Problem: Global Does Not Include the Whole Planet






MetaDocencia was born in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic as a response to the need and urgency for incorporating tools for a quick and effective switch to educational online events, understanding that isolation increased limitations in accessibility and inclusion both for students and instructors in Latin America.

Who have we reached?

Between March 2020 and November 2022 we conducted 81 workshops.

Reaching more than 2,000 people across 30 countries.

All of what we do is open, reusable, free, and in Spanish.

Our courses and materials are shared with an open CC BY-SA 4.0 license and all the events are free to attend.






98% of workshop participants completed our post-workshop survey and expressed **high satisfaction**.
