

About CeOS_SE project

- 1 Jan 2022 – 1 Jan 2025
- Project led by LIBER with partners in 7 countries
- **GOAL:** to raise awareness of mainstream Open Science and Citizen Science practices in SE European countries
- specifically in countries that have been seen to perform less well in OS or CS, or where there is limited awareness of or involvement in major developments related to the European Open Science Cloud (EOSC)

6 project results packages

PR1: Framework for Transfer of Knowledge and Innovation on citizen-enhanced open science (CeOS) – SDU

- PR1 is a key result for building the knowledge base of the project and paves the way for the development and implementation of all intellectual results, by setting the framework for transferring knowledge and innovation from more developed countries with regards to CeOS to less developed ones.

Deliverables:

- **Literature review** – identified 31 sources to form the core of this literature review
- **Survey** – investigation of skills and practices currently at place in partner institutions of SE Europe – results to be published in an article by Kaarsted, T. et al.
- **Guidelines** for SE European university libraries on CS engagement in OS
- Quality Assurance and Risk Assessment

PR2: Report on implementation of citizen-enhanced open science in various open knowledge hubs in SE Europe

- PR2 facilitates transfer and participation in SE Europe between university libraries (*project partners*) and public libraries (*associated partners*)

Deliverables:

- **Survey** – collection of practices of university and public libraries' collaboration in SE Europe to mainstream CEOS
- **A report** on citizen science co-created activities by university and public libraries and application to SE Europe
- **Study:** Upscaling collaboration between academic and public libraries for CEOS in SE Europe – results from survey and CSAs

PR3: Report on implementation of CeOS activities and staff training for academic libraries

- PR3 will focus on training activities in SE Europe with double objective:
 - to carry out CeOS public activities in SE Europe (learning-by-doing)
 - through the organisation of these activities, to upskill HEI staff of the participants (train-the-trainers)

Deliverables:

- **Reports** from all training activities - study
- **Training Design and Implementation Framework**
- Data management plan
- still ongoing activity until end Feb 2023

In 2023 and 2024

- **PR4: Roadmap on CeOS in the Balkans – UNILIB**
 - PR4 will describe the steps in which citizen science as a part of open science may be more broadly used in the Balkan countries (Feb 2023 – Aug 2023)
- **PR5: Uptake of citizen science in Higher education curricula and open science practice in SE Europe – UNI Patras**
 - PR5 demonstrates how citizen science affects change within HEIs, by focusing on curricula and open science practices based on data and results generated by CS projects (Jun 2023 – Jun 2024)
- **PR6: Policy change in CeOS for sustainability and impact – Connecting to the EOSC – LIBER**
 - PR6 is a key result aiming to connect results from PR1 to PR5 and to bring them to the next level of engagement, highlighting a region that is lagging behind in terms of visibility and support, while still has a lot to offer in terms of diversity and value. (Mar 2024 – Dec 2024)
