DIAMAS Project - overview

- Period: 2022 2025
- Starting date: September 2022
- Budget €3m from Horizon Europe
- Participants: 23 public service scholarly organizations from 12 European countries
- Website: https://diamasproject.eu





DIAMAS Project: objectives

- Provide the research community with an aligned, high-quality, and sustainable OA scholarly communication ecosystem, capable of implementing OA as a standard publication practice across the ERA.
- Create a community, supporting services, and non-technical infrastructure for Institutional Publishing Service Providers (IPSPs) that adopt common standards, guidelines, and best practices.
- Common standards, guidelines, and best practices will be co-created and adopted as an Extensible Quality Standard for Institutional Publishing (EQSIP).




DIAMAS Project: capacity center

- The Diamond OA Capacity Centre will largely be a virtual distributed capacity network of collaborating services that are coordinated via a central portal.
- Technical infrastructure support will be added in 5 years via the HORIZON-INFRA-2022-EOSC-01-02: 'Improving and coordinating technical infrastructure for institutional open access publishing across Europe'. (CRAFT-OA, coordinated by University of Göttingen).





Hands on activity: mapping IPSPs (40 min)

What to do?

- Choose to look at either
 - A: your own institution or
 - B: your own country
- Then either:
 - A: find as many concrete IPSPs in your institution or
 - B: define approaches to find IPSPs in your country
- Document what you find in the communal doc
- Include links to sources, as far as possible
- **Think aloud**: within your group, share what you are doing and what you find or come up with



Things you can try

- For e.g. Utrecht University, substitute with your own organisation...
 - o **Google** search restricted on site:uu.nl combined with ...
 - "published by Utrecht University"
 - "uitgegeven door Universiteit Utrecht"
 - "university press" -"press release"
 - <u>"Repository"</u> (on the repo page look for indications of primary publishing in the repository, next to deposits)
 - Worldcat search for <u>items with Utrecht University as publisher and published in 2021</u> and check distribution over various publication types
 - The LENS search for Utrecht in publisher field and 2021 as pubyear
 - Get in contact with the university library and ask which locally published materials/series/journals etc they know of
 - CRIS search for Utrecht University as publisher
 - o **ISSN-ROAD** search using the map and <u>view journals published in Utrecht</u>
 - o **ROR** search for <u>iust the city name</u> to see if there are any other/related orgs that may be have publishing activities
 - ISBN global publisher registry search for <u>Universiteit Utrecht</u>
 - o ...
- For e.g. the Netherlands
 - Check lists of journals published in the Netherlands (e.g. from <u>DOAJ</u>, ISSN-ROAD etc.) and manually scan publisher names for those that are institutional (we are already doing that in the project)
 - Re3Data registry search for <u>data repositories in the Netherlands</u>
 - o Get in contact with the Royal Library and ask help with getting names of Dutch publishers in institutions....



Reflection and conclusions

- What kind of IPSPs did you find?
- Which information needed for finding IPSPs is public, which only available within institutions or within closed/commercial databases?
- What approaches at institutional or national level are most successful or promising for identifying IPSPs?



Some suggestions and remarks from the session

- Audience's associates institutional publishing with a.o.: university press, repository, diamond
- Typical EU project, but what will be tangible/practical outcomes?
- Scope is very wide, may need focus
- Bibliodiversity is important
- Libraries are thought to mostly have a good view on what is going on in institutions: involve them
- A short 'pre-survey' asking libraries to identify IPSPs in their institution is a good idea
- Consider a survey with stages: asking respondents for consent to contact them with a more in depth questionnaire on some more complex issues
- Comprehensiveness and representation are different goals with consequences for both dissemination and analysis planning
- Include question on costs / prices of services in survey?
