC' engages will be a community-driven effort.**
