

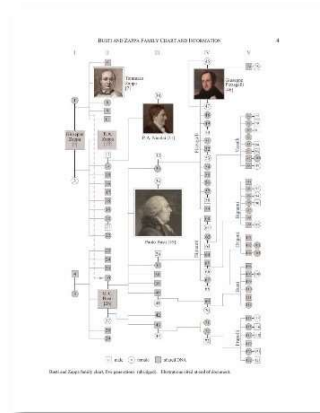

Preface

These notes provide additional references for the article “Rediscovering Paul Busti (1749–1824)” published in *Italian Americana*, Summer 2023. Where possible, digital access links are provided with the hope that they are persistent.

The numbers shown in the family chart (p. 4) correspond to the numbers in the following list [n]. Letters correspond to additions not included in the family chart. The documentation for each individual is not likely to be complete, especially for the first two generations represented. Those names shown in **bold** text indicate blood relatives of Paolo Busti [35] who are also known to have reached adulthood (age of majority 21 years). The listings include abbreviations identifying the archive where the documentation has been located. They also make reference to publications that are included in the following list of works cited.

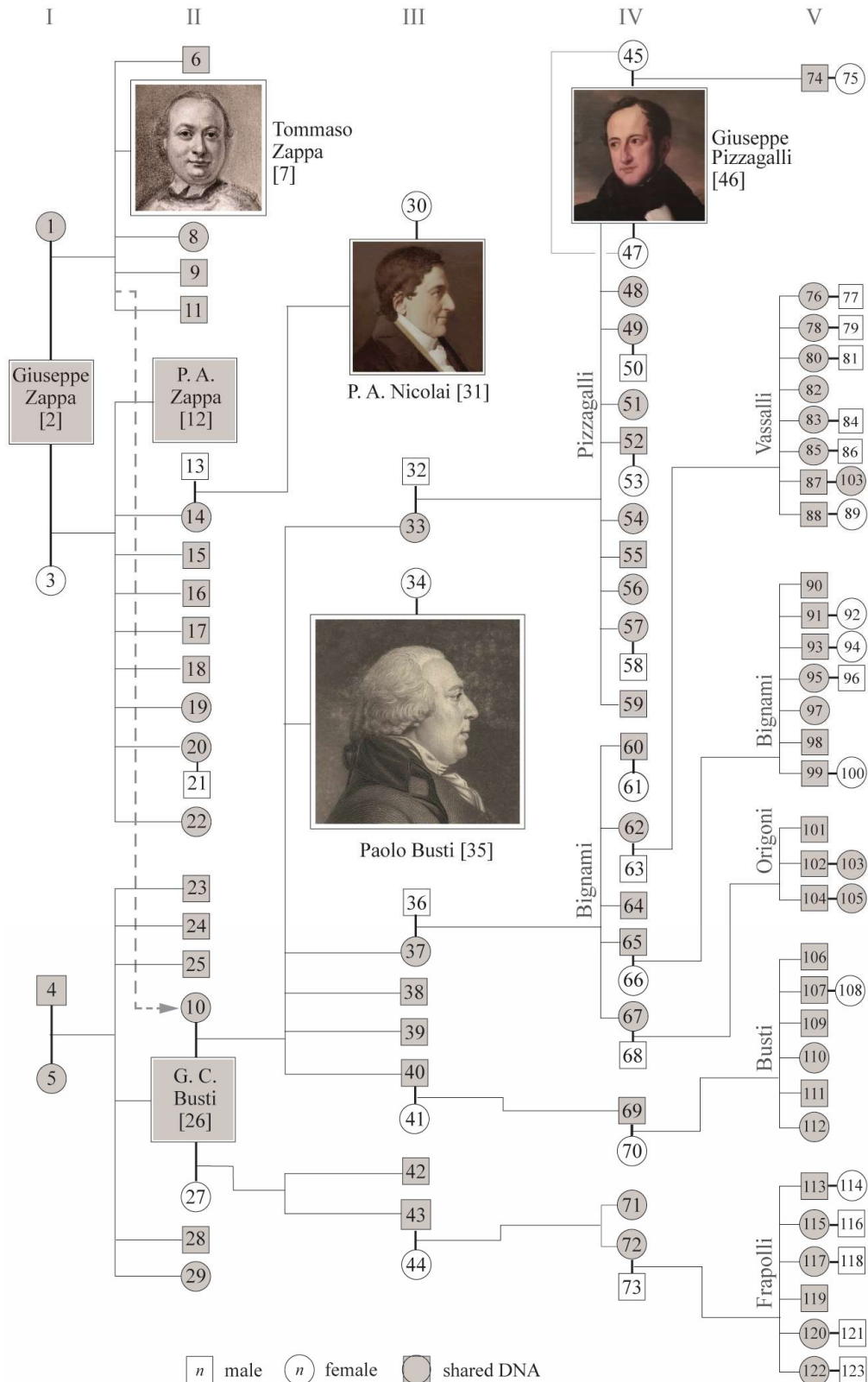

Generation I**[1] Catarina Buoni (1693–1734)**

Daughter of Giovanni Battista Buoni and Felizza de' Paoli. Full name at baptism Angela Maria Cattarina Buoni. First wife of Giuseppe Zappa, also known as Catarina Zappa *nata* Buoni, or Boni, or Bona, or Biondi. Birth 11 September 1693 in Milano. S. Stefano Maggiore (Milano). Baptism certificate included in *DMi*, marriage files, vol. 1797, Nov. 1721, Zappa Buoni, 15 November 1721. *ASDMi*.

Marriage to Giuseppe Zappa 15 November 1721 in S. Tecla (Milano). Certificate in *DMi*, ordination files, vol. 696, year 1747, *Maggiori Straordinarie II Semestre*, file for the son Tommaso Zappa [7]. *ASDMi*.

Death 18 August 1734 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Morti 1707–1752*, p. 188. *BACMMi*.

[2] Giuseppe Zappa (1692–1759)

Son of Giovanni Battista Zappa and Margarita. Full name at baptism Giuseppe Gioachino Francesco. Banker and businessman, one of the principal bankers in Milan, partnership in Giuseppe Zappa e Caldara.

Birth 20 March 1692 in Milano. S. Nicolao (Milano). Baptism certificate included in *DMi*, marriage files, vol. 1797, Nov. 1721, Zappa Buoni, 15 November 1721. *ASDMi*.

Death 11 March 1759 in Milano. S. Protaso ad Monacos (Milano). *Registro Morti 2 (1756–1787)*, p. 17. *ASFe*.

[3] Laura Pedroli (about 1709–1777)

Daughter of Pietro Francesco Pedroli (also known as Giovanni Pietro Pedroli). Second wife of Giuseppe Zappa, also known as Laura Zappa *nata* Pedroli, or Petroli or Pedrolia. Previously married to G. B. Cereda (born about 1672–25 March 1736). S. Maria Beltrade (Milano). Death certificate. *DMi*, marriage files, vol. 1035, Apr. 1737, Zappa Pedroli, 3 April 1737. *ASDMi*.

Born about 1709 based on age 27 noted in marriage file.

Marriage to Giuseppe Zappa 25 April 1737 in Milano. S. Maria Beltrade (Milano). *Registro Matrimoni 1736-87*, p. 6. *ASDMi*.

Died 7 January 1777 in Milano. S. Protaso ad Monacos (Milano). *Registro Morti 2 (1756–1787)*, p. 116. *ASFe*.

Other children of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio, siblings of Giovanni Battista Busti [4] are not included in the Family Chart but are included below. They are referenced by letters instead of numbers.

- [A] **Paolo Busti** (1677–1744)
 Son of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio. Full name at baptism Giovanni Paolo Tommaso. Priest, Curato of Barzio (Lecco, Lombardia) 19 December 1705. Curato of S. Babila (Milano) 27 March 1716. *Collazioni 1703–1712*, p. 102; *Collazioni 1712–1717*, p. 166. *ASDMi*.
 Birth 21 December 1677 in Monza (Lombardia). Duomo di Monza. 3A 5, *Registro Battesimi A (1668–1682)*, np. *MDMz*.
 Died 21 September 1744 in Monza. Duomo di Monza. 5A 5, *Registro Morti C (1736–1759)*, p. 57. *MDMz*.
- [4] **Giovanni Battista Busti** (1681–1747)
 Son of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio.
 Birth 10 January 1681 in Monza (Lombardia). Duomo di Monza. 3A 5, *Registro Battesimi A (1668–1682)*, np. *MDMz*.
 Married to Anna Teresa Marini 25 September 1706 in Milano. S. Simpliciano (Milano). *Libro Matrimoni 1677–1711*, p. 268v no. 53. *Loci*.
 Died 30 May 1747 in Monza. Duomo di Monza. 5A 5, *Registro Morti C (1736–1759)*, p. 91. *MDMz*.
- [5] **Anna Teresa Marini** (about 1686–1763)
 Daughter of Giovanni Marini. Also known as Anna Teresa Busti *nata* Marini, or Marina. Also Regina Marina. At marriage her parents had died and she lived in orphanage of S. Febronia, in the same parish of S. Simpliciano. Some ruins of S. Febronia persist behind Corso Garibaldi 81. Digital content: lombardiabeniculturali.it/ricerca/?q=santa+febronia
 Born about 1686. Age 28 in *Status Animarum* 1714 at S. Carpofofo (Milano) and 77 noted in death record. Died 8 May 1763 in Monza. Duomo di Monza. 5A 6, *Registro Morti D (1759–1776)*, p. 66v. *MDMz*.
- [B] **Paola Maria Busti** (1683–)
 Son of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio.
 Birth 10 June 1683 in Monza (Lombardia). Duomo di Monza. 3A 7, *Registro Battesimi G (1683–1716)*, np. *MDMz*.
- [C] **Giuseppe Busti** (1685–1747)
 Son of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio. Full name at baptism Giuseppe Antonio Maria. Living in the Casa de R. Curati di S. Babila in the parish of S. Carpofofo in 1714-1715 along with brother Carlo Maria [D] and brother Giovanni Battista [4], his wife, and their children. S. Carpofofo (Milano). *Status Animarum 1714*. *ASDMi*.
 Priest. Serving as Canon at the Cathedral of Monza at his death.
 Birth 11 October 1685 in Monza (Lombardia). Duomo di Monza. 3A 7, *Registro Battesimi G (1683–1716)*, np. *MDMz*.
 Death 8 March 1747 in Monza. Duomo di Monza. 5A 5, *Registro Morti C (1736–1759)*, p. 85. *MDMz*.
- [D] **Carlo Maria Busti** (1699–)
 Son of Melchiore Busti and Margarita Frigerio. Full name at baptism Carlo Antonio Gerardo Maria.
 Birth 2 February 1699 in Monza (Lombardia). Duomo di Monza. 3A 7, *Registro Battesimi G (1683–1716)*, np. *MDMz*.
 Age 15 and present with brothers don Giuseppe and Giovanni Battista in Casa de R. Curati di S. Babila in the parish of S. Carpofofo. S. Carpofofo (Milano). *Status Animarum 1714*. *ASDMi*.

Generation II

- [6] **Giovanni Battista Gaetano Tomaso Zappa (1722–1724)**
Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1].
Birth 27 June 1722 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1692–1724*, p. 537. *BACMMi*.
Death 15 October 1724 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Morti 1707–1752*, p. 108. *BACMMi*.
- [7] **Tommaso Zappa (1723–1784)**
Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1]. Full name at baptism Tomaso Innocente Felice Francesco Gasparo.
Priest, Diocesan Congregation of Oblati dei Santi Ambrogio e Carlo, ordained priest 15 October 1747 in Milano. *DMi*. Archivio Spirituale, *Registro Ordinazioni 1745–1759*, np. *ASDMi*. Served as Master of Ceremony of the Cathedral. See portrait p. 35.
Birth 10 October 1723 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1692–1724*, p. 562. *BACMMi*.
Death 11 August 1784 (Ruggeri, 208). *BACMMi*.
- [8] **Marianna Felice Margarita Zappa (1724– death≤1728)**
Daughter of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1].
Birth 16 March 1724 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 22. *BACMMi*.
Likely dead prior to the birth of Marianna Colomba [10] in 1728.
- [9] **Carlo Giuseppe Antonio Gregorio Baldassare Zappa (1726–)**
Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1].
Birth 12 March 1726 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 41. *BACMMi*.
- [10] **Marianna Zappa (1728–1756)**
Daughter of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1]. Also known as Marianna Busti *nata* Zappa. Full name at baptism Marianna Colomba.
Birth 17 May 1728 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 83. *BACMMi*.
Married to Giulio Cesare Busti [26] on 26 October 1746 in S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Matrimoni 1700–1750*, p. 345 no. 36. *BACMMi*.
Mother of six, including Paolo Busti, died after giving birth to her son Giuseppe [40].
Death 3 May 1756 in Milano. S. Protaso ad Monacos (Milano). *Registro Morti 2 (1756–1787)*, p. 4. *ASFe*.
- [11] **Giuseppe Antonio Zappa (1732–1798)**
Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Catarina Buoni [1]. Full name at baptism Giuseppe Antonio Maria Baldassare. Continued his father's banking business.
Birth 11 March 1732 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 159. *BACMMi*.
Unmarried, as stated in the death record.
Death 20 January 1798 [1 Piovoso anno 6 of French Republican calendar] in Milano, Contrada S. Margherita no. 1118. Comune di Milano. *Registro Mortuario*, no. 3, folio 2, in *Fondo Famiglie*, vol. 1613 – Zappa. *ASCMi*.

[12] **Paolo Antonio Zappa** (1738–1803)

Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Laura Pedroli [3]. Full name at baptism Giovanni Paolo Antonio. Often listed as P. A. Zappa. Mentor of Paul Busti and partner in Zappa en Gebroeders Lorla in Amsterdam, established in 1761 and attested in Dutch archives since beginning of 1762. According to series of *Status Animarum* of S. Protaso (Milano) he probably lived in Amsterdam from about 1756 to 1759, 1761 to 1769, 1774–1775. Mainly present in Milano in other years. But he was also there in Fall 1765, as he was godfather to Paolo Antonio Nicolai [31] on 1 October in Cremona, 5 days after his birth. *ASFe*. In 1776 he was godfather in a baptism in Amsterdam, but *per procuracionem*. Zappa was renowned at least since 1785 for his garden in Sesto S. Giovanni (Milano). After his death the collection was purchased by the botanical gardens of the Universities of Pavia and Bologna.

Birth 6 March 1738 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 281. *BACMMi*. Unmarried.

Death 20 March 1803 in Milano. S. Maria del Giardino (Milano). *Registro Morti 1787–1805*, p. 119. *ASFe*. See also death notice on p. 41.

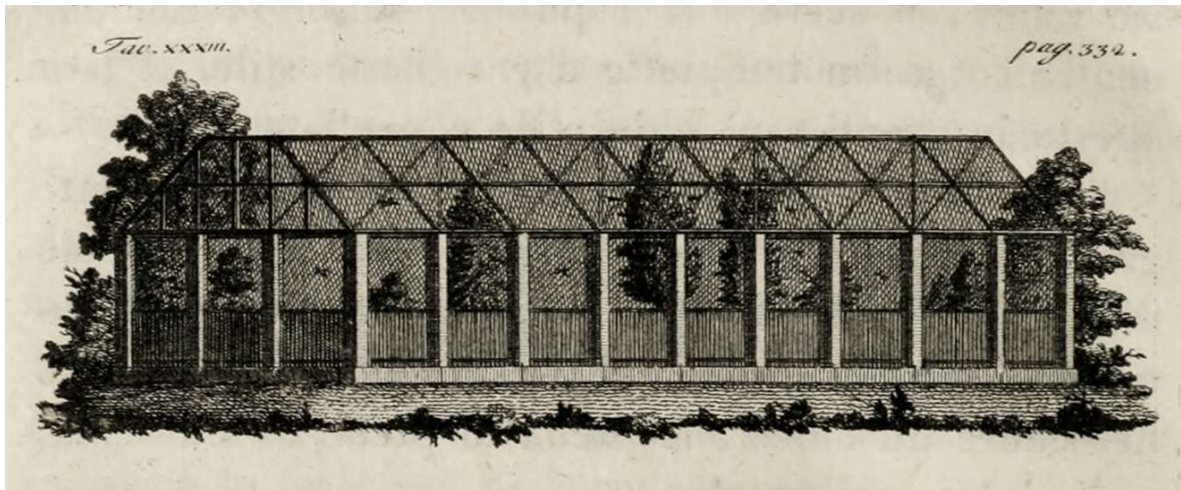

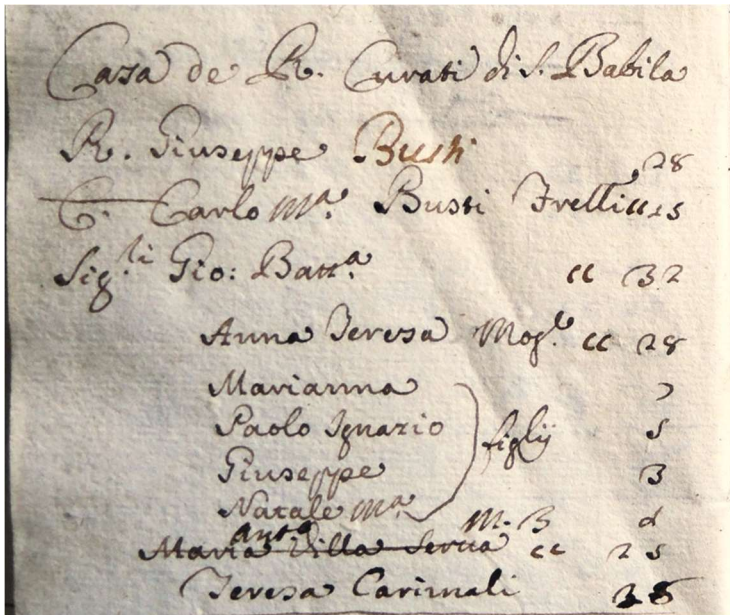

- [13] Nicola Nicolai (1738–)
 Son of Giuseppe Nicolai and Francesca Carluzzi.
 Born in Cremona (Lombardia) probably on 31 December 1738. Listed as having turned 21 on 31 December 1759. Diocese of Cremona. *Stato Libero*, 23 August 1760, included in *DMi*, marriage files, vol. 1592, Sep. 1760, Nicolai Zappa. *ASDMi*.
 Death date unknown.
- [14] **Francesca Zappa** (1739– death \geq 1799)
 Daughter of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Laura Pedroli [3]. Also known as Francesca Nicolai *nata* Zappa. Full name at baptism Maria Francesca Margarita Felice.
 Birth 31 May 1739 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 312. *BACMMi*.
 Married to Nicola Nicolai 9 September 1760 in S. Protaso (Milano). *Registro Matrimoni 2 (1631–1787)*, p. 138r. *ASFe*.
 Died after 1799: godmother in the baptism of her granddaughter, Francisca Paulina Maria Catharina Nicolai in Amsterdam, 10 August 1799. Kerk in het Maagdenhuis (Spui, Amsterdam). *Liber Baptizatorum 1787–1811*, p. 45 (folio 23), no. 4. *SAM*. Archive no. 5001, Inventory no. 365. Digital access: archieff.amsterdam/inventarissen/scans/5001/1.2.14.4/start/20/limit/10/highlight/4
- [15] Carlo Antonio Fedele Gaspare Zappa (1740– about 1760)
 Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Laura Pedroli [3].
 Identified as Modesto, monk in the Italian Congregation of Gerolimini (*Ordo Fratrum Eremitarum S. Hieronymi Congregationis b. Petri de Pisis*). G. A. Marzoni, Notaio. Notarial Act, 26 June 1761, 1787 certified copy in *Fondo Famiglie* vol. 1613 – Zappa. *ASCMi*.
 Birth 14 July 1740 in Milano. S. Tecla (Milano). *Registro Battesimi 1724–1750*, p. 339. *BACMMi*.
 Death about age 20. Alive at father's death 11 March 1759 but deceased before 26 June 1761. G. A. Marzoni, see above Notarial Act.
- [16] **Orazio Antonio Maria Baldassare Zappa** (1741–1819)
 Son of Giuseppe Zappa [2] and Laura Pedroli [3].
 Priest. Identified as Father **Vito Maria Zappa** of the Congregation of Gerolimini. Probably ordained in Roma, see Notarial Act listed for Carlo [15]. His father's estate provided funds for future travel, studies, and ordination in Roma (ordination records not found in Archivio Storico Diocesano di Roma, so, this may have remained a project). Ordination before 1768 as he appears as a priest in the convent of the Gerolimini. Ss. Cosma e Damiano (Milano). *Status Animarum* 1768. *ASFe*. Ex Gerolimino in 1802 and at death. S. 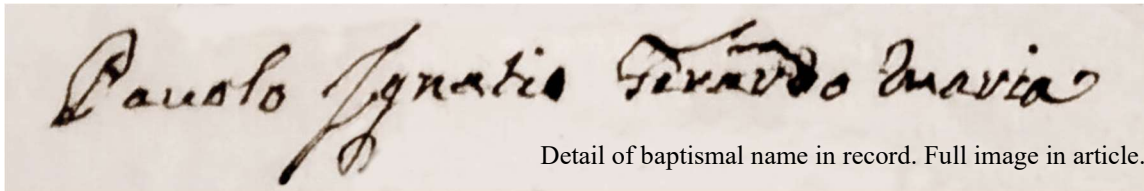

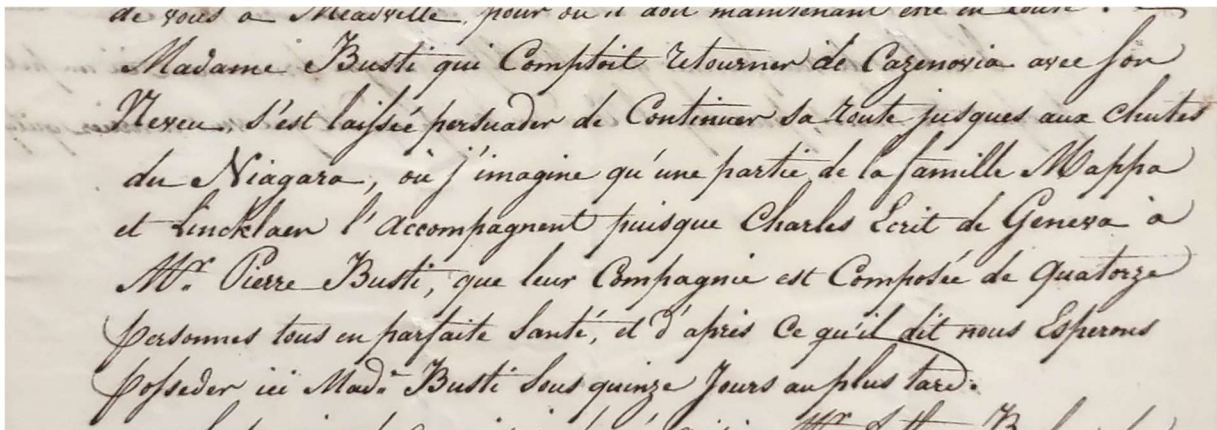

Examination of the record shows that his original name was Giacomo Filippo (two apostles then celebrated on 1 May) but at later baptismal ceremonies in the Church the names Carlo Giuseppe were added in reference to his godfather, Carlo Giuseppe Crippa. Usually listed as Giuseppe, sometimes Carlo Giuseppe, and known in Amsterdam as Joseph Busti.

[42] **Giovanni Battista Angelo Busti** (1758–1826)

Son of Giulio Cesare Busti [26] and Cristina de Notaris [27]. Baptized as Giovanni Battista Angiolo Faustino Maria Gaspare Busti, also known as Gio[vanni] Angelo or Gian Angelo.

Priest. Ordained priest 25 May 1782 in Milano as Canon of the Basilica di S. Nazaro (Basilica Collegiata degli Apostoli in S. Nazaro, in Porta Romana). *DMi*. Archivio Spirituale, *Registro Ordinazioni 1773–1789*, np. *ASDMi*.

Ex Canon since the Cisalpine Republic (1797–1802), however, continued serving parish despite dissolution or tax issues. From about 1822, served as Canon at Basilica di S. Vittore, Varese. *Milano Sacro Almanacco 1823*, p. 147; but still listed also in S. Nazaro in the same volume, p. 50.

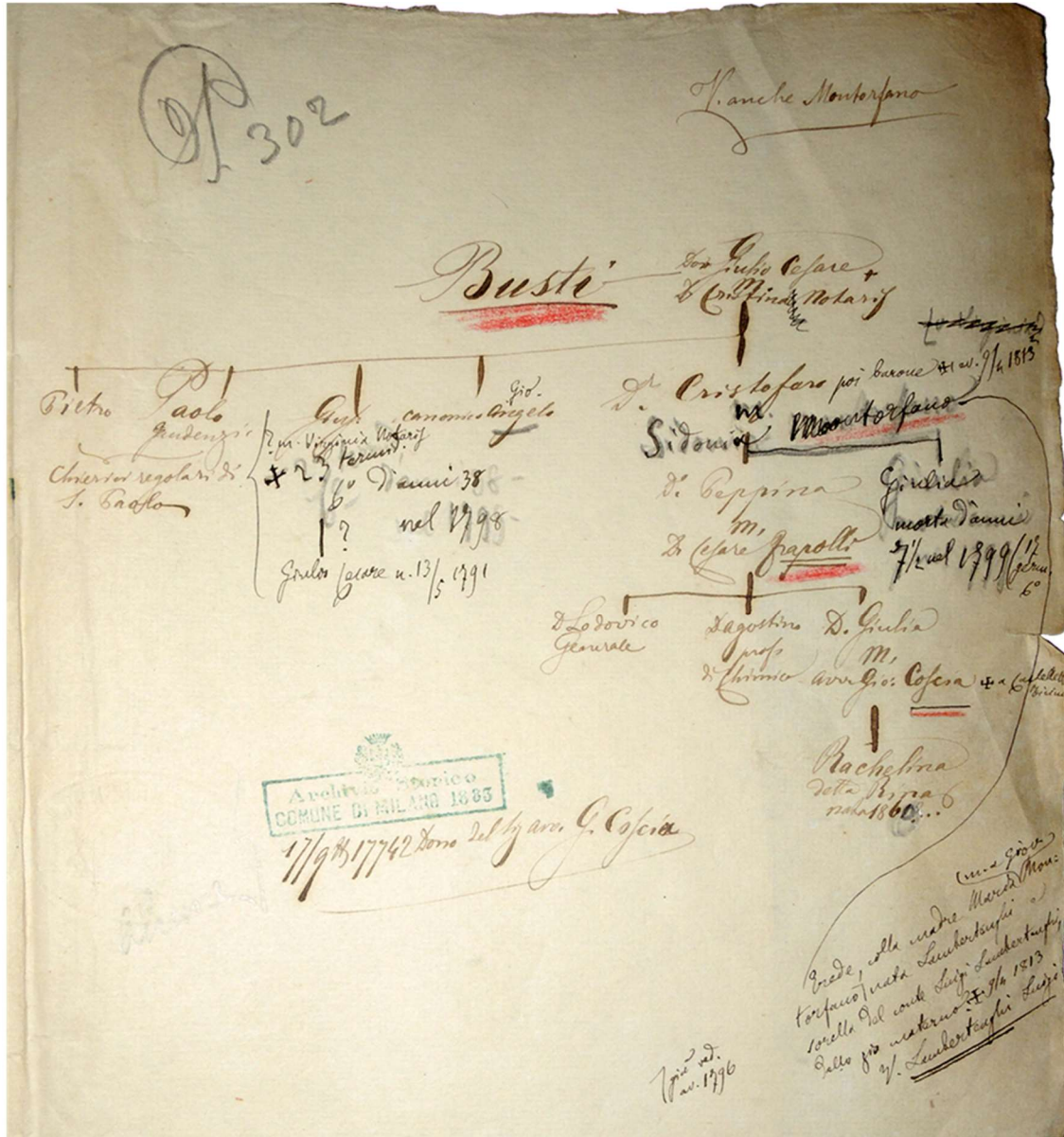

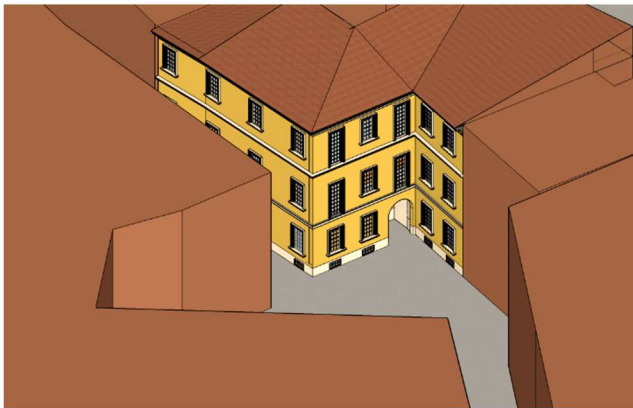

Piazza delle Galline was located in a neighborhood northwest of the Cathedral, with its parish church, S. Protaso ad Monacos (near the center of this image), located just northeast of the square. The G. C. Busti household (1750-64) was in a building with its entrance on the *Piazza delle Galline* (near “delle”) and was located at the corner with *Vicolo di S. Cipriano*. The Giuseppe Zappa house (purchased in 1751 and still owned by P.A. Zappa at his death in 1803) was located near the “gha” in the street named *C. di S. Margherita* at the corner with *C. de' due Muri*.



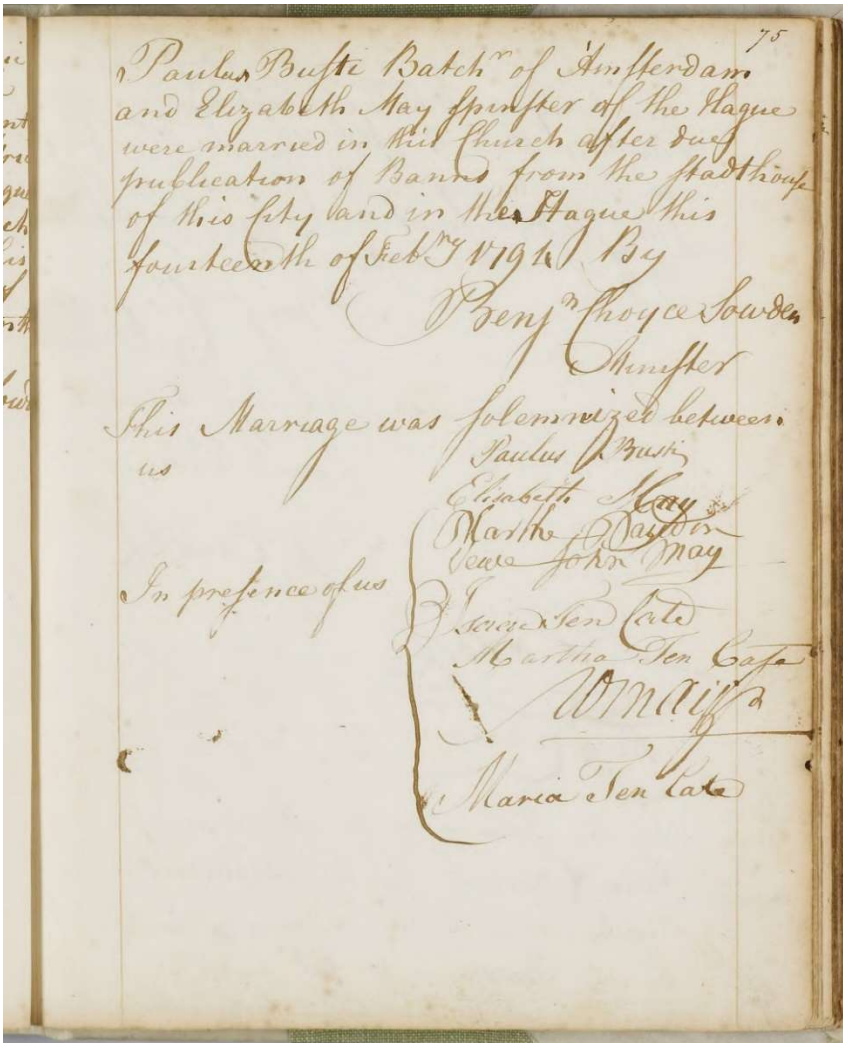

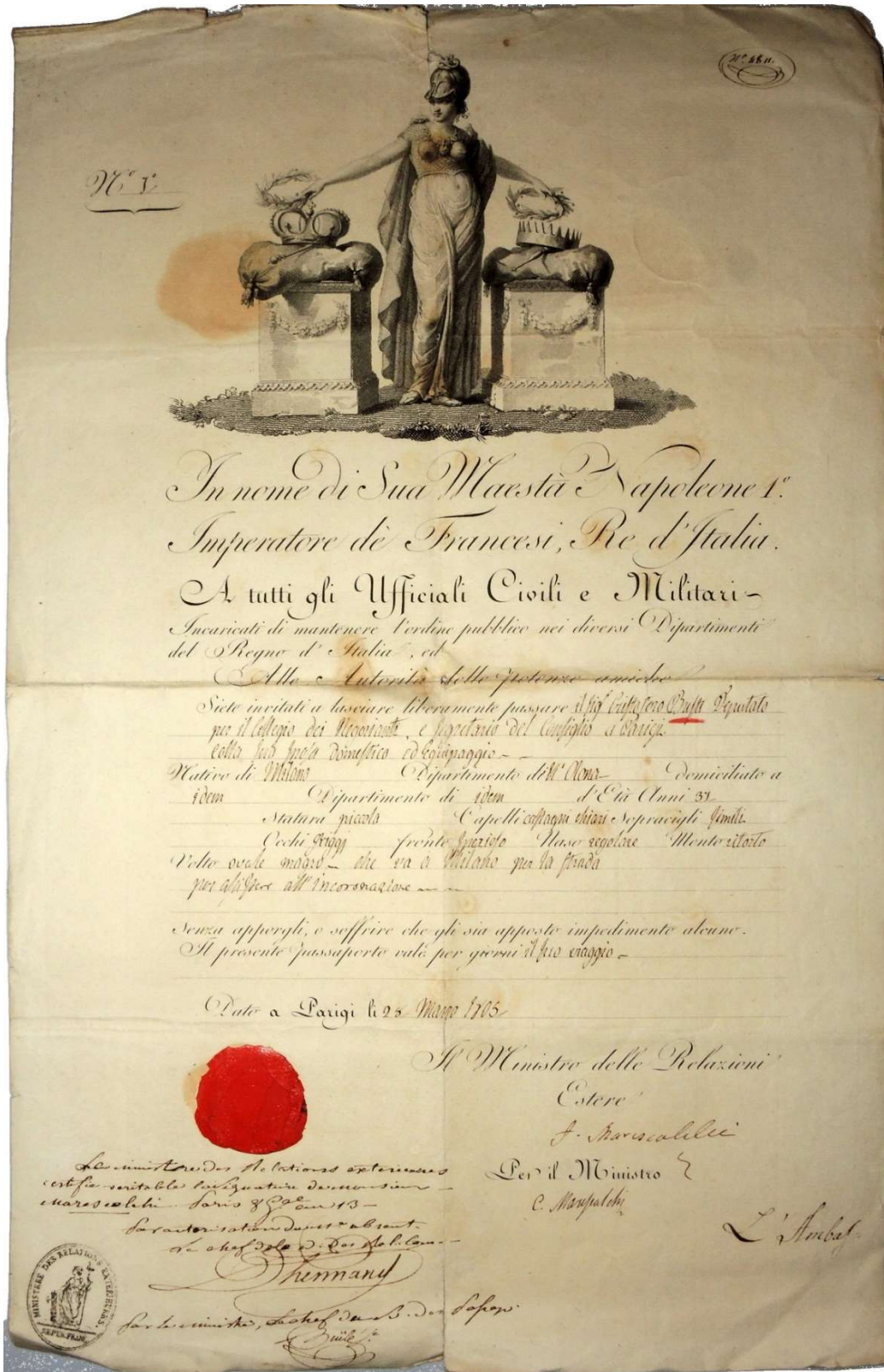
