The first boat library service was inaugurated on Kolkata's Hooghly River in India has been recently launched. It has been introduced by the West Bengal TransportCorporation. The floating library is called The 'Young Readers Boat Library' which has over 500 collections of books of different classifications in three languages namely English, Hindi, and Bengali. The floating library picks up from Millenium Park and take you on a three hour long trip to Belur Math and then back to the original site. The cost has been reduced for people below 18 years of age to promote and strengthen the reading habit.
